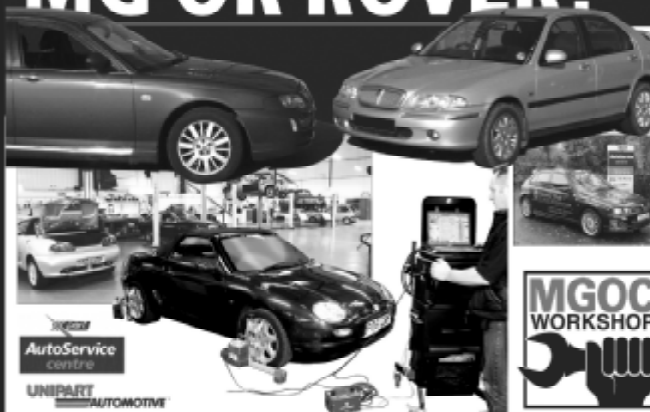

13th May 2010. The May meeting is also the Annual General Meeting of the Parish Council. Cllr. Colin White was elected as Chairman and Cllr. Sally Gough Vice Chairman for the ensuing year. The meeting also elected members to the Standing Committees and appointed representatives to ensure the Parish's interests are served on outside bodies and organisations.

An application had been received from Mr. Paul Kent to fill the vacant seat on the Council as a co-opted Councillor. The meeting approved the application and Mr. Kent was duly elected. The meeting also endorsed the recommendation of the Trustees of The Joseph Ellis Trust that Mrs. Roseann White fills the vacancy caused by the death of the late Mr. Harry Hooper.

Police report During the period 7th April 2010 to 11th May the following incidents had been reported to the Police: 1 incident of obtaining diesel without paying; 1 theft. A Police representative had been expected to attend the meeting but due to operational commitments was unable to do so. The meeting agreed that a request should be made for a representative to attend the June meeting. Although the number of reported incidents is low the Parish Council urges Parishioners to be vigilant and report any suspicious behaviour to the Police. Telephone 03454564564, Crimestoppers can be contacted on 0800555111 or in an emergency 999.

Hampton Close Open Space. Following a site meeting with representatives of the Parish Council, District Council and Persimmon, it is expected that the work on the car park will commence within the next

few weeks to bring it up to the defined planning specification. Work has started to bring the open space to the required standard. It is expected the area will be ready for adoption by the end of the year. The Parish Council will consider the matter of adoption at its next meeting.

The District Council appear to be sympathetic to the placing of a rubbish bin by the car park and also at the Cranesbrook section of the woodland walk to encourage dog owners to deposit waste rather than to leaving it on paths and other obscure places. The bins will be emptied by the District Council. The meeting agreed to pursue this line and defer taking action to implement a 'Pick it up and bin it' campaign until the success of the provision of bins is ascertained.

A14 A representative of the Parish Council will attend the Pre Public Inquiry meeting on the 24th May. It is the Parish Council's intention to speak at the Inquiry, which is scheduled to commence on Tuesday 20th July at the St Ives Business Centre Parsons Green St Ives. The Parish Council fully supports the proposed route as it will improve the lifestyle of the majority of Parishioners particularly as the village has suffered considerably in the past, not least with the Village being divided. The Parish Council has formed a working group to put a case together to present to the Inquiry offering support for the route but ensuring sufficient noise reducing measures are implemented to further protect the village as a whole but also those areas closest to the route.

Police report. During the period 12th May 2010 to 8th June 2010 the following incidents had been reported to the Police.

One incident of obtaining fuel without paying.

Breaking, entry and damage to the sheds at the allotments. Reports of anti social behaviour in Simmer Piece involving vehicles and the playing of loud music.

PCSO Davis attended the meeting and answered questions covering speeding, parking, dog fouling and the levels of Police presence in the Village.

Although the number of reported incidents is low the Parish Council urges Parishioners to be vigilant and report any suspicious behaviour to the Police. Telephone 03454564564, Crimestoppers can be contacted on 0800555111 or in an emergency 999.

Adoption of the Hampton Close Open Space.

The meeting discussed at length the matter of adoption following an invitation from the District Council. Concern was expressed at the condition of the soil to sustain the quality of grass required for a football pitch and the long term cost of maintenance that would have to be borne by the Parish. The meeting agreed to defer making a decision until further information on the soil quality became available.

Protection to prevent further erosion and damage to Village greens and verges.

Damage by vehicles to the greens and verges has become apparent and is having a detrimental effect on the Village particularly those parts that fall into the conservation area.. Members of the Parish Council held a site meeting with representatives from County Council Highways Department and the District Council Conservation Department to look at options to restore Chapel Green. Subject to final approval from Conservation it was agreed in principal to have the road restored to the original

width, by the United Reformed Church, kerbing in keeping with a conservation area to be installed on the Chequer Street/Talls Lane corners and the edge of the green be restored and raised. The edge will be lowered at two points to allow pedestrian access and to a width suitable for the disabled and buggies. However, the situation could be helped and improved if drivers gave more consideration to the Village heritage and refrained from driving onto and/or parking on the greens and verges.

A14 As most Parishioners will, by now, be aware the Public Inquiry has been postponed with no indication of a commencement date. The Parish Council, however, is continuing to lobby the Agencies involved to ensure that sufficient sound proofing, bunding and landscaping are included in the programme at an early stage should the inquiry take place and indeed construction actually take place.

Parish Action Plan. The meeting agreed to implement a Parish Action Plan to examine deficiencies within the Parish and implement measures to make improvements. Projects to be embraced by the plan will be discussed in full at the next meeting once members have had the opportunity to appraise the level of deficiency and where improvements can be made.

Next Meeting. The next meeting of Fenstanton Parish Council will be held on **Thursday 9th September 2010** at 7:30pm at Fenstanton and Hilton Primary School, School Lane, Fenstanton.

A14 ELLINGTON TO FEN DITTON IMPROVEMENT—I am directed by the Secretary of State for Transport and the Secretary of State for Communities and Local Government, who act jointly in these matters, to refer to the above scheme. As you will be aware the Government has made clear its most urgent priority is to tackle the UK's record budget deficit to restore confidence in the economy and support the recovery. As part of its plan to eliminate the bulk of the deficit over the course of this Parliament, the Government will undertake a full Spending Review, reporting in the Autumn. The Department for Transport will play a full part in that process.

It has therefore been decided that until the Government's spending review has been concluded, the Department for Transport will not be in a position to identify those major infrastructure projects it can support, consistent with the Government's objectives. In view of the uncertainty over the availability of funding for this scheme, it has been decided to postpone, for the time being, the holding of the local inquiry. We aim to provide you with an indication of the way forward for this scheme later this year once the spending review is complete.

The A14 Action Group and the Parish Council have been working extremely hard to produce documentation to support our objection. We will await further notifications from the Department of Transport, but in the meantime ensure all our evidence and documentation is in place for the future. Our gratitude goes out to all those who have given up so much of their time to work on this project.

Youth Football – The Parish Council have given permission for Fenstanton Youth Football Club's Under 11 Team to play on the Green starting 11th September. There will be approximately 12 home games over the course of the

season and strict parking arrangements will be in place.

The Village Pavilion – the Parish Council are renovating the pavilion and work will be undertaken over the next few months to bring it into an acceptable state. If any parishioner has any views on how the pavilion could be used in the future we would be pleased to hear from you. Please contact the Clerk.

Connections Youth Bus – will be visiting Hilton (Village Hall Car Park) on Friday 27th August between 4 and 6 pm. Open to all who are school year 7 and above, entrance is free. The bus has on board: games consoles, internet access, music crafts, karaoke, chill out area, tuck shop and much more.

Speedwatch - David McCandless of St Ives Speedwatch will be joining us at our next Parish Council Meeting on Monday 5 July to discuss the findings from Speedwatch. Parishioners are invited to attend to hear about the pros and cons of Speedwatch.

Local Development Framework – Strategic Housing Land Availability Assessment – Site Assessment for Gypsy and Traveller Sites – Public Consultation The Consultation deadline date is 9th July. Plans can be viewed at <http://consult.huntsdc.gov.uk/portal>. Parishioners are urged to view and comment.

Neighbourhood Speedwatch in Hilton

As you are all aware, we have a traffic problem in Hilton from both the volume, and speed perspective. Having the village effectively bisected by a major route (although a B road), makes matters even worse, and I am afraid that the Police just don't have enough resources to effectively enforce the speed limit. With a broad mix of young and old in the village, it is important that we do all we can to make the roads as safe as possible.

Over the last few months, you may have noticed, the regular presence of Speed Display devices manned by people in high visibility jackets. This is Speedwatch, an initiative run by the Police Force alongside the Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Road Safety Partnership and supported by Hilton

Parish Council. The objectives of Speedwatch are:

- To encourage people to reduce speeding traffic through our community
- To monitor the speed in areas where speeding is a known problem

- Report vehicles that infringe the speed limit

- Provide statistical information for the police to help them best prioritise resources for enforcement activities.

A recent survey by the police on the Potton Road showed that between 20% and 30% of all vehicles passing through Hilton were exceeding the speed limit, and as you can see from the picture above, some by a considerable margin, especially past accident black spots like Church End. These statistics have been confirmed by our observations.

You probably know that if you if you hit a child at 30 MPH, the child has an 80% chance of surviving, but at 40 MPH has only a 10% chance.

FENSTANTON WI

On Thursday June 3rd Geoff Evans gave us a fascinating talk with slides entitled 'Around Alaska'. Cold, snowy, bleak, inhospitable are perhaps words that come into our mind if Alaska is mentioned. Geoff didn't like the American word 'awesome' but that is the word that sums up Alaska for him. Geoff and his wife have been there four times for a holiday albeit in the Summer when the temperature can rise to 86° F. We saw the town of Anchorage positively brimming with flowers and hanging baskets. As in England there was a variety of cafés and restaurants which offered food from around the world and catered for all tastes. We saw high mountains topped with snow, dense forests, crystal clear lakes and rivers. The highlight of the visit was watching the brown bears catching large salmon as they swam upstream from the sea to their spawning ground. The bears eat 12 to 15 salmon a day, can grow up to 10 feet tall and can weigh 800 to 900 lbs. We saw mother bears with cubs from 6 months old up to 2 or 3 years old as they are open to attack from male bears until then. In the Summer there is a Salmon Parade. Schools, hospitals and artists decorate large salmon and these are paraded through the streets. Our favourite was a very convincing Elvis look-alike which was named King Salmon. HILTON WI

Alison Dickens was the speaker at our June meeting, which was opened to husbands and friends, as it was a very popular subject: the history and archaeology under the Grand Arcade in Cambridge. And we weren't disappointed. She outlined for us in fascinating slides many unexpected features of mediaeval Cambridge, including the Kings Ditch, a 15 ft wide 'black and stinking' ditch which cut through the whole site and which was dug as a fortification, leaving a central area of the city, with the river on one side and the ditch on the other, well protected. She began by showing us a map from 1574 which outlined the earliest recorded buildings and plots in the area. The excavation work involved 35 professional archaeologists and took 14 months to complete and many unusual finds of pottery and household objects were made, including a rare wooden jug at the bottom of one of the numerous wells discovered. The excavation team proved beyond question that the Grand Arcade area of Cambridge was indeed a suburb with people living there in a domestic way in the first quarter of the 11th century and we all agreed that Alison has given us a fascinating look into the history of our wonderful City.

Next month we have the head Gardener from Wimpole Hall coming to take us on a virtual tour of that grand estate and also next month we are going on our summer outing to Woburn. The summer lunch on 10th August will be held in Rosemary's garden so let her know if you plan to attend as she needs to know how many to cater for.

During the summer Hilton WI will also be attempting to join in the NFWI Triathlon challenge by getting as many members as possible walking around the village one evening. The challenge will be clocked up by totalling the number of walkers and adding their miles together...so we should easily make the 20 mile challenge.

WILD LIFE TRUSTS—HUNTINGDONSHIRE LOCAL GROUP

The Local Group of the Wildlife Trust invites you to the next of this year's Wonderful Wetlands walks on **Sunday 25th July 2010 at 10.30am.**

We will be visiting Summer Leys Nature Reserve in the Upper Nene Valley. This is an area of flooded gravel pits, flood meadows and species rich grassland providing a haven for breeding and wading birds. Local expert Graham Warnes, who is also Chairman of 'Friends of Summer Leys', will lead the walk here.

At this time of year, there should be an excellent selection of butterflies such as common blue, small copper, brown argus and gatekeeper, plus many dragonfly and damselfly. Among the birds likely to be seen are reed bunting, lapwing, snipe, buzzard, kestrel and peregrine, and many duck such as tufted, shoveler and pochard, plus a breeding colony of common tern. The grassland supports many species including great burnet, lady's bedstraw and bird's foot trefoil.

Everyone is very welcome to attend. Please meet at 10.30am in the car park, grid ref SP 885 634. Suggested donation: adults £2.00, children free.

And in August, the Local Group are again joining with Ely Local Group for this summer's barbecue on **Saturday 14th August. FEN DRAYTON LAKES

The swans on Moore Lake have both produced cygnets – three hatched from one nest, but I'm not sure how many hatched from the other. The second nest hatched a week into June, and the cygnets have been riding their mother's back, partly hidden under her wings.

The cold spring delayed nesting for many birds, but the warm weather in late May enabled many insects, such as butterflies and dragonflies, to make up for lost time, and indeed, some were recorded on earlier dates than last year.

The wet spell at the beginning of June was badly needed by our local house martins. These little migrants need wet mud to build their nests, and that just wasn't anywhere to be found when the birds first arrived in May. Once their chicks have hatched, the martins will do a grand job eating flies, which they catch as they fly around just above our house roofs.

We have two events planned for adults before the school holidays begin. We'll be looking for butterflies on Sunday 4 July, and then running an all-day willow-weaving workshop on Friday 9 July. The latter will cost you £15 (£10 if you are a RSPB member), and you can create a masterpiece with our willow.

Throughout the school holidays, we'll be kept busy with a series of pond-dipping and bug-hunting events. There'll also be an art workshop and a story-telling event – please pick up our events leaflet or check our web site for all the dates. These events cost £2 per child, but £1 for RSPB members, and no charge for their adults. Bookings are required so we can ensure the children get plenty of help and have lots of fun.

The latest news from the Hanson-RSPB wetland project is that a new permissive path, installed by Hanson across the first mere north of Over village, has been opened ready for the summer. The path runs east to west along the edge of the canal, north of the largest mere. Kissing gates at Bare Hill and at the northern end of Long Drove provide access to the grassy, way-marked route. The new path makes possible a circular walk around Cuckoo Drove, Long Drove and Long Holme Drove. As this is a permissive path, we are asking walkers to keep to the marked route with dogs on a lead. With good views over the most well developed reed beds walkers can expect to see ducks, geese and swans dabbling and diving on the waters. During the summer months, reed and sedge warblers can be heard reeling their songs from amongst the reeds, with reed buntings common in the marshy edges. There is also the chance of seeing a hunting marsh harrier, hobby or barn owl. Brown hares are frequently seen in the grassy margins, with skylarks singing high overhead and dragonflies skimming along below. Cattle graze this area too.

The opening of the route marks a new phase in the opening up of a significant network of routes, and what we hope will be the quiet enjoyment of the new wetlands by many local people. Path creation will continue this year, with further routes and viewpoints being created around the restored reed beds near Over and around the settlement lagoons at Needingworth.
