FENSTANTON PARISH COUNCIL - JANUARY MEETING

<u>Police report</u>: The most recent information available is for the months of October and November, during which the following crimes and incidents were reported:

3 incidents of burglary, 2 incidents of anti social behaviour,7 incidents of vehicle crime,3 incidents of violent crime,1 incident of shoplifting, 2 incidents of criminal damage and arson, 5 incidents of other theft, 3 incidents of other crime

The Parish Council urges Parishioners to be vigilant and report any suspicious behaviour to the Police. Telephone 0345 456 456 4 or 101, Crimestoppers can be contacted on 0800 55 51 11 or in an emergency 999.

<u>The Queens Diamond Jubliee</u>: The Parish Council resolved to purchase two Oak tree saplings from the Queens Estate at Sandringham to commemorate the Diamond Jubilee. It was felt that a suitable site to plant the saplings will be at the Church Street car park.

<u>A14:</u> Although no details are available at this juncture as to the form any improvement to the A14 may take, the Parish Council is concerned at the possible implications to the Village.

The Village has suffered twice from improvements to the A14 and any further expansion of the existing road is unacceptable. We currently suffer from both high levels of noise and poor air quality. It was, therefore, the Parish Council's contention that a new road should be constructed following the formerly proposed orange route. It was felt that, in the current economic situation, this should be constructed as a toll road leaving the existing A14 as a local route. A Government on line consultation is currently taking place to which the Parish Council will make a submission. Parishioners are also urged to take part in the consultation. The address is A14challenge@dft.gsi.gov.uk or Google A14 consultation.

<u>Dog fouling:</u> The Parish Council has received complaints from Parishioners regarding dogs fouling footpaths and pavements. Owners are reminded to clear up after their dogs, not to do so is not only an anti social act but is also an offence subject to a fine up to £2000.

<u>Subway:</u> Due to, at this juncture, unknown circumstances the subway became flooded at the beginning of the month leaving a thick residue of mud. Following the prompt action of our Councillors the subway was cleaned and returned to an acceptable standard by the end of the day. Parishioners can be assured that once notification of any such problem is received action will be taken.

<u>Local minor highways improvement grant</u>: The meeting resolved to submit an application for funding to improve, and make the Talls Lane / Swan Road / Bell Lane / Church Street crossroad safer.

Next Meeting: The next meeting of Fenstanton Parish Council will be held on **Thursday 9th February 2012 at 7:30pm** at Fenstanton and Hilton Primary School, School Lane, Fenstanton. Members of the press and public are welcome.

HEMMINGFORD WIND TURBINE

The Planning Department at HDC has **REFUSED** the wind turbine application. So it does not have to go to "Panel". There were several grounds on which the turbine was rejected there is an Officer Report available to view on the HDC planning portal if anyone would like to read it.

There is no decision yet about the 37 tonnes of LPG, but we have been sending emails and making lots of noise to the Health & Safety Executive, Cambridgeshire County Council and the Highways Agency (HA). It is hard to say whether the application will ultimately be refused by Planning, but we are hopeful that at least the HA might suggest the tanks be moved right away from the current proposed location near the A14 carriageway.

HILTON PARISH COUNCIL— DECEMBER MEETING

<u>Precept</u> - An increase of 3% was proposed to cover the rising costs of maintaining the village. It also recognises that reserves are dwindling and interest rates are low. A precept of £21,115 was approved for the budget April 2012 – March 2013.

<u>Cambs County Council Bid</u> – The Parish Council have submitted a bid to the County Council for £10,000 to install a crossing on Potton Road. A decision is due to be made in February and the successful bidders will be notified in due course. If successful the Parish Council must contribute financially towards the scheme.

<u>Winter Footpath Gritting</u> – we have a team of volunteers who have been trained and equipped by Cambridgeshire County Council to salt footpaths around the village. Two salt bins have been installed to help them with their rounds. Anyone who may be interested in helping with this should contact the Clerk.

<u>A14</u> – the Parish Council are seeking volunteers who may interested in assisting the with any new Government proposals for a revised A14. Please contact the Clerk if you can help.

Our next meeting is **Monday 6th February at 7.30 pm** in the Village Hall. Anyone is welcome to attend and parishioners are allowed to speak during the open session only. The Agendas for Parish Council meetings are posted on the 3 notice boards and on the village website 5 days before each meeting.

HILTON ACTION FOR TRAFFIC

Following an accident on the B1040 when a young boy from the village was in collision with a car, members of the group, parish councillors, Mr Ian Bates, Mr Richard Preston and Ms Emma Murden from CCC Highways together with the boy's parents met by the bus stop. The discussion covered the possibilities of making the area safer for all road users.

As an initial measure the point at which the late bus from Swavesey VC stopped was changed and lan Bates made it plain that he wished to be informed of any bus which failed to do so. He has posted notices on the boards to this effect.

The HAT group also met to discuss and present suggestions to the next Parish Council meeting, to consult all villagers of voting age regarding either a Pelican or Zebra crossing near the bus stop, the Highway engineers confirmed this to be the most suitable location. This consultation will be carried out in January so that villager's opinions on the matter are clear. Bearing in mind a percentage of the cost will have to be met by your Council a clear mandate is needed.

CCC is conducting a survey throughout the County on HCV vehicles in order to provide a suitable route for them to use. Hilton contributed to the survey which included road width measurements and the numbers of pedestrians and various other details, the results of which identified Hilton to be in the high risk band. Something we all know to be correct without a survey. Great! HOWEVER, the goal posts have been changed! The new results leave us in the risk band. The chairman of HAT I OW immediately challenged the legality of changing the results after a legitimate survey. The form of analysis was changed because the statisticians had not expected so many villages to have so many problems. This area suffers greatly from the effects of HCV traffic and this was reflected in the initial results but the CCC did not like this to be emphasized. So the battle continues.

Mistletoe - not just for Christmas!

Mistletoe (Viscum album) is a Traditional Christmas plant, but this spring, Dr Tim Upson, Curator and Acting Director at the Cambridge University Botanic Garden is urging us to take a closer look at these fascinating plants. The globes of these semi-parasites are very obvious high up in many of the trees surrounding the Systematic Beds at the Garden, sometimes topped with a Mistlethrush ardently protecting its crop of white berries. So often out of reach, the plant has spread locally in recent decades to colonise the smaller hawthorn and crab apple trees, even hedges, giving a rare opportunity to see this plant at close quarters.

You may be familiar with the white berries, but have you ever stopped to seek the flowers? From February to April, look closely at the end of the wishbone-like branches to spot the minute green flowers, each with four triangular petal-like structures. Unusually, Mistletoe plants are either male or female. The male flowers have four pollen-producing anthers borne singly on the petallike structures; the flowers of female plants have a single rounded stigma (pollen receiving structure) at the centre.



Of course, it is the female plants that will eventually bear the white berries in time for the following Christmas. It is thought these diminutive flowers are pollinated by flies.

Squeeze the berries and you will find them incredibly sticky. This makes the seeds difficult for birds to swallow, inciting them to wipe their beaks clean on branches, thus spreading the seeds and you can sometimes spot the sticky strings of seeds dangling from the branch. As a semi-parasite. Mistletoes plumb into the host plant taking nutrients and water, but the green leaves mean they are still able to photosynthesise and produce sugars. The point of infection is marked by an egg-shaped swelling, a structure known as the haustorium. Mistletoe won't kill a tree but can reduce its vigour and the branch beyond the haustorium is notably less vigorous.

The Cambridge University Botanic Garden is open from 10am - 5pm during February and March 2012. The Glasshouses and Café close 30 minutes before the Garden and the Botanic Garden Shop at Brookside closes 15 minutes before the Garden. From a citizen of Jiroff

I'm sure many young people, and adults, often wonder why as leaders we go on about what "scouting can offer", "making the most of the opportunities", why we are a Scout Group not a youth group and how we hope that our young people learn to understand that to truly make the most of it they don't simply "come to Scouts" but become Scouts.

Here, in his own words is what one of our own Young Leaders has to say—and we couldn't have summed it up better ourselves! Please take time to share his words with those who are at an earlier stage than him in their scouting journey, as inspiration for what they too can achieve.

"It's 5:30 in the morning. Far too early to be up, even on camp, but we have our reasons. We are all shivering and in our hoodies. We are sat below the flag pole waiting for the sun to rise. It's the perfect time to think, and the perfect time to appreciate. This is why I love Africa. This is why I love Scouts.

A daily reminder to us in the Gambia was to "leave the world a little better than you found it". These ten simple yet effective words were said by Lord Baden Powell. Every time I read, this guote, I am reminded of the unwavering dedication that the adults and young people in the Scout Association, not only in the UK but across the world, give to this amazing cause. This expedition didn't start on December 2nd when we flew to the Gambia, but in late March/early April 2011. It is a long process to organise a weekend camp for Scouts to a campsite down the road. It is an even longer process to organise a three week camp for a wide age range to Africa! When I was asked to help organise the trip, I thought it would be easy so I agreed. Little did I know, I would end up organising most things for the trip, along with my own fundraising and group fundraising. Each young person who comes on one of these trips has to pay to cover plane tickets, insurance, food etc. This expedition was £1500 and to be paid mostly by fundraising, which is a mission in itself.

On December 2nd 2011 6 of us, who made up the main team, left the UK and flew to the Gambia for a 3 week expedition. The aim was to build a market garden for the women of a village called Jiroff. The land we had was a little bit over 2 acres and needed to be cleared of scrub left after burning- the local

women were amazing with their help! After the first few days spent clearing, we started to dig holes needed for fence posts, 300 holes needed to be dug, 2 feet deep. Once the holes were dug, we then made a dry mix of cement and sand; put wooden fence posts in and put the dry mix in to fill the holes. Our next tasks were to nail the fence mesh to the poles and erect the gates made by a local welder. On our last day spent on site in Jiroff, we planted 44 trees and saw the project I was part of in 2009/10.

On the last day at Jiroff, the whole team were made Citizens of Jiroff. It was a great honour, over the two expeditions there, I have made numerous amazing friends, and have left the world a little better than I found it.

Away from the project side of the expedition, we stayed at a Scout lodge in Soma (around an hour away from Jiroff) called Kaira Konko (which means "Hill of Peace" in the local tribal language). Kaira Konko was built by Hampshire Scouts and the Manager and Commissioner of the area is Mr Lamin Kintehor just "Kinteh" as we call him. Kinteh will be awarded an MBE in February for his services to the young people of Soma and the Gambia. Kaira Konko was our home for 3 weeks and is an amazing place to stay.

Scouting opens many doors to the young people and adults involved with it. I have opened just a few of these doors, as have many Scouters that I know. Through opening doors, you can find amazing friends, meet amazing people and have the best experiences ever.

I'm going to leave you with what we said twice each day—at flag break and flag down. Scout Promise "On my honour I promise that I will do my duty to God and to the Queen, to help other people, and to keep the Scout law"; Motto "Be prepared" and a slogan of "Do a good turn daily."

Alex is aged 17. He has just returned from his second African Expedition (the first one he took part in was building / converting buildings at the school so that they could have more teachers and therefore teach more pupils), and is already a great role model for those in our younger Sections in terms of what you can achieve when you become a Scout.......



FEN DRAYTON LAKES

Readers who walk at Fen Drayton Lakes may well be used to seeing barn owls hunting areas of rough grass and reeds. I was lucky enough to see one in early January as it hunted between



Moore Lake and the Busway – a lovely end to my day as I cycled home after work.

A different kind of owl has been the highlight of a visit for a number of people this winter. Up to three short-eared owls have regularly been seen in the late afternoons, hunting farmland to the south of Far Fen Lake. Short-eared owls breed on our heather moors, and they typically spend the winter on coastal marshes, where hunting for rodents is easier than on the moors. These owls also breed in Scandinavia, and large numbers migrated to eastern England in the autumn (2011), and many of them have settled in The Fens. So long as there are enough voles and mice in our grasslands, these large owls may stay with us until spring – they're worth looking out for if you walk down The Fen towards the Busway, as the fields on the left (St Ives side) look ideal for them.

Many of our garden birds will be establishing their breeding territories during February. You'll probably hear robins and blackbirds singing in the mornings, perhaps even throughout the day if the weather is fine. Keep an eye on nest boxes too – blue tits and great tits will be claiming "ownership". I have a starling nest box, and it was being defended in early January. The birds probably won't lay eggs for many weeks yet, but if they don't make an early claim on their "des res", they could lose it to another pair.

We'll be launching our own children's wildlife explorer club in April, meeting on the third Saturday of each month. If you know interested children who are between 8 and 12 years old, please get in touch with me. We'll be running a tester event in half-term, on Friday 17th February, when there will be a number of different activities to try. All accompanied children will be welcome, and they can decide afterwards if they'd like to join the club.

If you'd like to join us on a guided walk, you'll be very welcome. All walks start from the guided bus stop and at Holywell Lake car park – with a leader at each place. Adults £4, RSPB members £2, children £1.


