

## Report of Fenstanton Annual Assembly of the Parish Meeting, 20th April 2010

The Chairman opened the 115th Assembly of the Parish Assembly by welcoming those in attendance and expressed the Council's thanks to the following Parishioners for their contribution to the Village during the past year:

- Mr. Garth Turner, for his diligence in keeping the Village litter free.
- Mr. Deryck Burton, as Chairman of the P3 Committee.
- Mrs. Donna Butcher, for tending the flower bed at the base of the Village sign at her own expense.
- Mr. Martin Haywood for undertaking the general Village maintenance.
- Mr. Sydney Barnett, although not a Councillor, for his regular attendance and contribution to P C Meetings.
- Mr. Nigel Tilbury, for producing and maintaining the informative Village web site.

The Chairman thanked the Councillors for their commitment and those who undertake additional responsibilities of representing the Parish with other organisations.

Review of the year: The Chairman opened by stating the Parish Council had not been confronted

with any major issues but many minor ones

Boundary Changes, changes to the Parish boundaries became effective from 1st April. As a result and also following a review by the District Council the number of Parish Councillors will be reduced by 2 from May 2011.

**Police:** Whilst the Village has seen incidents of vandalism they have been at a relatively low level. There has been an increase in the number of burglaries reported and with current level of Police participation within the Village the best advice that can be offered to parishioners is to remain vigilant.

**Guided Busway:** Although services have not commenced the upgrading of Fen Lane has been an improvement although it is still susceptible to flooding.

**A14**: It is the Parish Council's intention to speak at the Public Inquiry. It supports the proposed route but has identified deficiencies in the amount of sound-proofing included in the planning. These issues will be raised at the Public Inquiry.

**Bus services**: Despite the Parish Council's best efforts Stagecoach have continued to reduce their services without any consultation with the Parish Council.

Village parking: This continues to be a Village wide problem. The Parish Council attempted to find a solution but was defeated by the high costs involved and the lack of funding from the County or District Councils. The Parish Council is currently considering methods to prevent further erosion of Chapel Green by vehicles and the restoration of the verge in Chequer Street

Speeding and traffic calming: this continues to be a problem in the Village. In some instances the speed limit is not be being exceeded but the speed inappropriate for the infrastructure of the Village . The mini roundabouts on the High Street received criticism as vehicles do not always slow or give way. The Parish Council had the traffic calming measures reviewed by the County Council. The findinas concluded that the measures met the criteria required and that no changes could be implemented.

**Subway – Hilton Road**: The Highways Agency and the County Council continue to discuss ownership and responsibility and fail to agree. The Parish Council will continue to keep this matter before those responsible.

**Dog Fouling**: It is an observation that the Village dog population has increased and with it the percentage of irresponsible owners.

Responsible Financial Officers Report: It was reported that the Parish Council had remained within and in some instances under budget during the Financial Year 2009 / 2010. Because of the careful approach adopted it was expected to see a modest surplus, which will support the general reserve. The Parish Council approved a 2% increase to the precept. This is in line with expected inflation.

General Discussion: It had been observed that election material distributed by the various political parties contained false statements of activities by claiming the credit for the Parish Council's achievements. It was hoped that in future all candidates would adopt a more honest approach to the electorate and seek election on their own merit.

The Responsible Financial Officer had advised the meeting that the 2% increase to the precept had been approved but the Council Tax statement issued by the District Council showed a 5.9% increase. The assembly was advised that the figure of 5.9% is incorrect and the District Council have been advised of their error.

The next Parish Council meeting will be held on 10th June at Fenstanton & Hilton Primary School, School Lane, Fenstanton at 7:30pm.

#### **HILTON VILLAGE ACTION on TRAFFIC**

Following the recent consultation, the County Council has decided to adopt the Countywide Advisory Freight Map without further change. It has decided next to undertake a review of the environmental weight limit policy and the development of a Lorry Management Strategy.

The Officers noted residents' views about the B1040, its unsuitability as a lorry route and requests that night time ban should be extended to 24 hours. County Cllr lan Bates spoke in support of the removal of the B1040 (shown on the map as a "local access route") because of the continued cost of repairing the damage caused by heavy commercial vehicles and in view of the environmental impact to the dwellings along its route, proposing also that the weight restriction ban should be extended to 24 hours.

The County Council stated there would be further opportunities to review the map as a result of the proposed review of the environmental weight limit policy. It will also review it in the light of significant future changes to the road hierarchy and the effects of large scale developments such as Northstowe.

#### **NEWS FROM THE VILLAGE CHURCHES**

View from the United Reformed Church

June 20<sup>th</sup> 2010 is Fathers' Day. Along with Mothering Sunday, this day can be family day of celebration, acknowledging the love and care that our parents have shown us. For those with relatives who live nearby, they are a good opportunity for family members to get together and enjoy each other's company. God is faithful and true; God keeps promises and is always there for us, always watching over us. God is loving and kind, full of compassion and understanding and wants the best for his children. God also gives us guidance and direction; in the Scriptures we are taught how to live in order to enjoy peace with ourselves, with God and with each other. #### Fundraising Update for Hilton Church Roof Appeal

Good news ... the quotations for the restoration of the south aisle roof have come in quite a bit lower than we had originally anticipated. We are now expecting to pay a total of £105,800 for the work to be completed. English Heritage have reduced their grant to £58,000 , in line with the reduced costs, but our contribution is also lower which means we only have to find £47,800 instead of the £58,000 we originally thought. To date we have raised just over £24,000 and we can reclaim the VAT on the total cost of the work (estimated £14,000) which leaves us with just under £10,000 still to raise. Hurrah! The work is planned to start in the middle of May and we can make use of interest-free loans whilst we continue to fundraise.

We have had a terrific response so far with lots of people taking part in our church-organised activities (envelope collection, fetes, roving supper, wine tasting, pudding party etc) as well as running their own events to help boost the appeal. Thanks to everyone who has helped so far with particular thanks to Jane & Richard Garnett, Vine McGill, Monarch Farm, the Fleming family and Fields View Kennels & Cattery for their individual fundraising efforts.

Our next big activity will be a second - and final - door-to-door envelope collection in June. People gave generously to our first collection so we won't be offended if you don't want to contribute again —but anything you can spare will take us closer to our final target **For more information, please contact Rachel Wood on 830866**.

#### Befriending – your chance to make a difference

Did you know that **one in four** of us will, at some point, experience mental health problems? It's a surprising statistic, and one which highlights how little we know about mental illness. It is an issue that is largely pushed aside, but the reality is **anyone** can have a mental health problem, be it depression, an anxiety disorder or a psychotic illness, mental health is everybody's issue.

**Cam-mind** is a charity that offers support to people experiencing mental illness, through local projects and services, they help mental health service users in their recovery, and encourage them to return to an active life within the community.

#### But you don't need to be a health professional to make a difference.

Cam-mind's one-to-one Befriending Scheme is an opportunity for you to offer support and friendship to people who are among the most isolated in our community.

The volunteer scheme allows you to spend a couple of hours a week with your befriendee. You might meet up for a cup of tea, do a bit of shopping, or even attend an exercise class - things that some people may find difficult to do on their own.

<u>Marly's Story</u> Fifteen years ago, Marly was a busy working mum. But following a period of severe mental illness, she was forced to leave her job and her marriage collapsed. Following several long periods in hospital, Marly became increasingly isolated. She found it difficult to leave her home or talk to her family. She was then put in touch with Cam-mind's Befriending Scheme.

"When I was referred to Cam-mind, I was at a very low point" says Marly, "I was feeling very isolated, hardly getting out at all, and I was really going down hill."

Marly was matched up with a volunteer befriender. They now meet every Tuesday.

"We couldn't have been matched any better," says Marly. "Since we started meeting up, Tuesday has become my get-up-and-go day. My befriender comes in like a breath of fresh air, and we go out and do all sorts of things together."

Marly's new-found confidence has made a positive impact on other areas of her life. "When I see my neighbour or talk to one of my relatives, I feel I've got a bit of a conversation now. I say, 'I've been out with my befriender today' and they'll say, 'Oh yes and what did you do?' and I'll say, 'Well what didn't we do,' whereas before, Tuesdays were just another day."



#### **HILTON WI**

Hilton WI's important task at the May meeting was to consider the single resolution to be debated at the National WI AGM which 'urges HM Government to introduce clear and mandatory country of origin labelling on all meat, poultry and fish products sold in this country'. We heard arguments for and against the resolution, but the overriding concern amongst members was that under EU legislation the "country of origin" means that, for example, a pork pie can be labelled as British if it was made into a pie in Britain, even if the pork it contains comes from pigs born, reared and slaughtered elsewhere. Such unclear and misleading information on packaging denies consumers the chance to make an informed choice when purchasing goods and we voted unanimously in favour of the resolution. This vote will be registered by our delegate at the National AGM in June, ensuring our voice is heard.

Our social calendar is busy as always: the outing to Woburn is on 15th July; Celia announced the trip to Thursford on Sunday 21st November will be £33 per head and another WI wants to do the Hilton Walk in June so volunteers were sought to do teas.

Our speaker this month was from Magpas, the emergency medical charity for Cambridgeshire, Bedfordshire and Peterborough. We heard that Magpas operate two lifesaving schemes: the Emergency Medical Team and the Community First Responder Scheme. The first is made up of highly trained doctors and paramedics who are able to save lives at the scenes of road traffic accidents and other serious incidents across the region, flying on the East Anglian Air Ambulance and Cambridge Police Community First Responders are non-medical volunteers who save lives in their local town or village. There are currently 33 such groups across Cambridgeshire. Fully trained by Magpas and provided with the vital equipment they need, we heard how Community First Responders make a difference to patients suffering all sorts of emergencies by giving assistance in those vital first minutes before the paramedics arrive. Our nearest group is in Hemingford and we felt extremely fortunate to hear from first hand that this charity is doing such sterling work for the area in which we live.

## Free support in Cambourne for Carers, and Adults or Parents with a Disability



Speaking Up are an independent advocacy organisation, based around Cambridgeshire and offer free advocacy services to help you with understanding your rights or helping you to make informed decisions. Advocacy is supporting people to speak up about the things they want. As an independent organisation Speaking Up can work with people to put their views forward without the constraints often imposed by statutory organisations such as Social Services. Advocates do not tell their clients what to do, they work with people to explore options/possibilities and support them in the choices they make.

#### Carers Advocacy



It is thought that 1 in 10 people in Cambridgeshire are unpaid carers. Many people don't even realise that they are carers; it's just something that they do in their daily lives. Looking after elderly relatives or friends who need help can be extremely rewarding, but many unpaid carers do not realise that they also have rights and can access a support network themselves.

"There is a need for carers' advocacy as I often feel alone and isolated as a carer and unable to get my feelings and thoughts across to others". (Carer in Cambridge)

Speaking Up can talk with you about your rights, to show you how to access support services in your caring role or talk through decisions that may affect the level of support you or the person you care for receive. The service is independent, confidential and completely free.

#### **Community Advocacy**



Speaking Up's Community Advocates support people with learning, physical or sensory disabilities to have their say and get their views heard.

They can provide support with issues such as housing, care, health and complaints as well as general queries on your rights and support options.

#### **Family Advocacy**

#### FEN DRAYTON LAKES

Last month, the cold spring had delayed nesting for many birds, and a month later, it is cold again. We had a warm spell, which encouraged some birds to start laying eggs, but the latest cold snap has put others on hold. The first ducklings and goslings appeared on Easter weekend (how did they know?), and the first lapwing chicks hatched before the end of April. As I write this, two mute swans are sitting on nests on islands at either end of Moore Lake (the lake closest to Fenstanton). One swan is sharing "her" island with a nesting greylag goose, and oystercatchers and lapwings are sitting on nests on other islands. We have seen more wheatears at Fen Drayton Lakes this spring. These migrants rest here, typically for two or three days, before continuing their northward journey to the British uplands, or even to Greenland. Perhaps they decided they would be better off spending time with us when it was so cold, brought to us on northerly winds. Cuckoos arrived from the second half of April, so if you haven't heard one yet, you should try to get to the Lakes soon. They will stop singing soon, and the adults will be heading off to Africa from the end of June, leaving their eggs and chicks in the care of reed warblers, dunnocks, robins and wrens.

11th Workshop for beginners, called "How to watch wildlife" – please book

13th Chasing dragons, from the Holywell Lake car park at 2pm.

**17th** A walk to link with the national Green Transport Week. This is scheduled to start at the Busway stop at the Lakes and end at the Swavesey stop. (planned when we thought the service would be operating from last November, to encourage people to travel on public transport. This walk would be free to anyone who arrived by guided bus!). It now looks as if we'll make this a circular route from the car park.
