William (Bill) Barnett

It has been a real treat for me to have spent some time recently chatting to Mr Bill Barnett who celebrated his 90th birthday in August. Immaculately turned out each time I see him and with a memory able to recount details most of us would long forget, Bill Barnett is guite a character.

The Barnett family settled in Fenstanton over 150 years ago when Bill's Grandfather chose the village to settle in after marrying his wife who Bill remembers him saying was the prettiest girl in the whole village. Bill was born in Honey Hill on

31st August 1921. He remembers there always being horses around all through his childhood as it was the family business and one which Bill himself became known for.

It seems somewhat fitting that I am typing this a few days before Remembrance Day as Bill, along with thousands of brave young men, saw active service for our country whilst serving in the army during WW2. Mr Barnett was awarded 5 medals which he proudly wears to the Armistice Day service at church.

Lance Corporal William Barnett enlisted in the army with 2 friends as an alternative to becoming farm labourers. Bill was called into active service 1 day after his 18^{th} birthday in 1939. During his time in the Army he was sent to many countries including Libya, Egypt and I taly.

Bill fought in the battle of El Alamein, encouraged by Montgomery's speech which, of course, led to victory over Rommel. In November, 1943, Bill was part of the guard duty for the conference between Churchill, Roosevelt and Stalin. He also met Pope Pius XII whilst visiting Rome during a few days leave.

On returning from the war, Bill met a land army girl, Ada, who he went on to marry and they had 3 children – Chris, John and Rita.

Bill is one of the village's true characters and he was known all over the country for his skill and knowledge about horses. Some of you will remember the time Fenstanton had resident llamas in the corner field at Chequer Street, these were courtesy of Bill and his connections with the circus. One of the coloured horses that Bill and his family owned, Boxer, went on to become the Queen's Drum horse during the 1950s.



It has been a pleasure talking to Mr Barnett and learning about his life so far. He tells wonderful stories about eras long gone but definitely not forgotten.

Many congratulations on celebrating your 90th birthday Bill, may you enjoy many more.

FENSTANTON PARISH COUNCIL - NOVEMBER

<u>Police report:</u> The most recent information available is for the month of September which indicated the one report of other crime.

The Parish Council urges Parishioners to be vigilant and report any suspicious behaviour to the Police. Telephone 0345 456 456 4 or 101, Crime-stoppers can be contacted on 0800 55 51 11 or in an emergency 999.

Parking on footpaths and double yellow lines: A Police Officer attended the meeting and gave valuable advice regarding the legal situation of parking on pavements. The meeting was advised that as a 'rule of thumb' if there is enough space to allow a double buggy / wheelchair through then action will, probably, not be taken. However, this does not absolve drivers from parking on pavements and to this end the Parish Council requests that vehicles are parked on the road and not the footpath and in a responsible manner.

The Bell Lane / High Street junction has been an area of concern for many years. Vehicles parking on the junction cause a serious hazard for motorists exiting Bell Lane onto the High Street. The Parish Council was instrumental in having double yellow lines laid to make the junction safer, however, the practice continues with scant regard to the measures in place. The Officer attending the meeting agreed that a problem exists, particularly at peak traffic times, and has agreed to take action against offenders by issuing a fixed penalty notice to drivers not observing the restriction. The Parish Council has agreed to assist in this action by placing warning notices on vehicles prior to formal action being taken. It is hoped that the warning notices will be sufficient for the practice to stop as it is not necessary to park on the junction. There is adequate parking in the vicinity of the shops even if it may mean walking a few yards.

<u>Footpaths</u>: Previously the Parish Council agreed to commemorate the long service of two former Councillors by dedicating footpaths 1 and 4 to them. Footpath 1 will be known as Michael Behagg Way and footpath 4 as Eric Mott Way. The meeting approved appropriate signage which should be in place in the near future

<u>The Queens Diamond Jubilee</u>. The Parish Council resolved to commemorate the Queens Diamond Jubilee in some lasting form. A decision will be taken at the next meeting as to the form the commemoration will take.

<u>Next Meeting:</u> The next meeting of Fenstanton Parish Council will be held on Thursday **12th January 2012 at 7:30pm** at Fenstanton and Hilton Primary School, School Lane, Fenstanton. Members of the press and public are welcome.

Re-ablement --Being independent following an operation or illness

If you, or someone you care for, requires social care support following an illness or operation, this would traditionally have been provided by a care assistant providing direct care to the person in need. Since September 2010 a new service, reablement, has been providing support to enable older people who have poor physical or mental health following illness or an operation to live in their own homes. Re-ablement programmes can last for as little as a few days and generally don't exceed six weeks. The ethos of reablement is to encourage people to do

things for themselves rather than having things done for them. There is no charge to the individual as long as they are participating in the programme.

Re-ablement is now being offered to a wider client group including new service users with a physical disability and new occupational therapy referrals. Future development of the service will look at assisting older people who already have a care package but due to illness or physical issues may now require a higher level of support.

LOCAL WEATHER WATCH

What a dramatic twelve months we have experienced.

Winter set in early and with unusual ferocity during the last ten days of November 2010, followed by the coldest December for 120 years. Although Hilton missed most of the snow, half the days were around or below freezing all day. The lowest temperature was minus 8.0C (18F). Fears of a continuation of the severe cold for the rest of the Winter soon disappeared during a very average January, to be followed by an exceptionally mild February in which only one air frost was recorded. The Winter was also notable for its lack of gales.

Spring started as Winter had ended with March being a benign month, exceptionally dry with many mild days as high pressure dominated. There was a drought throughout April, which was the warmest for 350 years. With May being another largely dry but breezy month, the three Spring months combined were the driest on record and on 10th June, Cambridgeshire together with other counties nearby was officially designated a drought region, with just 26mm (1 inch) of rain having fallen during March, April and May.

After the exceptional Spring, the Summer proved to be an anti-climax with only a few really warm days and rather less sun than normal, especially in August. Although some rain fell, generally in small amounts, the high level of evaporation in Summer meant the ground remained bone dry making it a trying time for gardeners. For the second year running no thunder storms occurred. The hottest day was on 27th June when the temperature reached 31C (88F), courtesy of a plume of warm air from Spain, making it the hottest day for five years.


September started with very windy conditions thanks to the remnants of Hurricane Katia. However, with winds predominately blowing from a southerly quarter throughout September and October, temperatures were well above average and this continued into the

start of November. Another plume of warm air made 1st October the warmest on record, at 29.5C (85F). By the end of October rainfall for the year totalled 454mm. (14.28 inches), which is 214mm. (7 inches) less than the amount at the same time in 2010, highlighting just how dry 2011 has been.

Whilst politicians and others with vested interests are quick to suggest any extreme conditions are as a result of global warming, in the south-east of Britain in 1921 the lack of rainfall was even more marked with Bedford having an annual total of 11.54 inches and Southend 10.67 inches. We have, therefore, been there before and it remains to be seen for how long the present deficit of rain continues.

A giant wind turbine has been proposed and a final decision will be taken soon.

The applicant, Boparan, are a subsidiary of one of the biggest chicken processors in Europe supplying Sainsbury's, KFC and M&S among others.

There will be approximately 320,000 broilers on an all in/all out 6 week cycle per flock with the wind turbine providing intermittent power for the intensive farming process. At times, the wind turbine will generate additional commercial power, fed back into the national grid.

Why pay when you don't have to

Each month at Trading Standards we receive enquiries about things people have paid for that they could have got for free. In this article, we give advice on where you may be able to save unnecessary expense.

Warranties and Guarantees

When you buy goods, whether on their own (like a washing machine) or as part of a larger piece of work (such as a new bathroom installation), by law those goods must be of "satisfactory quality" and be "fit for their purpose". They must be of a standard that a person would expect, bearing in mind the price paid, and be free from minor defects, be as described, and last a reasonable length of time for a product of that type. So if, for instance, the normal life of a washing machine is 5 years and yours stops working after two years due to a defect, you may be able to claim for a repair or replacement from the business you bought it from. This is the case regardless of whether you bought a warranty or guarantee. So consider carefully whether a warranty gives you anvthing extra.

Claiming from your debit card or credit card

If you are in dispute with a trader, instead of taking them to court, find out whether your bank may be able to help you. If you paid for something on a debit card and there turns out to be problems with the purchase. many banks offer 'chargeback' scheme where they refund vou. Furthermore, if vou pay for something worth over £100 and pay for at least some of it on your credit card, the credit card company is equally as responsible as the business that breaks its contract with you. So, if your holiday isn't as it was described, if your new dining table arrives damaged, or if your new TV breaks down, you can insist that your credit card provider helps you if the shop won't.



Personal Protection Insurance

We have received a number of reports companies offering to claim compensation for the miss-selling of personal protection insurance residents' behalf, whether in relation to a loan, mortgage or credit card. This is actually something you can do yourself. The Financial Ombudsman has produced leaflet which is available www.financial-ombudsman.org.uk on how to make the complaint yourself. If you don't have access to the internet, you can contact the Financial Ombudsman for advice over the telephone on 0800 0234567.

European Health Insurance cards

You can obtain a European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) free of charge which entitles you to medical treatment should it become necessary, at a reduced cost or free, when visiting a country in the European Union, Norway, Switzerland, Iceland and Liechtenstein. This is limited to treatment provided under the state scheme and you will need to produce your EHIC card. Visit www.ehic.org.uk to find out more.

Network Rail generously funded the hide, which has been named after lain Coucher, who retired from the post of Chief Executive of the company in 2010. The funding also gave us six picnic tables, which are in our Discovery Zone, on the southern side of Ferry Lagoon.

During November, our contractors laid a gravel path from the hide to the busway cycle track, to make the access better for anyone with a pushchair or wheelchair.

The contractors had to use The Fen for access, and I hope the additional traffic has come to an end by the time you read Spectrum.

The starling roost has been good again this autumn, although with fewer birds by early November than last year. We think this is because the weather had been so much milder, and many of our expected winter visitors were still much further to the north-east. Consequently, I'm hoping the starling roost will still be happening in December.

There are some simple steps we can take to help our garden birds through the winter, such as providing clean, fresh water every day, as well as food. Clean feathers are more effective at keeping them warm, as well as being more efficient for flying.

Birds have similarities with people – they have their favourite foods, so providing different types of food will attract different kinds of birds to your garden.

Fat-balls are a high-energy food, but some come with a risk – birds' feet occasionally become trapped in the nylon mesh bags that are around some balls. It is better to remove the mesh bags first, and use a hanging metal or plastic feeder designed to hold fat balls – these may stop starlings from eating the whole lot.

Blackbirds and thrushes will turn fallen leaves in search of worms and bugs. A layer of leaves acts like a duvet, keeping bugs active when uncovered areas are frozen. One step we can easily do for our local blackbirds and thrushes is to keep a layer of leaves on a flower border, or under some shrubs. We may need to brush the leaves back occasionally, which I like to think of as a bit of exercise for me.

Talking of exercise, if you feel the need for some fresh air or to use up a few of those extra calories you've consumed over Christmas, why not take a walk around the Fen Drayton Lakes and visit the Coucher Hide at Moore Lake?

If you'd like to join us on a guided walk, you'll be very welcome. All walks start from the guided bus stop and at Holywell Lake car park – with a leader at each place.
