## **NEWS FROM THE VILLAGE CHURCHES**

## **Greetings from Rev Catherine Ball (URC Minister)**

Winter greetings! February and March are usually when we start thinking about spring, however this year we have had a proper winter and although we missed much of the snow the rest of the nation had, we still experienced the cold and frost. Coming from Canada, I don't mind the snow and have to admit I would have liked to have more of it, so that we, too, could join with others sledging and building snowmen. However, I know it can cause havoc for travellers, since we are not really prepared for snow in these parts, and is a worry for those who don't want to slip on pavement, so I suppose I should be grateful that we have not had as much as others.

Nevertheless I think the cold is good for the gardens and good for us to see and feel the change of seasons. When I went to South Thailand weather was not a topic of conversation as every day was about 80° F and sunny except for two months in the autumn which was the rainy season. Some might like that consistency!! But I found it rather boring and rather samey. Variety is the spice of life! We need variety as well as routine in life to make it interesting.

With four seasons we have different weather, need different clothing, enjoy different flowers and plants and have different festivals to provide rhythm and ritual to life. In the church calendar during February and March, we remember two saints: in February St Valentine's Day on the 14<sup>th</sup>, celebrating romantic love, and in March St Patrick, remembering one who shared the love of God with people in Ireland. We also celebrate Pancake Tuesday on the 16<sup>th</sup> and Ash Wednesday on the 17<sup>th</sup> February as we journey through the period of Lent, a time of preparation for Easter, which will be held this year on Sunday the 4<sup>th</sup> of April. Our Churches Together will be meeting each week for the five weeks starting Wednesday 24<sup>th</sup> February at 7.30 pm at Fenstanton United Reformed Church. Do come along if you would like to join us for a time of prayer and reflection. We will be thinking and talking about the death and resurrection of Jesus 2,000 years ago and what it might mean for us in 2010.

After the time of cold and hibernation, we watch for the signs of spring to appear as the snow melts and snowdrops appear and birds sing. Following the starkness of winter, buds appear on branches and trees come back to life. So, instead of moaning about the weather, why don't we enjoy the stimulation of its changing patterns and rise to its challenges? It will continue to be a talking point, but may also be a pleasure to enjoy.

#### ITEMS FROM THE DISTRICT COUNCIL

**Public Transport** - Over the last 8 years, bus passenger numbers in Cambridgeshire have risen from 15.1 million to 24.2 million, while the Park & Ride Service in Cambridge has seen more than 4 million users during the past year.

Care Quality Commission (CQC) assessment of Adult Social Care Services - The annual assessment by the Care Quality Commission (CQC) has concluded that Adult Social Care Services in Cambridgeshire are performing well in almost every area of delivery. The assessment is based on interviews with service users and carers, performance information and a detailed self-assessment. The overall rating is performing "well".

Cambridgeshire is among the UK's Top Recyclers and Composters - The latest Government figures just out show Cambridgeshire County Council as one of the top authorities of its type for recycling and composting in the country. Figures just released by the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs (Defra) show that the County Council is one of the top 'disposal' authorities in the country - re-using, recycling or composting 51.99% of its waste. Leicestershire County Council recycles 52% of its waste but sends a greater percentage of rubbish to landfill than Cambridgeshire. With new recycling centres opening or planned, such as at St Neots and the Mechanical Biological Plant (MBT) at Waterbeach, recycling figures are due to improve even more. Just putting rubbish into landfill is not only bad for the environment but costs Cambridgeshire taxpayers £40 in Landfill Tax for every tonne - this is due to increase by £8 per tonne each year until 2013.

## FENSTANTON PARISH COUNCIL—NOV 2009

#### Police report.

During the period 7th October to 10th November 2009 the following incidents had been reported to the Police: 1 theft., 1 attempted burglary, 4 incidents of non payment of fuel., 1 incident of criminal damage.

The Parish Council urges Parishioners to be vigilant and report any suspicious behaviour to the Police. Telephone 0345 456 456 4, Crimestoppers can be contacted on 0800 55 51 11 or in an emergency 999.

#### Fen Lane.

The Parish Council have erected signs stating "access is for authorised vehicles only" and, with assistance from the Local Access Team, concrete bollards are to be installed by the Guided Busway to prevent access onto the Busway.

#### New Bus Service.

Stagecoach is to introduce a new service 20 as a feeder from Fenstanton to the Guided Busway in St Ives. The service was expected to start on 29th November but the delay to the opening of the Busway has postponed the start of the service. No date for the commencement of the service has been confirmed at the time of submission of copy to Spectrum. However, the service is expected to operate Mondays to Saturdays at 30 minute intervals. Full details will be available from Stagecoach once a start date is confirmed. With Stagecoach's previous history there is concern that if the service is not used it may well be withdrawn.

#### High Street traffic.

The Police recently conducted a traffic count on the Low Road. Over a 7 day period 36,457 vehicles travelled between St Ives and Fenstanton and vice versa, most of which are rat running through the Village. The statistics highlight the problems the Village is currently encountering in terms of safety in the High Street, of particular concern are drivers disregarding the mini roundabouts at the Chequer Street and Headlands junctions. Being conscious of available funding, it is the Parish Council's intention to hold a site meeting with County Highways to investigate the possibility of making the existing traffic calming measures more effective.

#### Parish Precept.

The Finance and Constitution Committee considered the Parish budget and precept at the meeting held on 19th November. To maintain the level service the Parish Council provides it was resolved to recommend a 2% increase to the precept for approval by the full Council at its next meeting.

#### **Next Meeting.**

The next meeting of Fenstanton Parish Council will be held on Thursday 11th February 2010 at 7:30pm at Fenstanton and Hilton Primary School, School Lane, Fenstanton. Members of the press and public are welcome.

#### Dark mornings and dogs.

It has been observed that some dog owners are allowing their pets to run free in the Village, this appears to be happening before dawn breaks which also raises the possibility that these are the same people who allow their dogs to foul the footpaths and pavements. Dog owners are reminded that it is an offence, which carries heavy fines under the Clean Neighbourhoods Act, not to keep dogs on leads whilst on footpaths and pavements, recreation grounds and churchyards or to allow them foul without clearing up.

#### HUNTINGDON AREA CITIZEN'S ADVICE BUREAU

Whilst many people have experienced our service (over 7,000 people have used the Citizens Advice Bureau in Huntingdonshire during the past year), others may wonder what kind of advice we give. The subjects we give advice on include, debt, benefits, employment, housing, and consumer issues, with the first three of these accounting for more than half. If you are having any difficulty with these sorts of issues, it's a good idea to get along to the Citizens Advice Bureau sooner rather than later. We are a problem-solving organisation, giving advice independently, impartially and confidentially.

The Citizens Advice Bureau also gives excellent opportunities for volunteering. If you volunteer to be an adviser, you will get full training before you are asked to advise people directly and you will get further training throughout. However, there are many other ways you can help – as an administrator, or receptionist; helping with our IT, or building maintenance. We particularly need a few people with management/financial experience to join our Trustee Board (also volunteers) who take ultimate responsibility for running the Huntingdonshire Bureau.

We are a registered charity and our main source of funding is from Huntingdonshire District Council, with grants also coming from the County Council and a number of Town and Parish Councils. Although there are grant-awarding bodies like the Lottery Fund, these give short-term funding for special projects. We need to grow to meet the need for advice we know exists and we would like to receive more funding from local individuals, organisations and companies.

#### WATCH THIS SPACE.

Whatever the weather keep topping up food and water for the birds who will reward you with their visits. When the weather permits continue cutting back overgrown hedges and shrubs before nesting starts, as well as planting new ones. Once the weather improves it's time to start some seeds off indoors in a propagator to get those early crops, but look carefully at the instructions on the packet. Start preparing your vegetable beds outside by digging them over and adding organic matter but be careful not to tread too heavily and compact the wet soil. Now is also the time to ensure that pots, seed-trays and tools are clean and, if your mower needs a service, arrange it in the quiet time before the grass starts to grow.



## WILDLIFE TRUST - HUNTINGDONSHIRE LOCAL GROUP

**Bumblebees** will be the focus of the next meeting of the Wildlife Trust, Huntingdon Area Group, on Wednesday 10<sup>th</sup> February 2010 at 7.30pm at Brampton Memorial Hall, Thrapston Road, Brampton.

Tonight our presentation will be given by David Sheppard, who is an invertebrate ecologist with Natural England. David is Chairman of the WLT Bourne Area Group, Warden for Stanton's Pit reserve and helps to run a local Watch Group, in addition to being on the council of Lincolnshire Wildlife Trust and a member of their biodiversity and reserves development teams.

David will enthuse us with his lifetime love of invertebrates, concentrating tonight on the natural history of bumblebees. He will look at how the bumblebees' habitat has been threatened by farming methods and modern society and what steps are now being taken to protect this species.

**Vision for the Wetlands** At the next meeting of the Wildlife Trust, Huntingdonshire Local Group, on Wednesday 10<sup>th</sup> March 2009 at 7.30pm, Dr. Alastair Burn will present 'A Vision for the Wetlands'. This will be held at Brampton Memorial Hall, Thrapston Road, Brampton.

Alastair Burn is currently the Principal Specialist for Freshwater and Pollution at Natural England and chairs the Wetland Biodiversity Integration Group as well as being Natural England's representative on the Water and Wetland workstream of the England Biodiversity Strategy. He has spent many years in research and worked on pesticide policy with the National Farmers Union. In 1992, Alastair joined English Nature examining pesticides, toxic substances and pollution, before heading the freshwater team. Tonight, Alastair will focus on wetland habitat creation, explaining why it is so vital to safeguard wildlife, counteract climate change and reduce flooding, as well as providing fantastic places for people to visit and enjoy!

#### Community Speedwatch (£28K) - on target

To date, more than 4,200 letters have been sent by Police Inspectors to those who have been observed speeding, and over 350 volunteers have been recruited and trained.

A meeting of Speedwatch volunteers and coordinators was held on 14th October '09, at which it was agreed that the Road Safety Partnership would be approached to fund a publicity campaign promoting Speedwatch to develop awareness of the scheme further and to attract a new wave of volunteers. At the same meeting minor amendments to operating procedures were suggested by volunteers and agreed by coordinating officers. Part of the project (£5.6k) has been amalgamated with the East Cambridgeshire Strategic Partnership local Speedwatch project and as such is included in section 3.23 as a local project.

## FEN DRAYTON LAKES

Please remember to provide some fresh water for garden birds, no matter how cold the weather is. They need to drink to aid their digestion when eating dry foods, such as seeds and nuts, as well as keeping their feathers clean. Clean feathers are important for helping the birds stay warm, as well as for efficient flight.

Just after the last issue of Spectrum went to print, our starling flock moved on, this disappointed us and the many people who came to watch them at our Roost Watch events in December. All was not lost, as there were many other birds to fill the void - on three evenings, the skies were filled with over two thousand golden plovers, and we were treated to a low flypast by 33 Bewick's swans on another. Some lucky visitors saw a bittern, and everyone who stayed until dusk was impressed by the thousands of rooks and These birds wait until it is iackdaws. almost dark, but they make a lot of noise so it is hard to miss them!

Bewick's swans are winter visitors to the UK, coming from their Siberian breeding grounds over 2500 miles away. Around 6,000 can usually be seen in and around the Ouse Washes. I think this group had just arrived, but had missed Welney in the previous day's fog. We couldn't find them here on the following morning.

An influx of fieldfares and redwings in late November gave us the impressive sight of thousands of birds feeding on hawthorn berries in the hedges. Once the berries had been eaten, these birds had to migrate further south in search of more food. They also eat worms, but they weren't accessible once the ground had frozen.

On the 19<sup>th</sup> February, we have a nestbox making event for children – please ring 01954 233260 to see if we have any places remaining. Charges are £6 per child (£3 RSPB Wildlife Explorer members).

**On February28**<sup>th</sup>, We have a guided walk beginning at 10.30am, when we'll be concentrating on ducks. If the weather is good, we may see courtship displays. Charges are £4 per person (£2 RSPB members, £1 children).
