250th Birthday

The Society for the Propagation of the Gospel in Foreign Parts (S.P.G. for short) was founded by royal charter in 1701, and thus celebrates its 250th Birthday this year. There are several things happening in connection with this important anniversary. There is to be a team of overseas missionaries visiting this diocese in October, about which details will be given later on. But the matter of the moment is that on Saturday, June 16th, which is the Society's actual Birthday, there is to be a Festival Service in Ely Cathedral at 5 p.m., at which the preacher will be the Lord Bishop of Ely. It is hoped that there will be people from very many parishes in the diocese attending this. It is certainly hoped to organise a party from Fenstanton. It would be a great help if all who would like to go would let the Vicar know as soon as possible.

THE PARISH CHURCH OF HILTON—I

Early Days

It seems there has not been a church at Hilton quite so far back as at Fenstanton, since there is nothing mentioned about it in the Domesday Book (drawn up in 1086). But there must have been one built soon afterwards, because we know that there was a stone building in Hilton between 1100 and 1200. A small portion of the stone from this old church still exists to-day, in the walling and moulding on each side of the chancel arch. This arch itself is the oldest substantial piece of work in the present church, having been constructed in the twelve-hundreds.

But, in the main, the church as we now have it belongs to two periods. The tower was built just before 1400; and the rest of the church during the next century, perhaps about 1450.

It comes as something of a surprise to learn that Hilton did not become a separate parish until comparatively recent times. There are a large number of small parishes in this rural county, and Hilton is certainly a complete village in itself. But the historical truth of the matter is that for about seven hundred years our church at Hilton was not a parish church at all. The proper name for it was a chapelry to Fen Stanton; that is, a sort of daughterchurch under the charge of the vicar of Fen Stanton. Sometimes it was served by priests from Fen Stanton, and sometimes (before the Reformation) it had a separate chaplain appointed to it. It was not until 1873 that Hilton was made into a separate and independent parish. Since that time the parish has on two or three occasions had a vicar who lived in the parish and had no other charge. But generally it has been the case that the parish priest has had a living (and his residence) in the neighbourhood (either Fen Stanton or Papworth St. Agnes), for the simple reason that when Hilton was made into a parish there was not sufficient endowment provided to furnish the priest with a living wage.
