



WHAT TO DO:

Obtain a Charlotte seed potato and chit it by standing it in an egg box in a cool bright area. The "eyes" of the potato will begin to grow.

Potatoes can be obtained from Hilton Community Garden on Saturdays in March between 10 and noon. When the shoots are short and stubby, plant the potato in a 10 litre pot (approx. 28cms wide at top and 23cms high) using any compost or garden soil. Note: larger pots will be disqualified!

Only half fill the container with compost and top up as the potato shoots grow.

Place pot outside but protect it from frosts. Remember to water it if the weather is dry.

Bring your potato plant, growing in its pot, to the **Hilton Produce Show on Saturday 29th July.** The judges will empty each pot and weigh the yield.

The winner will be the person whose potatoes weigh the heaviest.

Fenstanton; compiled from local newspapers: By John Deeks

Peterborough Advertiser January 1898:

"A very large company assembled at the Golden Lion Hotel, St Ives, when three licenced houses were put up for sale by auction. The freehold beer house in Fenstanton known as the Prince's Feathers with the cottage adjoining was sold for £500 (£57,000 in today's money) to Mr Burt the well-known Fenstanton brewer".

The Prince's Feathers sat where today sits the butchers and hairdressers, opposite the Duchess. It was a large building set in a half acre of land. It included two cottages, workshop, stabling and other outbuildings, a farm yard, large barn and a well planted and productive garden with an orchard.

Mr Henry J Burt purchased the Fenstanton Brewery from the bank when Alexander Galloway became bankrupt. He lived in the Maltings beside the Fenstanton brewery in the High Street. Born in 1843 in Dorset he made a fortune doing business in Chesham, Bucks, where he was a well-known publican and businessman. Why he came to Fenstanton is not known but he soon set about buying up many of the local pubs, beerhouses and hotels. In October 1897 he purchased the Fountain Hotel in St Ives (Now HSBC Bank) and also the Horseshoes Pub in Godmanchester.

In 1899 he is recorded as owning the following businesses; the Fenstanton Brewery and house with its gardens and paddocks, three freehold maltings, fifty two hotels, pubs, beerhouses, land, cottages and other property. Set in St Ives, Fenstanton, Wisbeach, Chatteris, Godmanchester and other towns and villages in the local area.

Cambs Independent Press Nov 1898

"We regret to hear that an accident befell Mr H J Burt the well-known brewer as he was driving home to Fenstanton. The night was foggy and the wheels of the vehicle running over an obstruction, probably a heap of gravel and the trap overturned and Mr Burt was thrown out. With assistance he reached home very much shaken but happily no bones were broken".

Cambridge Independent Press 1898:

"A tramp was charged with sleeping in an outhouse without visible means of subsistence in Bridge Terrace Fenstanton. He had sold his boots for fourpence at the Dolphin Hotel and bought beer, bread and cheese with the money. The bench sentenced him to seven days hard labour. The prisoner thanked the magistrates and said that when he comes out he hopes they would give him a new suit of clothes and then he would go to Liverpool".

Cambridge Evening News 1899:

"Found dead in bed this morning. Mrs Gatward, wife of Mr James Gatward, landlord of the Bell Pub in Fenstanton died suddenly in the night. When the husband awoke this morning he found that his wife was quite dead".

Cambridge Independent Press 1903:

"There is no doubt that the supply of lady housekeepers greatly exceeds the demand. The salaries asked are pitiful small, an undertaking to act as a good plain cook, to be musical and cheerful, for £20 a year, with board and lodging included. A middle-aged woman is often preferred to a skittish young thing, but she must be comely and needs to have 'a face for a rainy day' and not a countenance on which the tragedy of failure in life is too strongly marked".

Cambridge Independent Press 1922:

Cambridge Star Brewery shareholders were told that the directors purchased the Fenstanton Brewery together with licensed premises and sundry houses and cottages. The brewery is now closed. john.deeks@ntlworld.com



The Parish Council has granted permission for the Easter Cross to be erected on the Green for the next 10 years, from Maundy Thursday to Easter Tuesday.




