

FENSTANTON PARISH COUNCIL - JUNE 2011

Police report. The most recent information available is for the month of April which indicated the following reported incidents: 2 incidents of anti social behaviour, 1 incident of violent crime, 2 incidents of vehicle crime, 5 other unspecified crimes.

The Parish Council urges Parishioners to be vigilant and report any suspicious behaviour to the Police. Telephone 0345 456 456 4, Crimestoppers can be contacted on 0800 55 51 11 or in an emergency 999.

<u>On road long term parking</u>. Vehicles parking for long periods during the working day are becoming an increasing problem. The Clock Tower, Swan Road and Hilton Road seem to be the worst affected.

The Parish Council has discussed the situation with the County Council Highways Department only to be advised that there is no budget for implementing any form of work other than that which has been approved and is necessary. In view of the statement from the Highways Department the meeting discussed at length the forms of action that can be taken within the legal remit of the Parish Council. Consideration was given to the fact that, without any form of time or parking restriction vehicles can legally park on the Highway assuming, of course, the vehicle is taxed etc and is not causing an obstruction. The matter of vehicles parking on the footpath was also discussed and it was agreed that this is an area where parishioners, themselves, can play an active role by reporting the vehicles directly to the Police, as this is an offence.

It was agreed in the first instance to write to local businesses requesting that their employees and visitors do not park on street for long periods and advising them of the location of official car parks. Further to this, where vehicles are observed parking for long periods on a regular basis a notice may be placed on the vehicle again advising of the location of car parks.

Currently the Parish and Town Councils have no powers to undertake Highway matters as the responsibility is with the County Council. However, Parish Councils and Town Councils may be granted the powers to accept responsibility for highway matters under the Localism Bill. All financial costs associated implementing any such power will have to be included in the Parish's budget and, therefore, be included in the Precept. The associated costs could fall into considerable sums, which ultimately will be borne by all Parishioners. Therefore, careful consideration must be given to balance the cost against the practicality and effectiveness of any scheme and the overall benefit.

The Parish Council's Traffic and Transport Committee will review the options and possibilities at a future meeting.

<u>Next Meeting</u>. The next meeting of Fenstanton Parish Council will be held on **Thursday 14th July 2011 at 7:30pm** at Fenstanton and Hilton Primary School, School Lane, Fenstanton. Members of the press and public are welcome.

Anyone who welcomes you welcomes me" (Matthew 10:40)

A newly wedded couple driving on a remote country road was stopped by a sudden heavy storm. It happened at night and further journey was not possible. 

It seemed surreal that the small lady talking in such a composed manner was born in a concentration camp. Eva quietly spoke about her family and showed us photographs taken before the war when thankfully they had no idea of the horrendous things that were about to happen to them.

In fact only a small minority fled from Germany, most of them stayed, hoping for the best. Eva's father was a German Jew and an architect by trade. One of his brothers went to Holland and later to Switzerland and his sister got on one of the last boats to Australia. Eva's father went to Prague thinking that was far enough away. There he met and married Eva's mother who was a law student at university.

Even when they lost their careers because Jews were not allowed in top jobs, universities or schools they made the best of it. Eva's mother became an apprentice milliner. They put up with not being allowed in parks or cinemas and stoically gave up their cars, bikes, radios and pets. Some were ashamed to wear the Yellow Star every time they went out but others were quick to tell them to hold their heads up high. No, things weren't too bad, they thought.

Although they didn't realise it the nightmare really began when Eva's mother and father each received a card from the Gestapo telling them to report to a warehouse near the railway station. They were told to take warm clothes and one small suitcase. Eva's mother took a large, unwieldy box of doughnuts which she was allowed to keep despite one German soldier swearing and sneering about it.

From then on we heard stories of horrendous train journeys once in a

coal truck, some lasting weeks, as they were moved to different camps including Thereinstad. Auschwitz and Mauthusen where Eva was born just before the end of the war. People were packed in, standing room only with no food or water. In isolated areas the dead were flung out. In the camps families were split up, most never to be seen again. Children, the old and infirm were sent straight to gas chambers because they couldn't do any useful work. Having been told all about that Eva wanted to know how it was possible that she had been born. Her mother said that when you are desperate you will risk everything for a bit of comfort. Apart from Eva and her mother only one cousin and her Paternal Grandfather survived. Ironically he had been awarded the Iron Cross, First Class for gallantry, in the First World War.

Eva and her mother came to Britain in 1948 where she re-married. We were shown the latest photograph; Eva's mother, now ninty-four, with her daughter, two grandchildren and three great-grandchildren. When her mother saw it she smiled and said, "We Won!" Carol Crocker gave the vote of thanks.





FEN DRAYTON LAKES



A number of people have told me that they would like to come on some of the guided walks, but feel that three hours is too long (even

though we only walk two to two-and-a-half miles). I've added three shorter walks to the events programme, and these will last no more than one-and-a-half hours. The first one is on Wednesday 20 July, starting at 10am at the Holywell Lake car park. The others will be in August and September.

We'll decide on the morning where to go, based on what is currently to be seen. Bernard, who used to look after some of the lakes before the RSPB arrived, has built three viewing shelters for us, so perhaps we'll visit one of these on the short walks, and use the built-in seats while admiring the views. On the summer walks, we expect to see many different butterflies and dragonflies, so long as the sun shines.

Willingham Guides was the first group to use our new dipping platform in Ferry Lagoon, and they found lots of interesting water creatures. No fish, but lots of leeches, damselfly nymphs and a water scorpion.

We'll make good use of this new platform during the summer holidays, but there are two dipping events for adults only, before the schools break up. Why not join us, and see for yourself some of the fascinating creatures that live here?

The bird nesting season continues until August, but we can announce some good news. Cetti's warbler is a sedentary species that has colonised Cambridgeshire's Fens in the past few years. There were concerns that they would have struggled to survive the hard weather in December and January, but here at Fen Drayton Lakes, the numbers have increased again, and we have 12 territorial males this year.

We've also had a territorial nightingale, the first one to spend any length of time here for a number of years. Many people heard the wonderful song, but very few people got to see the singer, which favoured a thick hawthorn hedge. Female nightingales don't sing – so we don't know if our songster had a partner.
