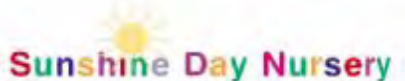

Police Report During the months of January and February the following crimes and incidents were reported: 1 incident of anti social behaviour; 1 incident of violent crime; 2 incidents of burglary (domestic); 3 incidents of burglary (commercial); 1 incident of criminal damage; 3 incidents of other theft; Incidents of cold calling have been reported in Rookery Place, Headlands and Swan Gardens. In some incidents residents have been asked to give their bank details. If you receive any such call do not give any information and advise the Police.

Village street lighting. Following the County Council's PFI agreement as reported in the last edition of Spectrum, the Parish Council is reviewing the current level of street lighting and what the possible effect and impact a 10% reduction would have on the Parish. A 10% reduction equates to approximately a loss of 30 street lights Parish wide. The Parish Council is also investigating the possibility of taking responsibility for any lights which will not be lit under the new contract and other possibilities.

District Council Notes

Council tax is a hot topic at the moment and as Huntingdonshire District Council's (HDC) rise of 3.5% has raised some comment, it is sensible to give some explanation. First let us put the rise in perspective; percentages are not always the best guide! Please remember that HDC has one of the lowest rates in the country; it is well within the bottom quarter for charges and the rise will not change this. Also 3.5% of a low charge is a relatively small cash increase; there are many councils where a 2% increase would cost residents more. For a Band D property the increase is £4.50 per year which is less than 9 pence per week, or a packet of crisps per month!

Many residents will have heard of central government's offer to provide cash equivalent to a 2.5% increase if councils leave their charges unchanged for 2012/13 and some wonder why HDC have not taken it up. One reason is that it is a one year only offer which will distort next year's figures, but more importantly the offer would use your money from central government taxation (income tax, VAT etc) to reduce council tax. It's not exactly robbing Peter to pay Paul, but there are similarities! A recent letter in the

Hunts Post claimed that HDC did not go above 3.5% only because that would trigger a referendum which it would not win. It is true that councillors did not want a referendum, but the reason was that a referendum would cost about £100,000 of your money. Rest assured that we have better uses for that money, uses which will benefit residents.

Councillors' allowances and expenses have also aroused comment of late. Your District Councillors, Ian Bates and Alan Williams (Hilton) and Greg Harlock (Fenstanton), will not take any increase in the current basic allowance of £283 per month after tax.

Please do not hesitate to get in touch with us on any matter, but do not be surprised if we refer you to another of the authorities on your council tax bill. Which authority is responsible for what is sometimes confusing. The Fire and Police authorities are self-explanatory, but to give other examples: the County Council is responsible for education and roads, the District Council for bin collection and planning. HILTON TRAFFIC ISSUES

Hilton Parish Council has decided to express concern to the Minister of Transport regarding current discussions about a Toll System for the A14 .If active , HCVs and extra traffic could 'rat-run' through the B1040 to avoid paying the charges . This extra traffic would affect village life yet more .

The Parish Council has been informed that if granted , a Zebra crossing would cost approximately £16,000 of which Hilton would be required to contribute £6,000.Any suitable suggestions as to how we could raise some funds would be appreciated .

The current testing of the effect of HCVs is being held .As part of this Hilton will have noise and air pollution measured as part f the whole programme .

What can I do about litter?

Many people find littering unacceptable and want to do something about it. Keep Britain Tidy encourage the public to get involved and do their bit to tackle the problem of litter. Dog Fouling

One item keeps coming up in residents letters, Parish Council reports and notes from the Football Club. This is the problem of dog fouling on footpaths, public places and sports grounds/play areas.

Why is this seen as so important:

1. Leaving such a mess where others may be contaminated is extremely antisocial
2. It is very unpleasant for other walkers who may get it on their shoes and, if not noticed, on to carpets and furnishings in the home.
3. It is not only unpleasant but also extremely dangerous to health, particularly to children. The biggest threat to public health from dog excrement is toxocariasis.

Toxocariasis is an infection of the roundworm *toxocara canis*. The eggs of the parasite can be found in soil or sand contaminated with faeces and if swallowed, result in infection that lasts between six and 24 months. Symptoms include eye disorders, vague ache, dizziness, nausea, asthma and, in extremely rare cases, seizures/fits. Infected soil samples are often found in play areas and as a result, Toxocariasis most commonly affects children between 18 months and five years. A recent case was a toddler who got dog faeces on her fingers while in a play area and then wiped them in her eye. She has now lost three quarters of her sight in one eye due the presence of toxocariasis in the faeces. This devastating permanent injury would not have happened if some dog owner had cleaned up properly. The potential for such an infection is why the Football Club is so concerned.

The responsibility for clearing up after a dog fouls is clearly stated by legislation: the dog owner or the person in charge of the dog needs to clear up any dog foul left by their dog. If you fail to clean up after your dog you can be issued with a Fixed Penalty Notice, or, if the case goes to court, a fine of up to £1,000. The regulations state specifically, that being unaware that the dog has fouled, or not having a suitable means of removing the faeces is not a reasonable excuse for failing to clean up.

The Parish Council is arranging for more 'doggy bins' to be installed, particularly in the Headlands area and have also requested the area Dog Warden visits. Dog Wardens have the power to issue fixed penalty notices so beware!

We hope this summary will encourage more dog owners to take their responsibilities seriously.





Good News – thank you everyone J

We are extremely fortunate to have a great deal of wonderful support from the families of those in our Scout Group, those who have children in our Scout Group and numerous other members of our local community. This means that we can offer the huge range of opportunities we do, making us one of the largest and most active Scout Groups in the area. So a big **thank you** to each and every one of you that supports us in any way - we really couldn't do it without you!!!

But we are not there yet.....

Despite the fact we have around 80 to 90 young people in our Group and are grateful for all that everyone already does we still need more help please, in a variety of ways:

Across England and Wales there are still 33, 500 boys and girls waiting to join the fun, of those 900 are in Cambridgeshire alone L As of today we still have another 26 boys and girls old enough to start who we simply do not have spaces for – a fact of which we are not proud. The solution is “easy” – more adults, especially for our Scout Troop - and contrary to popular belief that does not mean you have to be there each week! **Any volunteers?**

Being such a large and active Scout Group, with keen supporters, means we have a huge amount of kit. This includes things such as our archery kit (purchased thanks to a generous donation from the Hilton Town Charity), all our camping gear (from small hike tents to our big Mess tents, gazebos, tables, benches, stoves and...) through to smaller items such as lots of pots and pans.

At present much of our kit has to be stored out at Needingworth, which makes it very difficult. We are still seeking a kind individual, farmer or business (ideally in Fenstanton, Hilton, Conington, Fen Drayton or Elsworth) to let us have somewhere **suitable to store the kit** more locally (access is only required on an “ad hoc” basis). We need a dry, secure space (ideally with access to electricity and running water) equivalent to approximately a double garage in size. This might be something existing or something we could fund raise to build (anything from metal to brick). Is there anyone who could support us in this way please?

Several people currently look after kit in terms of repairs, replenishment etc but we could do with **one central person** to co-ordinate, check, manage the inventory, oversee and arrange things. This role is on an “as and when” basis so would suit anyone who could spare an average of just an hour or two a month, slightly more in the summer camping season. Is there anyone who could volunteer to help support us in this way please?



When the Eel Man, Peter Carter, turned up at our March meeting in his battered hat, looking every bit the fisherman, we feared a bag of wriggling eels would be brought out for us to handle. How wrong we were and what a delightful surprise we got. Peter is a wonderful raconteur, describing in his own unique way his family's history as eel catchers in the Fens and had us rocking in our seats with laughter at some of the tales he told. For hundreds of years his family has carried on this traditional work and he is the last Eel Catcher still making and using willow eel hives and griggs in the fens. During the winter months he uses his time making these ancient baskets, each one an intricate work of art in its own right taking up to six hours to make. He also builds punts and grows and harvests willow and has an ancient flintlock gun which he takes out in his boat, 'gunning', ie shooting ducks, all of which activities help him survive the winter when the eels have gone back to their spawning ground in the Sargasso Sea. But he is also an animal and wildlife enthusiast and had some wonderful slides to illustrate his talk. His wealth of knowledge is tremendous and it was truly an eye-opener and a privilege to hear about

such a unique way of life and to learn about the lives of and journeys made by the humble eel.

As usual we have lots going on in Hilton WI: the craft group and reading group meet once a month and are flourishing, and new members will always be made welcome; our spring dinner will be on **13th April** and our summer lunch will again be in August so look out for details of that in the coming months; a visit to Hemingford Grey Manor is planned in May/June to see Lucy Boston's patchworks as a follow-up to our next meeting which will be on **2nd April** when Diana Boston, Lucy's daughter-in-law, will be telling us a little of the history of the ancient Manor House and its lovely gardens; and in July we are looking forward to an outing and trip on the Grand Union Canal.

Several of us will be making cakes and helping serve teas with other Institutes from the Huntingdon and Peterborough Federation for the Abbots Ripton Garden Show at the end of June, and look out for us too earlier in June during the Queen's Jubilee Celebrations when we will also be helping with the village activities.

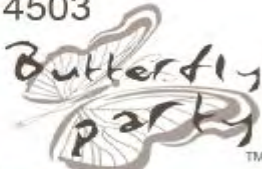

The early nesters are likely to have stayed in the area right through the winter, ready to start nesting as soon as the winter weather gives way.

Some birds rear two, three or even four broods in a year, so the sooner they start, the more chicks they can potentially rear. Robins, blackbirds, wrens and dunnocks are in this group, and typically produce three to five eggs at a time. Blue and great tits, however, put all of their eggs into one basket – they may lay up to 12 eggs in a clutch, but by the time the chicks have fledged, the adults haven't the energy to start again.

Large birds, such as swans and geese take longer to incubate their eggs, and the chicks are dependent on the parents for several weeks after hatching, so these birds only have time for one brood each year.

Around the Lakes, many birds choose to nest on the ground. Skylarks, lapwings, redshanks and oystercatchers nest in short grass; ringed and little ringed plovers nest on bare, sandy ground, where lapwings may also nest. Ducks and geese often nest in longer grass or under bushes close to the lake edges.

All of these birds have fantastic camouflage colours, so they aren't easily seen. Not seeing any doesn't mean they aren't there!

We can all help these birds breed successfully if we and our dogs stay on the paths.

Cycle racks have recently been installed beside the guided bus request stop at Fen Drayton Lakes, a convenient spot for anyone doing some of the circular walks.

We have several guided walks scheduled in the coming months, with two called "Birdsong for Beginners" on 21 and 29 April, and then we'll have our Dawn Chorus walk on 6 May. Bookings are required for the latter.
