

<u>Police report.</u> During the period 13th October 2010 to 9th November 2010 the following incidents had been reported to the Police: - 1 attempted burglary,

2 burglaries, 1 incident of theft, 1 incident of obtaining fuel without paying.

Although the number of reported incidents is low the Parish Council urges Parishioners to be vigilant and report any suspicious behaviour to the Police. Telephone 0345 456 456 4, Crimestoppers can be contacted on 0800 55 51 11 or in an emergency 999.

<u>Fringe in the Fen</u>. The meeting considered the possible impact the event may have on the Village infrastructure. The Parish Council will liaise with organisers to ensure the event runs with the least disruption to Parishioners as possible.

<u>Dog fouling</u>. The Parish Council was disappointed to learn that dog faeces are being thrown onto the School playing field. As one can appreciate this is an extremely thoughtless and irresponsible act. The Parish Council would expect those individuals to consider the effects of their actions and act in the correct manner and dispose of their dog waste appropriately.

<u>Next Meeting.</u> The next meeting of Fenstanton Parish Council will be held on **Thursday 13th January 2011 at 7:30pm** at Fenstanton and Hilton Primary School, School Lane, Fenstanton. Members of the press and public are welcome.

<u>Annual Bonfire and Firework Event</u> – A very successful event, helped by the weather. Our thanks go out to Graham Barradell and his team for putting on an excellent firework display. The Parish Council would also like to thank Julie Briggs and Carl Parsons for their help on the gate, without the help of volunteers the event would not take place.

<u>Graveley Way – Traffic Calming</u> – a public consultation is currently underway regarding the proposed traffic calming scheme for Graveley Way. The deadline is the 3rd of December to respond to Highways. Thank you to everyone who took time to respond to the Highways questionnaire and to the Parish Council's own questionnaire.

<u>Village Ditch Maintenance</u> – further work will be taking place around the village to keep ditches clear. A rolling programme is in place to ensure essential maintenance is done.

<u>Budget Preparation</u> – The Parish Council have been mindful of the current economic climate and the Government cuts. The precept has been agreed for the financial year April 2011 – March 2012 and will be asking Huntingdon District Council for £20,500, this is an increase of 1% from this financial year.

<u>Hilton Town Trust</u> – a vacancy exists on the Town Trust Committee. The group meet to consider requests for funding as necessary. Please contact the Clerk if you are interested.

Shut the door on high pressure selling

High pressure selling is something that we all want to avoid, and whilst it is quite easy to say 'no' to salespeople that call you on the phone, it is far harder to say 'no' to people once they are in your home.

At Cambridgeshire County Council's Trading Standards Service we frequently come across people who have been pressured into having work done or buying products having been called on out of the blue. It can relate to anything from tree felling, driveways, roofing and fascias and soffits, to mobility aids, home alarm systems and beds.

Typical high pressure sales techniques include calling through to their manager for 'the very best price', saying that that price is only available on that day, and overstaying their welcome, all used to put extra pressure on you.

We want you to avoid such problems, so below we offer a few tips:

- Where possible, when looking for a trader, go on recommendation from someone you know
- Get three quotes so that you know the price you are paying is reasonable and fair.
- Always get quotes in writing and make sure they set out what exactly you will receive for that price
- If a trader needs to visit you in your home and you will be alone, see if you can arrange for someone else to be there for extra support in case the trader puts pressure on you.
- If the contract is signed in your home and is for over £35, make sure you are given a 7 days cancellation notice you will almost certainly be entitled to this in law and means that you can change your mind up to 7 days after signing the agreement.
- If you are given terms and conditions, make sure you read them before signing the contract. Be careful if you are asked to sign something to say that work can start there and then this will impact on your right to cancel the contract.
- If possible, look for a trader that is a member of a Trade Association as many of these will operate a Code of Practice for their members and some also offer a mediation scheme in case of problems.

In addition, you can get a free 'We're not buying it' sticker for your front door to discourage salespeople from calling on you at home in the first place. Simply contact Consumer Direct for one of these (details below).

You can also reduce the number of telephone sales calls you receive by registering with the Telephone Preference Service on 0845 070 0707 or online at www.tpsonline.org.uk.

From the Vicar: Thanks, and Change

First, thanks. Thank you for all who have supported our fundraising efforts in both Fenstanton and Hilton churches over the past few years. In Hilton, we now have a South Aisle roof that is watertight. There is still some fundraising still to be done. In Fenstanton, the scaffolding is up for a variety of bits and pieces of work. Thank you again for your continuing support.

Next, change. From the beginning of next year, January 2011, I shall be giving up responsibility for Hilton church. Instead, Revd David Busk from Godmanchester will become your new vicar. The changes have come about for a number of reasons which I am happy to discuss but do not need to detain us here. What I can say is that we have consulted extensively within the churches both in Hilton and Godmanchester since April. We have been "testing the water" practically as now David is leading services in Hilton twice a month. Both churches are very enthusiastic about this proposed change, as is David himself.

In addition, it is intended that the relationship between the churches in Fenstanton and Hilton will continue: through the occasional joint services, in friendships shared, and most particularly through Harvey Marshall, who as Licensed Lay Minister will continue to serve both parishes. Harvey's thoughtful funeral ministry is well known to many of us. The firm and warm relationship between Hilton Methodist Church and the Parish Church is unaffected.

The feelings in Fenstanton are more mixed. I shall gladly continue to be the vicar here. There is some sadness of course; this relationship has lasted for over 150 years (as far as we can make out). It is right therefore to mark this time together in an appropriate way; we shall be holding a joint service in Fenstanton on Sunday 16th January at 10.00am, when Archdeacon Hugh McCurdy will be preaching. David Busk is to be licensed (formally installed) in Hilton on Sunday 30th January at 11.15am. These are open services, and you are welcome to come.

Let me, lastly, thank you all for my own support over the past 3 years or so. It has been a time of change in Hilton - where I have seen the support scaffolding go up, remain, and come down again. We wish parish churches in Hilton and Godmanchester well as they start to work together, and for David as he takes up his new responsibilities.

Changes in Pastoral Care for Hilton

Three years ago we went through a period of consultation about the pattern of Sunday worship in our church in Hilton. The solution we adopted was an attempt to reach a compromise between the need to reduce the number of services whilst still maintaining a balance of service styles & times. It was hoped that having just the one service on a Sunday would also united congregation with create а everyone attending the 8.15 and 11.15 services interchangeably.

These changes have unfortunately not had the positive effect we had hoped and, having stuck with it for a period of time, the PCC moved to consider alternatives. Our deliberations were coloured by the knowledge that the Deanery had already decided that Robin will not be replaced when it comes time for him to move on. When that happens Hilton and Fenstanton would no longer have their own priest and would need to join another group of parishes, either jointly or singularly.

Although reluctant to break the formal pastoral ties with Fenstanton, the PCC felt that a link with Godmanchester would be the best option to inject new life into our service pattern and revive our flagging congregation. We have also had the opportunity to "try things out" with the Godmanchester team (they have been

leading one or two services a month since any (liraA before making commitments. We reached the end of this "trial" in October and, based on the overwhelmingly positive feedback from the congregation, the PCC have since voted formalise the relationship Godmanchester. Rev'd David Busk and his team in Godmanchester are very keen to take on the responsibility for Hilton and it is planned that he do so from January 2011.

There will inevitably be lots of questions, and possibly some anxieties, from those of you who have not been directly involved in these discussions so we would encourage you to speak to any of the churchwardens (Rachel Wood or Ralph Slayter in Hilton / Martyn Saunders or lan Hucklesby in Fenstanton) to set your minds at rest.

Both the PCC and the congregation in Hilton are keen to maintain informal links with the parish church in Fenstanton - particularly in the areas of children's activities, joint services on special occasions and social events. Harvey Marshall would also continue to minister in both villages. The Godmanchester team will be leading the Crib Service on Christmas Eve so do come along to sample a taste of things to come!





FENSTANTON WI

On Thursday November 4th Wendy Smith gave us an enthusiastic, funny and informative talk on the 'History and Art of Knotting'. Wendy admits that she has been a self-taught knot addict for over 30 years. The knots are still tied by hand as they were centuries ago and all her designs are original and made without the use of patterns.

Wendy works as a volunteer at Flag Fen and runs workshops to demonstrate how people of the Bronze Age made their clothes. In one 'dig' the body of a woman was unearthed and fragments of clothes were found intact. Wendy was gratified to find that they were made by knotting in the way that she had imagined. As in Wendy's work only reef knots and half-hitches were used. She uses natural fibres e.g. wool, flax and stinging nettles as much as possible, washing them by hand to make them soft and pliable. We tried on some of these 'Bronze Age' garments; loose jackets, a very see-through short shirt and a fetching hat. The clothes made from stinging nettles were rather rough and scratchy!

Reef knots have been used for centuries and were regarded to have magical properties to cast spells for good and evil purposes and to cure illnesses. In the Middle Ages knotted cords were used under clothes to ward off evil spirits and Roman women had knotted girdles for fertility. The reef knot was known as the Knot of Hercules in Ancient Greece. Look

carefully at Grecian pots depicting Olympic Games to see how they were used! In Ancient Egypt it was known as the Knot of Isis or the Blood Knot. Examples were found in the tomb of Tutankhamun as a passport for him to reach the Underworld. The Ancient Incas of Peru made an elaborate system of knotted cords called a Quipu to send and record messages. The Spanish invaders burnt most of these but a priest managed to save some and we're still trying to decode them to this day. So when you 'Tie the Knot', 'Get tied up in Knots', or 'Tie a knot in your Handkerchief' these are all part of the worlds cultural history.

Wendy also makes jewellery and she displayed a wonderful selection which was on sale, tempting us to start our Christmas shopping.

Mavis Sykes gave the vote of thanks.

We are now looking forward to our Christmas Meeting on **December 2**nd when we will be served a meal by an outside caterer and entertained by a magician.

We don't meet in January but are looking forward to our trip on January 11th to the Pantomime 'Jack and the Beanstalk'.

FEN DRAYTON LAKES

We're getting to the time of year when it seems a better idea to stay indoors than go for a walk, but I think I feel better for having gone out – especially on a crisp, sunny day.

It is tough for our birds now, as there is so little daylight for them to search for enough food to keep them warm in the long, cold nights. We can all help by making sure we have food and water available for them in our gardens. High -calorie foods will help them build up fat reserves that are essential for the birds to stay warm. Sunflower hearts, peanuts and fat blocks are the best sources of calories, but some birds prefer other types of food: seeds, dried fruit, apples, even grated cheese. The wider the range you offer, the more birds you are likely to attract.

Having said that, it is often better to provide small amounts at a time, particularly when the weather is wet, as the food we put out can spoil when it gets wet. Look out for black moulds on nuts, or seed feeders getting clogged up by damp food. Water is important too – birds eating dry seeds need to drink to aid their digestion. Bathing is very important too – clean feathers are more efficient than dirty ones, both for flight and for insulation. That is why you often see blackbirds and robins bathing, just as darkness falls.

Bird baths don't have to be ornate – any shallow bowl or plant pot saucer will do. If the water has frozen, put out some fresh (but don't add anti-freeze or salt, which will do more harm than good).

The annual Big Garden Bird watch comes up at the end of January – look out for details in the New Year. Anyone can take part, you only need to spend one hour watching birds in a garden. For most, that means from inside a warm house, with hot drinks and snacks.

Join us for a guided walk, on Thursday 9 December (1.30pm) or Thursday 6 January (10.00am). Meet at Holywell Lake car park, and will try to find as many birds as possible, but the route may depend on the weather and how much mud, ice or flooding we have! Season's greetings


