

### **Parish Council Report**

#### Fenstanton

#### 8 May. Annual General Meeting.

Being the Annual General Meeting much of the business centered on Parish Council formalities, the election of Committees and Parish Council representatives to other bodies and organisations. Cllr. R. Henderson was elected Chairman for the forthcoming year and Cllr. C White Vice Chairman.

#### **Police report.**

During the period 9th April to 7th May 2008 one burglary and one theft of a motor vehicle were reported to the police.

#### Natural High / Buzz project.

The meeting considered the request to assist in funding the project, as reported in the March edition of Spectrum. It was resolved to provide the requested amount of £750.

#### 12th June.

#### Police report.

During the period 8th May to 11th June the following incidents had been reported to the police :- five acts of criminal damage (four of which involved the removal of car badges and vandalized play equipment at Chequer Street play area), one attempted burglary, one attempted theft from a vehicle and one of obtaining petrol and driving away without paving.

A sharp eved parishioner observed the play equipment in the Chequer Street play area being vandalized and called the police. The two miscreants were duly arrested and charged. They will appear in Court in the near future.

#### Northstowe Rights of Way project.

Mr Peter Duthie of the County Council gave a full and comprehensive update on the project which was completed in March. Part of the original scheme had been to upgrade the Fen to Bridleway status, but following difficulties in contacting some of the landowners it was not able to complete the task. However, Government funding has been made available for a follow on project and it is hoped to

continue the work already started in upgrading the Fen.

#### Headlands Park play area.

Work started at the beginning of June to refurbish the play area and the Parish Council is pleased to announce that it was completed within schedule by the middle of the month. The new play equipment and turfed surface which replaces the original bark has transformed the play area and improved the overall appearance of Headlands Park. The Parish Council is confident the new play equipment will give a lot of children many happy hours. It is hoped that an official opening of the play area will take place once the turf has settled and the finishing touches are complete. Further information will be displayed on the Parish Council notice boards.

#### Village conservation area.

The planned review of the Village Conservation area has been put on hold as the District Council does not have the resources to continue with it at this time. It is hoped funds will allow the review to continue in the near future.

#### Free compost giveaway.

By way of expressing it's thanks to the residents of the district, following the success of the District Council's composting scheme through the collection of green waste, they have provided a number of bags of compost to be given free to residents of the Parish. To obtain your free bag of compost come to the clock tower on Saturday 5th July from 10:00. Due to number of bags the Parish Council has been able to obtain we are only able to provide one bag per household along with proof of residency within the Parish of Fenstanton.

#### Next Meeting.

The next meeting of Fenstanton Parish Council will be held on Thursday 10th July 7:30pm at Fenstanton and Hilton Primary School, School Lane, Fenstanton. All members of the press and public are welcome.

### **Parish Council Report**

#### Hilton

The Parish Council agreed by a majority to support the County Council's technical proposals for the construction of a 1.5meter wide footpath along the side of the B1040 between The Paddocks and the Five Arches Bridge. The work first proposed by the Parish Council, is currently expected to be finished in the Spring of 2009 and when complete, will form a circular walk around the north of the village.

The A14 Action Group continues its work to ensure that the design of the new A14 will incorporate the measures necessary to mitigate the impacts caused by the road. To this end, a further meeting with the Highways Agency, and involving other local villages, is being arranged to ensure that the Agency is aware of local concerns and commits to addressing these issues.

The Hilton Action for Traffic Committee (HAT) has made an energetic start to its campaign to ease the problems of traffic in Hilton. A number of successful meetings have been held, including an open meeting where over 60 residents strongly supported the HAT objectives of seeking a better enforcement of the current speed and time/weight limits, to minimise the volume of traffic using the village and in the longer term, to obtain a total ban of HGVs transiting the village.

Mrs Nadine Taylor has been appointed as the new Clerk to the Parish Council from 6 June 2008. The Parish Council wished her every success in the job and gave a vote of thanks to Julian Thomas, the outgoing Clerk.

The Council welcomed Mr Stewart Bottoms to the Parish Council and hoped to fill the last remaining vacancy in the coming months.

The Council noted that British Telecom has made proposals to remove the public telephone box from Potton Road because of its very low usage. There will be a public consultation which will close on 6 September 2008. Residents with comments are asked to respond to the consultation coordinator at BT Payphones PP 05A23, Delta Point, Wellsley Road, Croyden CR9 2YZ.

The Council agreed to make a further protest to the County Council regarding the poor quality of the recent resurfacing work on the Church Lees Estate.



### **Hilton Action on Traffic Group (HAT)**

HAT was set up, at the request of the Parish Council, in response to the ongoing concerns about through traffic in Hilton. Public Meeting on 14th May There was a full house for our public meeting. Thank you for this show of solidarity and for valuable ideas and feedback. The main concerns expressed were:large numbers of Heavy Goods Vehicles (B1040);excessive speed (esp. B1040, Graveley Way, The Green, Church End); volume of through traffic (all routes); danger at the crossroads

The situation could easily get worse given present trends, plans for future development in Cambridgeshire and the unknown impact of the A14 development. Hilton is uniquely disadvantaged in this area with poor traffic calming and a seeming intention by the authorities to keep the B1040 open to fast, heavy and unobstructed traffic, regardless of environmental and social impact. There are currently no funds for proper traffic calming while large sums are spent maintaining the B1040 as a transportation highway. This situation cannot be allowed to continue unchallenged.

The public meeting confirmed our short-term objectives as: enforcement of speed limits and the night-time HGV ban; engagement with the A14 improvement contractors to understand and mitigate impact of the improvement in terms of types and volumes of traffic through Hilton. In the longer term, we aim to find a means to permanently exclude HGVs on the B1040 through Hilton at any time.

Activity since the meeting HAT has written to the local Inspector of Police for St Ives and District expressing our disappointment with police enforcement. We have yet to receive a reply. The issues of speeding and non-compliance with the lorry ban were raised by eleven Hilton residents at a regular consultation meeting with the St Ives & District Neighbourhood Policing Team. As a result, we anticipate speeding in Hilton will be set as a top priority over the next three months.

HAT is also setting up a database of accidents and near-miss accidents. This is important as police statistics generally include only accidents involving injury or death. If you spot an accident or near miss, please provide details to Pat Bellass on 839022.

Graveley Way crossroads A resident has requested that the County Council address the dangers of vehicles approaching the cross roads from St Ives too rapidly. There was a meeting with an officer from Highways Dept. at the junction on 8th May during which we observed one or two near-misses! Afterwards, we received the following responses to suggestions: Change of priority at junction: Council policy not to change unless accident rate increases Speed cushions: Maintenance is costly and Cambridgeshire no longer uses them Raised junction: Costly, should only be considered within an overall strategy 20 mph speed limit: Prohibitive cost and unacceptable to drivers and residents Mini roundabout: Unsafe where four roads into junction, also costly Additional signing: Highways believes present signs are adequate To qualify as an accident remedial cluster site, policy is that a 100 m length of road would need 6+ injury accidents, 3+ fatal or serious injury accidents or 5 injury accidents including one or more deaths or serious injuries within a three-year period. Our County Councillors have allocated no money this year for minor highways schemes. So at present, the Parish would have to fund any traffic calming measures in the village. It is to be hoped that we do not have to see serious injuries and/or deaths before we get to a solution. We are continuing to consider how to take this forward. LorryWatch There is a 7.5-tonne weight limit on

LorryWatch There is a 7.5-tonne weight limit on all roads through Hilton. On the B1040, this limit applies only at night (11pm – 7 am). LorryWatch is a scheme operated by Cambridgeshire Trading Standards, in partnership with local communities, to detect and reduce the misuse of weight restricted routes by heavy goods vehicles. Hilton is participating in the scheme but more volunteer observers are needed. All you have to do is note down key details of heavy vehicles if you see them flouting the ban. ### **Fen Drayton Lakes**

Guided Bus construction contractors placed notices on the nature reserve in early May, to advise people of temporary track closures to enable work to replace the Oxholme Drain culvert under the busway. Diversions will be set up first, to enable pedestrians and bridleway users to bypass the works in safety. The work can be done within the period defined on the notice, and the tracks do not have to be closed for the entire period. We will all experience some disruption getting around Fen Drayton Lakes over the next few months, but perhaps you will enjoy walking a path that you've not used for some time. The blue tits currently nesting under the Moore Brook culvert are confident they will fledge their chicks long before the contractors begin working there.

One benefit we are hoping to see while sections of the bus way route are closed is a reduction in the number of off-road vehicles being driven onto footpaths and bridleways. As ever, if you see a vehicle where it should not be, please report it as soon as possible to the police, on 0845 456 4564. We thank everyone who has been supporting the RSPB and local parish councils by using this number. Police officers have increased their visits to the area recently, and we feel that anti-social incidents may be declining, meaning that motors vehicles are spoiling fewer visits. However, no-one's visit to the Lakes (or quiet time at home in the village) should be spoilt by the way someone else drives a vehicle, so we need to continue reporting incidents. We appreciate that some people want to go off-road with their vehicles, but trails on nature reserves are not appropriate.

May and June brought many uncommon migrant birds through the nature reserve, including a female red-footed falcon and a whiskered tern. Other migrants included Temminck's stints, common cranes and a wood sandpiper. Pairs of avocets and oystercatchers nested on cleared islands in Moore Lake, but sadly the floods at the end of May and early June destroyed both nests.

### **Hilton Cricket Club**

The season did not get off to the most successful start. This might be attributable to jet-lag, because for four of our first six matches we had to travel half way across the globe to Peterborough. Also, as noted previously, this is Division 4, where the other teams display keenness to an almost embarrassing degree. Between innings, their players can be seen throwing the ball to each other – often quite hard – apparently to warm up their hands in preparation for fielding. Our opponents overhauled our score with just eleven balls to spare, though this was largely due to the efforts of one batsman who scored 100.

The youngsters in the team continue to show plenty of promise. Frazer Leader has batted consistently well. He was second highest scorer for Hilton at Werrington and in the return match he hit the sweetest of sixes, almost reaching Wraggs Row. He has also capably taken on a goodly share of bowling, in the absence of some of the seniors. Richard Ruddy delighted himself and the rest of the team by top-scoring with 24 at Hampton. He managed a six and three fours on a ground with long boundaries. Richard also stepped forward as first change bowler at Werrington and grabbed a couple of useful wickets.

As *Spectrum* staff migrate *en masse* to some exotic resort to toast themselves in the sun, our lads will still be here, devoting their Sunday afternoons to entertaining the public as they search for the ball in the long grass. The next edition of this magazine in two months' time might feature tales of victory, landmark performances and other acts of personal endeavour on the cricket field. Who knows?
