FENSTANTON PARISH COUNCIL JANUARY 2011

Police report. the following incidents had been reported to the Police: 4 incidents of criminal damage, 1 burglary, 4 incidents of breaking and entry. 1 theft from an Allotments shed, 2 thefts from vehicles, 1 incident of damage to a vehicle, 1 theft of a vehicle, 4 incidents of obtaining fuel without paying.

The report covers a 2 month period; therefore, the overall number of incidents is low, although it will be noticed that there appears to have been an increase in the number of thefts from vehicles. The Parish Council urges Parishioners to be vigilant and report any suspicious behaviour to the Police. Telephone 0345 456 456 4, Crimestoppers can be contacted on 0800 55 51 11 or in an emergency 999.

<u>Chequer Street Car Park and Play Area.</u> The Village Hall Committee had made a request to the Parish Council to consider relinquishing the Chequer Street car park and play area to allow the land to be used as a site for the new Village Hall. The meeting gave consideration to the importance of retaining the existing facilities afforded by the well used play area and the consequences of increased on street car parking should the car park be lost. Neighbouring residents had made representations during Public Consultation expressing their concerns of an increased risk of anti social behaviour should a new Village Hall be developed on the site. Following considerable discussion the meeting resolved not to relinquish the land but to retain the play area and car park.

<u>Hampton Close Open Space / Football Pitch</u>. The District Council has offered the site to the Parish Council for adoption. However, during discussion it was felt that a number of questions required further clarification and it was resolved to discuss the matter further at the next.

Parish Precept. The Finance and Constitution Committee considered the level at which the Parish Precept should be set at its meeting held 18th November 2010. The indications from Central Government imply that Parish Council precepts will not be capped in the future although constraints will be introduced which will restrict the level of increase. Grants received by the Parish Council, for work undertaken on behalf of the County Council have already been cut, thereby reducing the Parish Council's income. It has become clear that these grants will be further reduced or removed altogether. The Committee resolved to keep the increase at the level of expected inflation and to recommend a 3% increase on the current precept to the full Parish Council for approval.

<u>Dog Fouling</u>. Complaints have been received about owners allowing their dogs to foul in the Church Yard and Cemetery. Please all dog owners act in a responsible manner and treat the Church Yard and Cemetery with respect. Fouling on footpaths and pavements also has increased. Whilst it is appreciated that the majority of owners are responsible those owners allowing their dogs to foul are reminded that it is an offence subject to a £1000 fine.

<u>Next Meeting</u>. The next meeting of Fenstanton Parish Council will be held on Thursday 10th February 2011 at 7:30pm at Fenstanton and Hilton Primary School, School Lane. Fenstanton.

ST IVES VOLUNTEER BUREAU COMMUNITY CAR SCHEME

Do you have problems accessing public transport when you need to attend a doctor or hospital appointment, want to visit a friend, go shopping or call in at the bank, hairdresser or chiropodist?

The St Ives Volunteer Bureau has for some years been running a Community Car Scheme in the Fenstanton/Hilton area to provide a solution to these difficulties. Volunteer drivers (all CRB checked) will pick you up from your door and take you (and a companion) to your chosen destination. If your visit will be under an hour, they will wait for you and take you home. If it is a longer trip they will come back to fetch you at an agreed time. Passengers pay the driver 40p a mile (including miles from the driver's home to yours) to cover expenses. A minimum fee of £1.50 applies.

If you would like to know more about this service or to book transport please ring **01480 301462 during office hours (12.30 to 3pm Monday to Thursday)** or leave a message on the answer phone. As all our drivers are volunteers we need to know of any difficulties you experience in getting in or out of a car and whether you need to take a wheel chair, so that we can try to find a suitable car/ driver. Please note that we normally need three days warning to arrange a lift.

At present there are no drivers living in Fenstanton or Hilton. Consequently drivers must come from St Ives or surrounding villages incurring additional costs to the passenger. If you are a car driver, particularly if you live in Fenstanton or Hilton, and could give some time to volunteer for this scheme we would love to hear from you on the above number. All our volunteer drivers find it a very worthwhile activity.

St Ives Volunteer Bureau is an office of the Huntingdonshire Volunteer Centre, Registered Charity No. 1126811, and accredited by Volunteering England.

HILTON ACTION ON TRAFFIC

There appears to have been a recent increase in the numbers of HGV's flouting the night time lorry ban on Residents are urged Potton Road. where practicable to report specific instances to the Police (and to HAT) ideally quoting time/place, vehicle registration number, vehicle type and name of operator. On 7 December 2010, a lorry shed a large pack of paving slabs on the Potton Road footpath in the centre of the village. Fortunately pedestrians were not passing by at the time, otherwise someone could have been killed. HAT reported the incident to the Police and is taking up this issue with the haulier, requesting an explanation of how it could have happened and asking that in future he uses an alternative route. At the time of writing, the local

authorities have not made a final decision on whether to go ahead with their proposal for a speed reduction traffic calming scheme along Graveley Way. It is useful if HAT can be made aware of serious traffic incidents on roads in Hilton. If you see or hear anything you think is worth noting, whether an accident, grossly excessive speed, danger, risk-taking or just sheer driver stupidity, please contact HAT as soon as possible at

FEN DRAYTON LAKES

Fen Drayton Lakes set a new Cambridgeshire winter record on 7 Dec. A team of people went out to check the all the lakes simultaneously, and found that we had at least eight bitterns.

These are normally extremely shy birds, preferring to hide away in the reeds, but when the water within the reeds is frozen, the bitterns are forced out into the open as they search for food. Frozen lakes are not ideal, but if you want to see a bittern, then those are the conditions that offer the best chances. You'll probably need binoculars, though, as the bitterns will move away from the paths that the birdwatchers are on.

The extended period of snow and ice forced many birds to relocate to places where food was easier to find. Some birds, such as ducks and thrushes, may have had to move hundreds of miles, while others, such as finches, may have moved into the nearest gardens where householders provided them with seeds.

If you've been feeding birds in your garden, I hope you've enjoyed watching them. Perhaps you also took part in the RSPB's Big Garden Birdwatch on the last weekend of January.

South Cambridgeshire District Council has given us planning permission for an education area on the southern side of Ferry Lagoon. This means we can install a pond-dipping platform and other facilities, and create a parking area for coaches, so that we can host school visits. We hope that everything will be ready for us to use this summer

The same planning consent allows us to build three shelters, to overlook three different lake areas. They'll be similar to bus shelters – offering seats and some protection from the weather. These will be built after the education area.

February 2nd is World Wetlands Day, and this year marks the 40th anniversary of the Ramsar Convention, when many countries signed an agreement to protect their most important wetlands. We'll celebrate at Fen Drayton Lakes with a guided walk, beginning at 10am at the Holywell Lake car park.
