Hilton church is falling down!

OK, maybe that is a bit of an exaggeration, but the roof on the south aisle (the one facing you when you enter the main road) is in a desperate state and is currently only being held safe by the rather unattractive scaffolding we have in place. The surveyors estimate that the total cost to restore the roof of this beautiful historic building will be in the region of £132,000.


Did you know? Many of the funding bodies who give grants for such repairs will only do so on a "matched" basis – i.e. we will have to raise a certain amount of money ourselves if we want to secure funding for the remaining balance. Fortunately, English Heritage has already approved a grant of £75,000 which leaves us with £57,000 still to find. There are apparently over 1000 people living in Hilton. If each person were to donate £57 over the course of the next 2 years we will hit out target. That equates to less than 55p a week! Please make a donation!

During the first week in April we will be delivering a special YELLOW ENVELOPE to every household in Hilton which can be used to make a donation towards the repair of the church roof. These will be collected by a team of tireless volunteers during the run-up to Easter. The donations can be made anonymously but, if you are a UK tax payer, it would be much appreciated if you could fill in the Gift Aid declaration on the envelope so that we can claim the tax back on your donation – increasing its value by a whopping 20%

And what about your pennies?

We also provide small cardboard boxes ("Heritage Boxes") for people to put their lose change in. These are collected every 3 – 4 months and the money is put towards the upkeep of the fabric of the

church. Pennies really do count – we raise on average £20 per box per year. And we are always happy when we get to count higher denomination coins as well as notes. If you don't already have a home for your small change then do please register for a Heritage Box today by calling Carl Parsons on 831607.





The Huntingdon Area Group of the Wildlife Trust invites you to join us in the first of this year's Wonderful Woodlands programme on Sunday 5th April 2009. We will be visiting Wistow and Warboys Woods, which together form the same SSSI (site of special scientific interest). Wistow Wood is owned and managed by the Wildlife Trust and we hope to see a wonderful display of Wood Anenome at this time of year. This lovely small wood also has a pond and a hide and a circular path. Across the Wistow Fen Road is the larger Warboys Wood, which is privately owned and managed for shooting. It is normally closed to the public, but we have been given permission by the owners to lead our walk into the wood today. Everyone is very welcome to attend. Please meet at Wistow Wood at 2.30 pm, GR TL296820. Parking is limited, so please share cars if possible and park carefully to avoid blocking the road for residents at GR TL 100100. Admission: adults £2.00, children free.

The Huntingdon Area Group of the Wildlife Trust invites you to come and experience the delights of a carpet of bluebells in this ancient woodland, which lies on our doorstep. You are welcome to share this enchanting scene by participating in a guided walk through Brampton Wood on Sunday 26th April.

George Cottam, who is Warden of Brampton Wood, is also Chairman of the Huntingdon Area Group of the Wildlife Trust. George will be delighted to lead us through this ancient woodland where a rich variety of flora can be seen. His aim will be to highlight the beautiful scent, colour and freshness of the bluebells that encapsulate the essence of a traditional English spring.

Everyone is most welcome to attend. Please meet at Brampton Wood Car Park, Grafham Road, Brampton at 11.00 am, GR TL 184698. Park in the Trust car park. Admission: adults £2.00, children free.

The Huntingdon Area Group of the Wildlife Trust invites you to join us in the third of this year's Wonderful Woodlands programme on Sunday 17th May 2009 when we will be visiting Hayley Wood.

Hayley Wood was the first wood to be purchased by the Cambridgeshire Wildlife Trust. It is an ancient woodland which has been traditionally managed and is an important site for oxlip. Other flora that we would expect to see at this time of year include dogs mercury, lesser celandine and early purple orchid. Hayley Wood is also a key site in the development of landscape ecology and has been extensively studied by Cambridge University. Everyone is very welcome to attend. Please meet at Hayley Wood at 2.30 pm, GR TL292530. Please park on the road opposite the entrance along Hayley Lane. Admission: adults £2.00, children free.

Councillor Vacancies: - Hilton Parish Council still need your help. We have one vacancy to fill and another vacancy in May 2009. If you care about where you live and can give up to 6 hours per month to attend meetings and read background information we really need your help. If you are unsure, please feel free to chat with the Clerk or any of the existing Parish Councillors. Go on, give it a go, you may even enjoy it, and it doesn't have to be forever.

Affordable Housing - The Parish Council agreed that Cambridgeshire Acre should be engaged to undertake a survey of the village to ascertain whether there is a need for affordable housing in this village. Each household will receive a questionnaire, please take a few minutes to complete it. This information will be collated by Cambridgeshire Acre who will report its findings back to the Parish Council and if a need identified, they will begin to source a suitable site.

Village Maintenance Repairs - The Parish Council have employed contractors to undertake work replacing the Lych Gates and repairing the walls at the Church. The pathways across the Green will also be widened and resurfaced.

Annual Parish Meeting - Our Annual Parish Meeting will be held on Wednesday 29th April at 7.30 pm in the Village Hall. All parishioners welcome to attend to hear what the Parish Council have achieved this last year. The Parish Council meet on the first Monday of each month, in the Village Hall, at 7.30 pm. Anyone is welcome to attend and parishioners are allowed to speak during the open session only. The Agendas for these meetings are posted on the 3 notice boards 5 days before each meeting and are now available on the village website. Planning meetings are arranged as and when required and notification of these meetings will be posted on the notice boards 5 days before the meeting date.

All Minutes of all our meetings can be found on the village website once they have been approved by the Parish Council.

R.S.P.B. FEN DRAYTON LAKES

The recent floods brought the spectacle of thousands of wading birds, displaced from the Ouse and Nene Washes. The birds, mostly black-tailed godwits, with golden plovers, ruffs, lapwings and dunlins amongst them, stayed with us until the water levels returned to near normal levels. The godwits, ruffs and dunlins like to feed with their feet in shallow water, probing the soil for worms and other invertebrates, but they don't like to get their feathers wet. Lapwings and golden plovers feed on the fields, but stand in shallow water or on islands when they roost. The main spectacle is when they fly, perhaps disturbed by a fox or bird of prey - a wheeling flock making tightly synchronised turns, not landing again until they are happy it is safe to do so. The majority of winter-visiting wildfowl have now left us, returning to their northerly breeding grounds. During April, we are looking forward to summer visitors joining us – birds such as swallows, martins, warblers, cuckoos, common terns and hobbies.

Oystercatchers have already returned – we hope their nesting attempts are not washed out again by flooding later in the spring. Will the avocets return and nest again this year? We are hoping so. The rafts have been put back out into some of the lakes, ready for the common terns, which raised chicks on them in 2008.

Construction work on the guided busway will continue through April on the north side of Moore Lake, heading towards the viaduct over the River Great Ouse.

We have four events planned for April, three of them over Easter. I hope you will be able to join us. Please book for the events on 10th, 12th and 21st, by calling 01954 233260. The events on 10th and 13th will cost £2 for children, £1 RSPB junior members, and are free to their adults. The events on 12th and 21st will cost £4 for adults (RSPB members £2), and £1 for children. All of these events start at the Holywell Lake car park (beyond the busway). 10th, 2-4pm Build a Nest

12th, 10am-12.30pm, guided walk to find and hear warblers

13th, noon-4pm, Nature Detectives – a mystery trail for families

21st, 8-10am, Birdsong for beginners, a short walk and lot of listening

You can collect our new events leaflet from the information team in the Holywell Lake car park at weekends, or other outlets.

A guided walk at Mare Fen has been organised by the county council on Wednesday 15 April. Meet at the entrance gate on Over Road, Swavesey for 10am. This free event will end around noon. There are no parking facilities here – please walk from Over or Swavesey.

The Hanson-RSPB Wetland Project Hanson completed the land forming of the fourth mere of this ambitious project in 2008, adding another 10ha to the 45ha of reedy wetland in varying stages of development to the north of Over. Nearly twenty thousand reed seedlings were planted in the third mere. The site can be viewed from local droves, and there will be some guided walks in the summer, when you can find out more about this site, which has already attracted a host of wetland wildlife.

FENSTANTON BOWLS CLUB



And Finally... if you have time

Cut down any old growth left after winter. Prune spring-flowering shrubs such as Forsythia after blooming to encourage new growth for flowering next year. Lift and split snowdrops and polyanthus after flowering. Overgrown clumps of perennials can be divided and replanted now. Any tall plants should be supported. Protect young growth from slugs and snails remembering that the blue pellets are poisonous to hedgehogs and birds. And keep weeding!

Semi-rich Fruit Cake – Class 50 150g (5oz) butter or magarine 150g (5oz) caster sugar 350g (12oz) mixed dried fruit 250g (8oz) self raising flour 2 standard eggs small level teaspoon mixed spice milk to mix (about 6 tablespoons)

Method – creaming method Oven – 300F/150C/gas mark 2 Time – 1 ³⁄₄ to 2 ¹⁄₄ hours

Victoria sandwich cake – class 55 4oz selfraising flour 4oz butter or margarine 4oz caster sugar (plus extra for dusting the top) 2 standard eggs

Method – creaming method Bake in two 7" sandwich cake tins Oven – 180C/350F/gas mark 4 Time – Approx. 25 minutes Jam filling Dust caster sugar on top

No Fresh cream in any entries please

Cheese Straws – Classes 83 & 94 3oz plain flour 2oz butter or margarine 2oz cheddar cheese ½ tsp salt pinch of pepper pinch of cayenne

Method – add seasoning to flour. Add finely grated cheese and seasoned flour to softened fat, mix to a paste and leave for 30 mins. Roll paste out on a lightly floured board and cut into straws. Place straws on a baking sheet and prick them. Cook at 180C/350F/gas mark 4 for about 15 minutes.

Drinks for the Produce Show

The following recipes are very simple to make, and you do not need to make your own wine. The orange wine and Sangria are excellent for use at garden parties. Children will love the raspberry lemonade!

Martini-based drinks (for class 68)

There are dozens of very easy recipes on the Internet. Visitwww.martinidrinks.com

Raspberry Lemonade (for class 65)

7oz caster sugar Juice of 3-4 lemons Fine peel of 2 lemons 5oz raspberries 2 tablespoons sifted icing sugar

Orange Wine (for class 69)

2 Navel oranges, halved 1 Navel orange, 4 oz sugar 12 whole cloves 1 bottle white wine.

Sangria (for class 70)

1 bottle red wine 1 measure (50ml) brandy Juice of 2 oranges Juice of 2 lemons 2-3 slices orange Caster sugar to taste 1 bottle soda water 6 ice cubes Put the caster sugar in a pan with 7oz water and the lemon peel. Stir over a low heat until the sugar has dissolved, then bring to the boil vigorously for 2 minutes without stirring. Set aside to cool. Mix in the lemon juice and strain into a large jug. Whiz the raspberries with the icing sugar in a blender and strain into the lemon mixture, discarding the seeds. Stir together and chill. To serve, dilute to taste with still or sparkling water.

Squeeze the orange halves into a saucepan, add the remains of the whole oranges, and the sugar. Bring to the boil, and simmer for 5 minutes. Remove from the heat and allow to cool. Strain into a 2 pint jug or jar, pressing the oranges with the back of a spoon to release all the juice. Stir in the wine. Stick the cloves into the whole orange, cut in half and add to the jar. Secure the lid tightly, (or use cling film) and Allow to stand in a cool dark place for at least 2 months.

Use a tall glass jug large enough to hold all the ingredients - about 2½ pints capacity. Pour the wine into the jug and add the brandy, lemon and orange juice. Stir well, and still stirring, add the sugar, 1 teaspoon at a time, to taste. Keep the jug in a cool place and, just before serving, add the soda water and the ice cubes. Float the orange slices on top of the jug.
