CAMBRIDGE BOTANIC GARDENS

Big tree splendour

A postscript to the commemoration of the 200th anniversary of the Battle of Waterloo last month recalls a spat with our friends in the other direction across the pond over the naming of one of the most impressive tree species we grow here at the Garden.

Commonly referred to as the big-tree, giant redwood or wellingtonia, Sequoiadendron giganteum is an evergreen tree originating in the foothills of the western Sierra Nevada in California. It remained unknown to science until the age of the great plant hunters, who travelled the world - often in conditions of great discomfort and danger - in search of new species. One such plant hunter, William Lobb was appointed by the renowned Chelsea nurserymen, Messrs Veitch, to explore the American continent. Having heard tell of a grove of gigantic trees he hot-footed it to Calaveras County where he was astounded by their stature, noting: "from 80 to 90 trees, all within the circuit of a mile, and these varying from 250 feet to 320 feet in height and from 10 to 20 feet in diameter". Such was the thrill of finding an exceptional plant with great commercial potential, Lobb cut short his trip and returned immediately to England with herbarium specimens and seed. Veitch's Nursery was quickly offering seedlings at the price of two guineas each. Meanwhile, the type specimen (the original specimen from which new species descriptions are based) was passed on to the botanist John Lindley, who initially named this new discovery Wellingtonia gigantea to commemorate the Duke of Wellington. This caused great offence to American officials who proposed Washingtonia gigantea instead. After much debate the neutral name of Sequoiadendron giganteum was settled upon, although its common name of wellingtonia is still much used in the UK!

The Garden's plantings of *Sequoiadendron giganteum along the Main Walk* originated from Lobb's 1853 seed collection and are already magnificent trees. It is hard to imagine our landscape without them, but what of their future? Records suggest that plants have been found in California that are 4,000 years old. So, ours may continue to have an impact on the Cambridge landscape not just for the coming decades, but for many centuries, perhaps even millennia.



Fenstanton Places and Street Names

To understand how some of our places and streets received their names you have to use your imagination and turn your mind to an earlier time. The original village was situated half a mile from the high street and centred on **Honey Hill**, the **church** and **Church Leys** areas. What is now the **High Street** was just a road running from **Cambridge** to **Godmanchester**. Originally built up by the Romans it would have been constructed on earlier Celtic tribal pathways.

We know that there were some buildings along the Roman road such as the Roman Imperial Mansio (Hotel) which both Jack Dady and Gertrude Peet supposed was on the site of the present **George Pub**. Most of all we have to imagine the **High Street** without its buildings with fields and marsh coming right up to the roadside.

The village was surrounded by water, marsh and fen. There was a large marsh between **Fenstanton** and **Hilton** and travel between the villages would have been very hazardous especially in the winter months. This would have been the same for the **Hemingfords** hence the road to these villages is still called **Marsh Lane**. **St Ives** was the other side of the Great Fen and the river and was only accessible via the causeway, now known as the **New Bridges**. **Fen Drayton** was well away from the old Roman Road and access was only available via a trackway around the Great Marsh now **Mill Road**. The Great Marsh came right up to the Roman Road opposite what is now the **Shell service area**. There was a large forested area to the south west of the village, running to the west of the Roman Road.

This forest area later became known as the **Oakland's Estate** and in it was **Oaklands House**, the largest house in the village. **Pig Farm, (now the Gables)** abutted Oaklands. From here the 'Swine-Herds' would drive the pigs out into the forest. The **Pig Farm** formerly had a model of a pig at the top of the house, which was removed when the name was changed to **The Gables**. There is a legend that when the model pig heard the clock tower bell strike one, it came down for its dinner! **Oxholme Farm** was next to Pig Farm and it was the homeland of the plough oxen and '**Holme'** being an island in low lying land.

Fenstanton Places and Street Names (cont)

Bell lane: A lane leading from the High Street to the parish church. Gertrude Peet described this lane by painting a picture with words: "One can picture the church bells being heard by the devout Roman Catholics travellers in the High Street and this was the quickest way to obey the summons to get from the busy part (Road) of the village to the church. **Bell Lane** is continued by **Church Street** and a beautiful picture can be imagined of the Crusaders, Pilgrims and travellers on the Old Roman Road hearing the church bells and turning down the lane to attend devout service".

Tall's Lane, the saying is "it is tall if it is not short". In other words it is not a short lane! **Swan Lane** (**now Swan Road**), a lane used by the Swans as they travel from one marshy place to another. The Pinder (keeper of the swans) would most probably have lived in this lane. **Scorney**: Scorney Meadows, meaning doubtful, low land that is liable to flood and is therefore disappointing. The 'ey' denotes an island, hence a swampy meadow, unreliable land.

Honey Hill: Bounding the top village green and a high part of the village. It is recorded that it is named after the honey from Bees, which for many centuries supplied the only means of sweetening the people's food and making Mead. The Bees also provided the wax that was so necessary for use in the Roman Catholic Church. In the church calendar **Candlemas** is the day when the wax was blessed by the priests. **Headlands:** The large area at the top of a field left clear to enable the 8-oxen-driven plough to turn around. **Little Moor:** Probably named after the Great Moor on which it stands. **Sallows:** A field of Willows.

The New Vicarage: Built on the site of the Old vicarage and farm yard at the corner of Church Lane. After the vicarage was pulled down it became a group of small holdings called **'Small Holdings Yard'**. In one corner once stood a large Mulberry Tree and Gertrude Peet wrote that it is more than likely that the fruit from this tree was used for the dessert of Queen Elizabeth I when she dined in Fenstanton at the site of the **George Pub**.

Dragonfly Walk

The Huntingdonshire Local Group of the Wildlife Trust invites you to the next of our summer events on Sunday 26th July 2015 at 10.30am.

Amy Robinson, who is the Wildlife Trust's Education and Community Officer for the Ouse Valley, will be leading a walk at Godmanchester Nature Reserve at Cow Lane,

Godmanchester, Huntingdon. This is an area of flooded gravel pits, reed lands, flood meadows and scrub, which provides a haven for wildlife.

At this time of year, we hope to see a good variety of dragonfly such as broad bodied and scarce chasers, common and ruddy darters, large hawkers and damselflies. Among the birds likely to be seen are reed bunting, common tern, lapwing, yellow hammer, and whitethroat and many duck such as tufted, shoveler and pochard. The grassland also supports many species including great burnet, lady's bedstraw and bird's foot trefoil.
