#### **Parish Council Report**

#### Report Of Fenstanton Annual Assembly Of The Parish Meeting Held 22nd April 2008

The Chairman opened the 113th Assembly of the Parish Assembly by welcoming those in attendance and expressed the Council's thanks to the following Parishioners for their contribution to the Village during the past year:-Mr. Sydney Barnett, although not a Councillor, for his regular attendance and contribution to Parish Council Meetings; Mrs. Daphne Loveday, for ensuring the Christmas lights were suitably displayed on the Clock Tower over the festive period; Mrs. Donna Butcher, for tending the flower bed at the base of the Village sign at her own expense; Mr. Garth Turner, for his sterling efforts in keeping the Village litter free; Mr. Nigel Tilbury, for producing and maintaining the informative Village web site; Mr. David Pulley, for his woodworking skills in reproducing authentic replacement doors for the Clock Tower; Mr Deryck Burton, as Chairman of the P3 Committee and his associated work in ensuring the Parish footpaths are kept in a good and walkable condition.

The Chairman then reported on various matters brought before the Parish Council in the last 12 months.

#### A14

The Parish Council has confirmed its commitment to continue as a member of the A14 Joint Parishes Forum. Representatives from the Highways Agency and Atkins attended the March meeting of the Parish Council and gave a full and constructive report of current progress.

#### Northstowe Rights of Way Project.

Upgrading the Fen to Bridleway status is planned, although progress has been slowed following difficulties in contacting some the landowners.

#### **Gypsy & Traveller Sites.**

The Parish Council took part in a consultation hosted by the County Council.

#### **Police**

Disappointment was expressed that the Police no longer attend Council Meetings to provide information. All reports are now received electronically and indications are that reported crime has reduced during the year.

#### Planning.

Members of the Parish Council met with Senior Planning Officers of the District Council and, amongst other matters, expressed the Parish Council's concerns over ability of the current Village infrastructure to accept any future large developments.

#### Headlands Park Play Area.

The Parish Council has agreed to completely refurbish the play area. Some of the old equipment will be removed and replaced with 6 new pieces with both rubber safety surfaces and grass tiles. Work is expected to start at the end of May and be completed in time for the School summer Holidays.

#### Subway - Hilton Road.

Following a meeting with representatives of the Parish Council and the County Council Highways Department it is expected improvements to the general condition of the structure and the lights repaired in the near future. However, the flooding problem will not be resolved until the agencies concerned have reached agreement on overall responsibility.

#### Dog Fouling.

The attitude of inconsiderate dog owners appears to have become more prolific over recent months. Dog owners are requested to ensure they clear up after their pets.

#### General Discussion.

The matter of the closure and change of use of the lay bys on the A14 was raised which led to further discussion concerning the situation of HGV parking.

#### Responsible Financial Officers Report.

Draft copies of the Annual Accounts were available, although it was reported that the Parish Council had remained within the set budget during the Financial Year 2007 / 2008.

#### Next Meeting.

The next meeting of Fenstanton Parish Council will be held on Thursday 12th June 7:30pm at Fenstanton and Hilton Primary School, School Lane, Fenstanton. All members of the press and public are welcome.

#### Hilton


Following the elections on 1 May 08, five councillors were elected and two more were co-opted onto the Parish Council.

#### **Fenstanton WI**

The resolutions to be put forward by the W.I. were discussed at our Resolution Evening on Thursday May 1st. The first resolution asks H.M. Government to urge the E.U. to ban bottom trawling. This method can use nets as wide as a Rugby pitch and are weighted with heavy metal rollers. Everything in its path is destroyed including sponges, corals and other nontarget species. We voted unanimously to support this Resolution. The second resolution was about the inappropriate imprisonment of the severely mentally ill. While all of our members agreed that mentally ill prisoners should be provided with treatment and therapy in a more appropriate and secure residential environment other than prison it was felt that the wording of the Resolution was not specific enough. The resolution emphasised the adverse effect on families of the imprisonment of people with severe mental health problems. We felt the emphasis should have been on the individuals themselves. In view of this the majority abstained from voting with a proviso that the delegate should be informed why we voted this way.

After refreshments we had two quizzes set by our President Claire Barrett. These provided us with much fun and laughter. Strangely we did better on the questions about 1918 (when our W.I. was formed) than we did on questions taken from the children's version of Master-Mind.

Thank you to all those who supported our Fashion Show in which we raised over £300. It was an excellent evening and every one of our models did a superb job. Rhona Bailey thanked especially Jane Blunt who not only organised our models but was helping everywhere with serving wine, selling raffle tickets and even washing up at the end.

#### Fenstanton and Hilton Parish Churches, changes in store...

There are changes afoot in our two parish churches. This month in *Fenstanton* sees the completion of a new toilet and storage area at the back of church in what has been the Vicar's vestry. From the middle of June, or thereabouts, we will have a toilet in church for the first time. Designed and installed to the highest and latest standards, fully disabled person-friendly, this will be of benefit to all who come into church, particularly children, people travelling some distance for weddings or funerals, and those attending other functions in church. Please note that we shall be having an opening ceremony on **Sunday July 6<sup>th</sup> after the 9.30 a.m. service**, and everyone is invited to this, particularly those who have helped raise considerable sums of money for this.

In *Hilton* after some considerable discussion, the new pattern of Sunday services starts this month. The major change is the discontinuation of a mid-morning service on Sundays each week. Instead we will have a *single*, *focused monthly Family Worship* service on the  $4^{th}$  Sunday in the month (this month on  $22^{nd}$  *June*), which will have a mixture of old and new in a somewhat more relaxed style of worship. Suitable for all ages. All welcome.

To confirm arrangements for children's work in our two churches. The existing *Sunday Club in Hilton* on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday in the month (8<sup>th</sup> June) will continue in the Methodist Schoolroom, starting at 10.55am, finishing at 12noon, coinciding with the continuing *united Ecumenical Service*, alternating between the Methodist Church and the Parish Church. One benefit for this new arrangement of services is for families to come and worship at Fenstanton on the other Sundays in the month, 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> (1<sup>st</sup> & 15<sup>th</sup>) where a separate *Sunday Club* is held for young people up to junior school age.

The early morning communion services on 1<sup>st</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> Sundays (1<sup>st</sup> & 15<sup>th</sup>) in Hilton will remain unchanged.

Even song will continue to be held in Hilton on the  $4^{th}$  Sunday in the month  $(22^{nd} June)$ , for the summer months only.

Last, but not least, the *Hilton Church Fete and Flower Festival* will be held on the last Saturday and Sunday,  $28^{th}$  &  $29^{th}$  *June*. For this reason, we will be holding an early morning communion service on the Sunday.

#### **Fen Drayton Lakes**

There is still time to enter our photography competition, Fens through a Lens, which closes on 27 June 2008. Photographs must be taken on a fenland nature reserve, including RSPB Fen Drayton Lakes and Mare Fen, Swavesey. Even if you aren't a winner, your photo may be selected for an exhibition. Contractors are creating wetland features in the areas between Ferry Lagoon and the River Great Ouse. The area between Ferry Pond and Ferry Mere is being lowered, to enable the reed fringes there to expand and become a reedbed in time. The soil that comes out will be pushed into the lake edges, to create shallow areas, attractive to wading birds and spawning fish.

Shallow scrapes will be created in the grassland to the east of Ferry Mere – these areas will stay damp until early summer, enabling wading birds and their chicks to probe for food in the soft ground.

Easterly winds in Spring push some uncommon migrants across the North Sea, to the delight of birdwatchers in the UK. The fine weather at the start of May brought several migrating birds to Fen Drayton Lakes. Black terns, little gulls, Temminck's stints, whimbrels and wood sandpipers were recorded on several days. The terns and gulls nest in north-eastern Europe and into Russia, while the others were probably heading for northern Scandinavia, (some whimbrels nest in the far north of Scotland).

The warm weather also brought out the first damselflies and dragonflies, and boosted the number and variety of butterflies. High-flying insects attracted their predators – as many as five hobbies could regularly be seen together, often sharing the bonanza with the black terns, and the common terns that have taken up summer residence.

Rafts have been anchored in Drayton and Ferry Lagoons, to provide nesting sites for the common terns. The rafts have gravel on them, which the terns like to nest on, as their eggs are coloured and patterned like gravel, making it difficult for their predators to find eggs. These lagoons don't have suitable islands for the terns, and the advantage of rafts is that they will not be swamped if (or should that be when?) we get floods during the nesting season.

Guided Busway contractors are likely to be working on the nature reserve during the next few weeks, replacing the culverts that carry drains under the old railway route. This work precedes laying the busway track, and is likely to mean that motor vehicle access to Drayton Lagoon will be closed at times. Pedestrians and horse-riders will have access, although path diversions may be necessary. Please look out for notices on the site.

Please contact Neil (details below) if you would like a copy of the events leaflet or trail guide leaflet, which shows all the paths and lake names. They are available from a leaflet dispenser in the Elney Lake car park (closest to Fen Drayton village), and the Swavesey Newsagents in Market Street too.

We have two mid-week guided walks this month, and these will begin from the small car park on the south-east corner of Elney Lake, closest to Fen Drayton village, sign-posted for disabled visitors. There is also an evening event, when we hope for fine weather to bring out moths and bats. Booking is essential for this event.

#### **Hilton Cricket Club**

Following last month's gloomy report, a brief presentation was made to the Annual Parish Meeting concerning the present state of the Green and the consequences for recreational activities - cricket in particular - if visitors are again allowed free access to park their cars on the grass a relatively short distance from the playing area. A councillor replied on behalf of the Parish Council, refusing to make any commitment either to continue to prevent access by vehicles or to give financial protection to the Cricket Club in the event of claims arising from vehicle damage. He also alleged that the Council already finances the Cricket Club, but was sadly wide of the mark. If at any time cricket ceases at Hilton, the Parish Council will find that the Cricket Club currently spares the Council an annual expenditure of well over £650. Just as the meeting ended, with the absence of cricket on the Green seeming inevitable, the cavalry rode over the hill to rescue the situation, at least for now. Mr Brian Ward, himself a parish councillor, saw the possibility that the financial protection might be provided by the Town Charity instead. And so it proved - Brian and his fellow Trustees have since kindly agreed that the Charity would fund the insurance "excesses" in the event that third party damage claims had to be met as a result of the re-opening of the section of the Green to vehicles. This applies to the present season only and relieves the Cricket Club of the unacceptable risk incurred by the Parish Council's action. Both the Cricket Club and the Parish Council have reason to thank the Trustees and their Clerk for understanding the situation and providing relief at such short notice.

It would be nice to report that the team rallied to this news by producing some astonishing successes on the field. No such luck this month. We find ourselves in the

real world of Hunts League Division 4, where they do things like practising, reading Wisden and wearing boots with a complete set of studs. Rather than dwell on depressing statistics, let's just note some highlights from the first three matches.

Match 1 - Castor & Ailsworth II (A): Main highlight was Mark's winning the toss. Tuddy scored 22 and Frazer, who went in at the fall of the  $2^{nd}$  wicket, survived manfully to be seventh out and was applauded off the field by our opponents.
