<u>A14:</u> Thank you to all Parishioners who have taken the time to write to the Highways Agency and their local MP and District Councillors regarding the proposed A14 route. The current consultation period closed on 15 June 2014 and we will post any responses the Parish Council receives on our website www.hilton-pc.co.uk

The Parish Council will monitor the next stages of the process and advise at future meetings what further action may need to be undertaken.

The responses promised by the representatives of Jacobs at the open meeting held in the Methodist Chapel have not, at the time of writing this article, been received.

<u>Crossing on Potton Road:</u> The Parish Council continues to chase Cambridgeshire County Council, who in turn are chasing Balfour Beatty, to get the Belisha beacons working. The latest news was that Balfour Beatty were due to attend to this on Friday 13 June 2014 but, again at the time of writing this article, the beacons do not appear to have been turned on. We will continue to press for this to be done.

<u>Car Park:</u> Work to attend to the pot holes in the car park adjacent to the village hall has been authorised and will hopefully be completed in the short term. The Parish Council would like to thank Hilton Town Trust for their generous contribution toward the cost of these repairs.

<u>Next Meeting:</u> The next full meeting of the Parish Council will take place at 7:30 pm on Monday **7th July 2014** at Hilton Village Hall.

It has been said to me that this field had

many trenches and mounds until the land owner decided to flatten it for easier use sometime in the middle of the 20th century. It was suspected by some older residents that these mounds were the foundations of Roman buildings. Looking at their location I think that this is highly unlikely as in the Roman period this field would have been part of the Great Fen. The Romans would not have built in the middle of a fen!

So I turned to the records held at the Norris Museum and found that Miss Gertrude Peet had looked into the history of these mounds and hollows back in 1922. The following is extracted from her writings.

"Popular village imagination has been busy in trying to find an explanation for the existence of many deep trenches and mounds in this field. Some say they are ancient defence works used by the early inhabitancy possibly thrown up by Boudicca and her army when defending her country against invading Romans. The mounds being the graves of those that fell in battle they were afterwards used by the inhabitants to resist the Danish invasions."

Ancient fisheries; the following is also from Miss Peet's papers. "The hollows and mounds are the remains of the old trenches and dams necessary to let in and keep the water from the river in the fisheries. The mounds being the resting places or homes of the swans and wild fowls that dot the centre of the fields like hillocks today."

Cromwell's Graves to the west of the village: A similar interesting legend is told by Mr L Burgess. Older inhabitants of the village say; "at one time the field now called Home Close had many more trenches and mounds than now exist and the trenches were thrown up by Cromwell's army and the mounds are where the dead after the battle were buried."

Miss Peet's collection of papers has notes and maps that prove that this Home Close once formed part of a Saxon fishery. Fenstanton in 1012 had seven such fisheries and that all the village trenches and mounds are from the Saxon period.

So sorry, not Roman remains, not Boudicca's defences, or Cromwell's trenches, just Saxon fisheries!




What a great spring and early summer we are having! This bodes well for a bumper crop of entries to the Produce Show and we look forward to a huge number of contributors.


