
## Cambridge Open Studios is back in Hilton this July!





Hilton Community Garden has been open for 2 years. The group was kindly given part of a field and has transformed the land with raised beds, a fruit cage, fruit trees, a wild life area, flowers and a peaceful seating area. There is a a poly tunnel for tomatoes and cucumbers, a small pond and bird feeders. Many people not only come to dig and plant, but also visit the garden to enjoy the space, sit and relax, have a picnic and chat with friends. The garden is open to everyone and the produce can be enjoyed by all. If the lettuces are ready, do help yourself; if you would like some radishes, or some fresh herbs just pick them and take them home; enjoy the rhubarb or dig some potatoes. It is a community venture for the community. It is YOUR garden.

The garden has been supported by many donations and grants and by practical support from many people and organisations. Uniformed groups come and help regularly and enjoy learning about the different plants and there are regular Saturday working parties from 10am - noon. A highlight of the working party is cake at 11am and everyone is welcome to come along and chat about the garden whilst enjoying delicious refreshments.

Recently a group from Hilton Community Garden visited Godmanchester Community nursery to learn about their project (which is much bigger than ours). We also organised a fun evening in the style of Gardeners' Question Time when we all learnt a great deal from our panel of experts.

We will be welcoming members of The Cambridgeshire Garden Trust to enjoy our garden shortly and on 2<sup>nd</sup> July the garden is part of the National Garden Scheme so visitors, not only from Hilton but

also from across the country will be able to enjoy the garden.

Fenstanton and Number 17 High Street (the old dairy offices) and the lane from the high street to the new Crown Estate: By John Deeks

From the earliest of times there has been a footpath, or rather a lane that ran from the High Street, opposite Bell Lane. This ran to the agricultural land that ran parallel to the High Street. From number 17 to the Conington Road on the northern side of the High Street. This land was for many years known as Morgan's Croft and is shown centre in this 1777 map. At that time it



was agricultural land owned by Peter Cowling who lived in Petersfield House now number 19 High Street.

The map was made in 1777 when Lancelot 'Capability' Brown became lord of the manor. This map shows a range of buildings on the High Street and down the side of the lane. These most probably were of Tudor construction. They would have been of wooden creation and most probably used to house the labourers who worked the land for Peter Cowling. Later maps from 1810 and 1901 suggest that these Tudor buildings had been demolished and replaced with more modern buildings but they would still



have been very basic in design and facilities.

This is a picture of the old cottages that once stood in the High Street where today stand the Archer Terrace houses. The cottages that were down the lane would have looked the same and were most probably built at the same time for the same purpose. In the 18<sup>th</sup> century these buildings and much of the land in Fenstanton were owned or leased by

Peter Cowling who was a major land owner in Huntingdonshire. He was a great friend of Lancelot Brown and their families are buried together inside the parish church.

The building that we see today and making up the three homes contained in number 17 High Street, is a late 19th century house incorporating two wings of an earlier 18th century building with a two storey 19th century porch. Unit one, has access to the High Street, unit two, perpendicular to the High Street and unit three, have access at the rear.

Number 17 High Street, is a Grade II Listed Building which stands within the Fenstanton Conservation Area. The building had previously been altered externally and the interior had been modernised when it was the offices of the dairy. Built in red brick, the turret is particularly decorative with an ogee (an arch with a pointed apex, formed by the intersection of two S curves) stone doorway, coloured glass windows and corbelled and ventilated eaves with a pyramidal roof. Before renovation began, a small test hole was made in the ceiling of one of the first floor rooms revealing that it is of lath and plaster. Overall, the work carried out on the building has retained almost all the surviving historic fabric and removed or improved on all the twentieth century additions

# LHI Chequer Street—New parking bays

You will probably be aware by now that work is underway to create new parking bays on Chequer Street.

Whilst your Parish Council has tried to keep residents informed from the start of this project, it seems that some residents were unaware of the works and in particular, that unfortunately, three of the five trees would be lost.

Your Parish Council would like to reassure residents that a survey of the trees was carried out before works were agreed and the survey found that the one of the trees was infected with Phytophthora and the other two trees that were removed were in poor health and unlikely to survive more than 3-5 years. The work was carried out in accordance with the Town and Country Planning Act, section 211. To replace the trees lost, your Parish Council along with CCC will be planting six mature trees in October.

You may be aware that General Practice has been asked to review appointment booking procedures. At Riverport Medical Practice we are following BMA recommendations and have introduced a new booking system.

Booking an appointment with Nurses, Healthcare Assistants, Physiotherapists or Pharmacists is unchanged, and can be done at any time over the telephone. Booking to see or speak to a GP or Physician Associate has changed.

Clinically urgent appointments will still be triaged by our Duty Doctors, and we will provide information and advice on the most appropriate service provider for your health needs. This may be a community pharmacy, a minor injuries unit, NHS111 online service, or emergency care such as A&E or 999.

If you require a routine appointment with a GP or Physician Associate, our team will send you an online link via text message. This link will direct you to our appointment book, so you can schedule an appointment with the clinician of your choice, at a time and date that's convenient to you. If you cannot receive a text message link, our Reception Team will book your appointment with you over the telephone.

You can request an appointment link either via telephone, or online through the NHS app or on our website.

# An update from Fen Drayton Lakes

Perhaps the most beautiful of our doves and pigeons, the Turtle Dove is a cherished sight in our landscape and one which has been celebrated in poetry and art since the time of Chaucer. With orange scalloped wings, rose-hued breast and black-and-white striped neck patch this is a distinctive bird. They have nothing to do with turtles themselves; the name comes from their repeated purring call which sounds like the French word - 'Tourterelle'.

This species migrates to Sahelian Africa in the autumn and doesn't return until the following May, spending longer away from the UK than here. The migration is a perilous one and is made even harder by the risk of hunting around the Mediterranean along their journey. This, in combination with a few other causes such as agricultural intensification and habitat loss, has led to the Turtle Dove becoming the UK's fastest-declining bird species with numbers down 98% since the 1970s. A national survey carried out in 2021 found that there were only around 2,100 territories left across the country.

Given this context we are pleased that Fen Drayton Lakes continues to provide a home for several Turtle Doves which have returned and are singing this year. The best places to see them are around Holywell or Far Fen where a scan of the treetops and listening out for the gentle call could help you find them. There have been up to six males in recent years, but it is very hard to tell if they have bred as they become tricky to see during the summer months. However, late last summer we were overjoyed to see young birds following their parents around, learning to feed for themselves.

As part of our reserve management to help the doves, we ensure there are thick hedges for the birds to nest in which are left undisturbed during the breeding season. They also need somewhere to feed such as wildflower-rich field margins that provide a profusion of seed. We supplement this with additional seed to give them a helping hand. The

final requirement is somewhere to drink and the margins of the lakes provide lots of opportunities to auench their thirst.

As well as efforts on reserves, the RSPB also runs a partnership project called Operation Turtle Dove, with the aim to reverse the decline by assisting farmers and landowners with advice and support. The project is raising awareness of the plight of this lovely species so that generations of people in the future will be inspired by the special wildlife that chooses the UK as home.
