### FENSTANTON PARISH COUNCIL - MAY 12th 2011

The meeting was the Annual General Meeting of the Parish Council. Cllr. C. White was elected as Chairman and Cllr. S. Lee as Vice Chairman for the ensuing year. The meeting also elected members to the Standing Committees and representatives to the outside organisations that the Parish Council is affiliated to.

**Police report**.: The most recent information available is for the month of March which indicated the following reported incidents:3 incidents of anti social behaviour; 1 incident of violent crime; 1 other unspecified crime.

The meeting was advised that thefts of hanging baskets and solar lights from gardens have occurred in the area, although there are no reports of such thefts within the Parish. The meeting was also advised of a telephone scam to obtain bank details etc. from the recipient by claiming they are eligible for a reduction in their household rates.

The Parish Council urges Parishioners to be vigilant and report any suspicious behaviour to the Police. Telephone 0345 456 456 4, Crimestoppers can be contacted on 0800 55 51 11 or in an emergency 999.

**Next Meeting**. The next meeting of Fenstanton Parish Council will be held on **Thursday 9th June** at 7:30pm at Fenstanton and Hilton Primary School, School Lane, Fenstanton. Members of the press and public are welcome.

# Hilton & Fenstanton Community Speed-watch Report, January - March 2011

A small but dedicated Speed-watch team regularly use a police-issued speed detection device in Hilton primarily along Potton Road - to display the speed to passing traffic. The registration number of any vehicle exceeding the speed limit is reported to the police, who then write 'advisement' letters to the registered owners. Persistent speeders or those caught in excess of 45mph receive the letter by hand of the Police who verbally and strongly re-enforce the advice offered in the letter.

The Police do not have the resources to regularly monitor traffic speed. The

team of volunteers undertake this activity to help improve safety by reducing speed through our villages. The results are given to the Traffic Control Agencies who then mount enforcement sessions at identified hot-spots. After eighteen months the combined Police + Volunteer effort is producing encouraging results. The Potton Road/Church End intersection recorded speeds of 56mph and now there is a regular Camera Van Session when speeders will automatically be prosecuted.

### Report of the 116th Fenstanton Annual Parish Assembly – 26th April

The Chairman presented a review of the Parish Council's activities during the past year. Some of the matters covered were:

**The A14 – Public Enquiry**. The meeting was advised that following the decision not to upgrade the A14 the Public Enquiry was subsequently cancelled.

**Cemetery Lighting**. The Parish Council approved that lighting be installed in the Cemetery. Work is expected to commence in the near future.

**Clock Tower refurbishment**. A full survey of the Clock Tower has been undertaken. Whilst the Clock Tower is structurally sound some repairs are required to bring it back to its original condition.

**Winter gritting**. Following an approach from the Parish Council the County Council is considering gritting Hilton road.

**Hampton Close open space**. The Parish Council have agreed to adopt the Hampton Close open space.

Parish Council Action Plan. The action plan has proved successful with a number of actions being completed and more are in the process of being concluded.

**The Chairman** thanked the following for their contribution to the Parish:

Mr. D. Burton, for his contribution to the Parish Paths Partnership.

Mrs. D. Butcher, for maintaining the flower bed at the Village sign, at her own expense.

Mr. N. Tilbury, for preparing and maintaining the informative village web site.

Mr. G. Turner, for his diligence in keeping the Village litter free.

Mr. M Haywood, for undertaking the general maintenance and repairs in the Village.

The Responsible Financial Officer reported that during Financial Year 2010/2011 no large scale projects had been undertaken, although a new bench had been purchased for Chapel green as the original had been deemed to be beyond economic repair. The Church yard gate posts had also been replaced. The Parish Council had remained within and, in some instances, under budget during the year. Because of the careful approach, a modest surplus is expected which will support the general reserve. Mindful of the overall financial situation, the Parish Council had approved a 3% increase to the precept, this being 1% lower than the expected rate of inflation.

Following on from my success in the May 2011 Local Government elections, I should like to take this opportunity to express my sincere thanks for the fantastic support shown to me by the residents of Fenstanton, who voted for me to be their representative on Huntingdonshire District Council.

I am extremely honoured and look forward to being of service to you all in the future.

# Shutting the door on bogus prize draws: advice from Trading Standards

Many of us receive junk mail through the post, with the vast majority going straight in the recycling bin. However for some it can be tempting to try your luck on a 'prize draw' letter that comes through the letterbox.

The cost of this temptation can be seen in figures released from the Office of Fair Trading which shows that last year, 1 in 25 people lost money to a scam, be it bogus prize draws, foreign lotteries, miracle health cures or money transfer scams. Seven per cent of those lost £4000 or more and those are only the ones that were reported.

The organisers of these scams are smart – the letters look professional, they are often personalised so they have your name throughout (sometimes appearing to be handwritten), and there is often a short deadline to respond so that you don't have time to think.

By replying to just one of these letters, your information will be shared by other scammers who will then write to you, inundating you with letters.

The message from Trading Standards is simple: if it looks too good to be true it probably is and if it asks for money upfront, even in the form of an admin charge for processing your winnings, it is almost certainly a scam.

If you are in any doubt or think you may have responded to a scam, speak to friends, family or Consumer Direct for advice. Consumer Direct provides advice on behalf of Trading Standards and can be contacted on 0845 4040506.

Most of the scams we come across have affected older residents, many of whom experience loneliness. If you are over 60 and could do with having someone visit you for a chat on a regular basis, or perhaps you know someone who would benefit from this, then Age UK (Age Concern and Help the Aged combined) may be able to help you. They offer a voluntary visiting scheme for residents across the County, and you can ring to find out more on 0845 5213481.

You can register with the Mailing Preference Service which is free. It won't cut out all scams but it should significantly reduce the amount of marketing mail you receive. Their phone number is 0845 7034599, you can register online at <a href="https://www.mpsonline.org.uk">www.mpsonline.org.uk</a> or you can write to Mailing Preference Service, Freepost 29 LON20771, London, W1E 0ZT.

If you are tempted by prize draws because you are struggling financially, speak to your local Citizens Advice Bureau. They can provide you with free, confidential and impartial advice and check you are receiving all the financial benefits and allowances that are available to you. 





### WILD LIFE TRUSTS—HUNTINGDONSHIRE LOCAL GROUP

### **Meadow Butterflies**

The Wildlife Trust, Huntingdonshire Local Group, invites you to a walk in Upwood Meadows on **Sunday 26<sup>th</sup> June**. The emphasis of this walk will be to identify and enjoy the meadow butterflies that are drawn by the rich variety of wild flowers that exist in this traditionally managed meadow.

The Warden of Upwood Meadow, Kevin Doidge, who is also a prominent local group committee member, will lead the walk. Kevin will guide us through this ancient meadow, which has been in existence since the 1400s and has been undisturbed by modern farming methods.

Kevin reveals that this is 'one of the finest examples of ancient meadow that can still be found locally and was shaped by 15<sup>th</sup> century agricultural methods of ploughing with oxen'. We hope to see species such as gatekeeper, meadow brown, red admiral, comma, painted lady and small tortoiseshell.

### **FEN DRAYTON LAKES**

discovery zone in late April. Other volunteers have completed a dipping platform nearby, ready for school groups and our summer events programme.

On 30th May we begin an exciting couple of weeks of history at Willingham Mere, working with archaeologists from Cambridge University who are excavating a new site. We expect to find plant and animal remains – beaver and pelican bones have been found in nearby excavations, as well as bones from animals that we are familiar with now. Quite a few local people are joining the archaeologists for a few days, digging and/or cleaning and identifying. There may still be places available – call us on 01954 233260 to find out.

There'll be daily tours for almost everyone (the site isn't pushchair or wheelchair friendly), at 11am and 2pm. The afternoon tours will be followed by wildlife walks on June 1st, 3rd, 4th, 5th, 8th and 10th. All of these tours are free. There is a limited amount of parking in a lay-bye on the busy Shelfords Road, between Willingham and Earith. Cyclists and walkers are recommended to follow West Fen Road and bridleway for about 2.5 miles from Willingham.

Christopher Evans, from Cambridge Archaeology Unit, will be giving a free talk about the environmental history of Willingham Mere on **Thursday 2nd June** in Willingham Baptist Church, starting at 7.30pm. The last digging day at Willingham Mere is Friday 10<sup>th</sup>, and we go from there to the Fen Drayton Open Gardens weekend on 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> June.

June is a great month to be outside and enjoying wildlife. We can expect to see lots of butterflies, damsel and dragonflies on warm days, while bats will be hunting on warm, calm evenings. Regardless of the weather, there'll be lots of wild flowers and lots of baby birds. Baby birds make lots of strange noises as they beg for food, working on the theory that the harder they shout, the more likely they are to be given something!

If you find a well-feathered baby bird, the best thing you can do is leave it alone. The parents will know exactly where it is, but they'll stay away while people are around. If you think the young bird is in danger, perhaps from a cat or a dog, or it is on the road, then move it to somewhere safer, but not far, so the parents will still be able to hear it and then find it and give it some more food. If the baby bird isn't well feathered, then it has probably fallen from a nest, which must be close by. It sounds simple, but find the nest and pop the chick back in.
