

It is with regret the Mustard Seed Relief Missions have suspended this years collection of the shoe boxes, due to the devastating humanitarian crisis across Eastern Europe. Moldova has taken tremendous amount of refugees, as it is only 30 miles from Ukraine's city of Odesa.

# Parish of Fen Drayton with Fenstanton News and Services for June 2022

#### The Rector writes:

Hello, how are you doing?

Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM) update.

I am pleased to say we had two nominations for churchwardens, for the benefice and Philip Blunt and Ian Hucklesby were duly elected for the coming year. We had the same number of nominations for PCC members as there were vacancies, so all were elected. Margaret Blount will serve for one year; Simon Hunt, Paul Housego, Keith Page and Julia Mitchell will serve for three years. The APCM gives us an opportunity to thank everyone who plays a part in the life of the churches, from the day to day running, to the special events and fund-raising events. I would like to say a big thank you to YOU if you have helped or supported us in any way, it is much appreciated.



You will see from service calendar that there are two services on 5 June, at the Parish Church Fenstanton, celebrating the Queen's Platinum Jubilee.

The morning, family style, service will be around the theme of party hats and crowns as we think about Pentecost the birthday of the church as well as the Queen's Platinum Jubilee.

The Queen frequently refers to her Christian faith. She has led an extraordinary life. The Queen's story of her calling to be the next monarch is well documented, but I wonder what your response would have been, if you were in her position? What if your ordinary life suddenly became extraordinary? For the Queen, her life is what she usually does, it is her ordinary and our extraordinary. If she was to live in your house for a month, that would be her extraordinary in our ordinary. It is all relative. The Queen had a head start for ordinary or extraordinary as she has said, and still does, that her Christian faith has sustained her. The first disciples, however, had yet to find out what that meant. What was it to be like, to be a disciple, a follower of Christ? And yet there are similarities, for them, for the Queen and for us.

#### The Queen is quoted as saying:

For me the teachings of Christ and my own personal accountability before God provide a framework in which I try to lead my life.

The disciples learned as they followed Jesus, hearing parables, having personal tuition from the Master himself, seeing for themselves what to do, what to say and how to live a Christ centred life. We, including the Queen, have the benefit of the centuries of others who have gone before, as well as reading for ourselves in the Bible, the Word of God. Do we have that personal accountability that the Queen expressed? Do we have an understanding of the framework she mentions that enables her to lead a Christ centred life? Something to reflect on maybe, as we celebrate on 5 June, which is also Pentecost, the birthday of the church. God bless, from Rev Rosie.



#### Even More Ghost stories from John Deeks: The half human phantom seen in Home Close (The present-day football field):

"Some say it is part animal and part man". The spectre that haunts this field is also known to Mrs Chilerly. In the spring of 1922, a stranger was asking the situation of this field, so that he could visit the witch's mound. There is no doubt that this legend of a monster has been around for a very long time.

#### The dog phantom that haunts this quiet village streets:

"This dog is much more interesting to meet and can be seen again and again by the same persons without foretelling their approaching end or any calamity that is about to happen. This is a dog ghost that cannot rest in his grave until a wrong is righted.

A dog did once worry the sheep on the common. Adjoining the common a curly sheep dog lived with his master in one of the houses, got wrongfully accused of the deed and was put to death in a cruel way. Slowly tormented and beaten by the owner of the sheep with the leg bone of one of the dead sheep, untill the poor innocent beast died. His old master declaring from first to last that his dog was innocent, saying "he never did it", well answered the sheep's owner, "he won't do it again".

Each day the old man misses his dog and soon neighbours start to see the old man turn round and stand still, looking behind and about the street, they heard him say "I thought it was you Curley, following me". As the days go on, he stops often and turns to look; always saying "I thought it was you Curley, following me". Others in fun look for Curley and laugh at the old man. The tale lived long after the old man and it is called a ghost story and some people living today declare the dog is still seen at the place that the sheep were worried and passing up and down the street".

The following story is by a present day village resident, who swears that it is true. I have changed his name to save any embarrassment!

#### The Ghost of Church Lane:

Shortly after his marriage in 1964, Fred (not his real name) was lying in bed in his cottage in Church Lane when, unable to sleep but with his wife fast asleep beside him, he witnessed an apparition. The bedroom door was open with a view of the landing and the stairs leading down. Suddenly he saw a light reflecting on the landing wall which became brighter by the second. Suddenly a hand held candle holder together with a lit candle came round the corner followed by the image of an old lady dressed all in white. The lady walked slowly into the bedroom. Not wanting to wake his wife in case she took fright and with the hairs on the back of his head standing up, he never made a noise. Slowly she disappeared from view.

A few days later his wife said that a large box they were using as a wardrobe looked more like an ottoman (a large box to store bedding) so they turned it on its side and indeed it was an ottoman. So they placed it at the foot of the bed where it looked very nice.

Sometime soon after, Fred was away for a few days and when he returned home he saw that the ottoman was in the front garden. Puzzled he asked his wife why that was; she replied that she would not have it in the house as at night an old lady dressed in white comes into the bedroom and goes to sleep on it with her arms folded as if in a coffin.

Shortly after, Fred's mother visited and asked why such a nice piece of furniture was in the garden, they told her that it was not wanted. She replied that she would like to have it so it was loaded into the van and taken to her house in Chequer Street. It was installed in her bedroom.

A few days later Fred received a message from his mother that he should go and remove the ottoman. On arrival he asked why, to be told that she could not have it in the bedroom as at night an old lady dressed in white was laid out on it

The cottage had recently been purchased from an elderly lady. Apparently her mother had died in Fred's cottage in 1937; it was probably her apparition that was visiting what was undoubtedly her favourite piece of furniture. john.deeks@ntlworld.com

# HILTON ART CLUB

Our all-day mixed media workshop with tutor Jane Fellows was brilliant. Jane took us through the process of creating a mixed media sea/landscape using pastels, acrylic inks and gesso, using a reference photo.

She first demonstrated how to apply gesso, using a pallet knife to add texture where it was needed and then showed us how to mix and brush on the inks. The next stage was the sky, when she suggested which pastels for each area and showed us how to smudge and blend the sky and clouds. The sea was also created using pastels and Jane demonstrated how to give a sense of movement to it. Pastels were used next to bring out the light on the foreground and tops of the rocks. The picture was completed using oil pastel to add flowers and shavings of pastel at the tops of the flowers.

Jane gave individual help where it was needed during the day, as we grappled with some new techniques. Plenty of tea and coffee and slices of cake were needed over the day and many people used the good weather to sit outside eating their lunches! Thanks go to all those that brought cakes, which were very much appreciated! Also, to Andrea for the milk and Kathy M for dealing with the money side and bringing the paper.

# Report from the Meeting of the Council dated Monday 16<sup>th</sup> May Councillors

Hilton Parish Council had an uncontested election as there were nine candidates for nine seats. This means that there are no vacancies on the Council and the Councillors are Cllr Peter Balicki, Cllr Jon Capes, Cllr Heather Chambers, Cllr Rob Dulstone, Cllr Kieron Dunk, Cllr Ett McCarthy, Cllr Nina Sage, Cllr Claire Sarkies and Cllr Sarah Suckling. #### **Annual Meeting**

As this was the Annual Meeting of Hilton Parish Council, the Council has reviewed and adopted all of its policies and procedures, including the standing orders and financial regulations.

#### Chair and Vice-Chair

Cllr Peter Balicki was re-elected as Chairman and Cllr Ett McCarthy was elected as Vice-Chairman.

#### Councillor Induction

An induction meeting was held for all new Councillors and the Council has approved the Councillor Induction Protocol.



#### Women's Institute Commemorative Jubilee Tree

The Council granted permission for this tree to be planted in the Wilderness near the ditch between the Wilderness and the Green. The recommendation from the Tree Warden was for either a Wild Service Tree or a Bird Cherry Tree, but this is to be confirmed.



#### LHI Bid 2022/23

Hilton Parish Council's bid to the Local Highway Improvement (LHI) Fund for a reduction in the speed limit on the Green from 40mph to 30mph has been successful. The Council resolved that it has the funding for its contribution to this scheme and reaffirmed its support.

#### LHI Bid 2023/24

The Council considered how to carry out the community engagement portion of the next LHI bid and formed a working group to present a recommendation to the Council.



#### Jubilee Copse Commemorative Plaque

Hilton Parish Council decided that this plaque will be installed at the beginning of the Community Garden event on Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> June at 2pm, as this is the first event in the Jubilee celebrations.

#### Data Protection Fee

The Council resolved to renew the data protection fee with the Information Commissioners Office at a cost of £40.

#### Hilton Wildlife and Conservation Group (HWCG)

HWCG has offered to donate £500 to the Council to reinstall the bench near the bridge to the Wilderness on the Green. Hilton Parish Council has accepted the request from HWCG that this bench is made from recycled plastic.



#### **Pond Dredging**

Work is continuing on the application for a grant to fund the dredging of the ponds. The CCC Programme Manager has recommended that the Council also apply to have a silt trap dug in the small pond on Graveley Way. This is a 2m deep sump near the inlet of the pond which will trap the silt and prevent it from entering the watercourse. Hilton Parish Council has accepted the changes to this application and the responsibility to empty the silt trap, subject to the costings for emptying the silt trap. The CCC Legal Team is currently drawing up the funding agreement which will be presented to the Parish Council for approval.

#### Community Flood Kit

As the Parish Council has a flood plan, it has the opportunity to apply for a community flood kit from Cambridgeshire County Council. Hilton Parish Council delegated the decision regarding what items to apply for to their Emergency Officer, who will inventory the emergency box to ensure there is no duplication.

# Weather Watch by Patrick Landucci

The 3 winter months closed without any period of easterly winds, no snow and generally only slight frosts. Overall, the winter was milder than average with February being the fifth warmest since records began. Every day in February the temperature reached 7C (45.2F) or more with 20 days exceeding 10C (50F) with 14 days above 11C (52F). It was no surprise therefore that Spring started 2-3 weeks early. Unlike January, February was a wet and often windy month with south-westerly winds predominating. A particularly stormy period occurred between the 16th to the 21st, when 3 named storms, Dudley, Eunice and Franklin affected the UK. Gusts of up to 60 mph affected our region. This was the first time since storm naming was introduced in 2015/2016 that 3 named storms, impacted the UK in a single week.

March started with a spell of north-easterly winds as an anticyclone moved in during the first week. After a frosty start to the 8th, winds shifted to a southerly direction heralding the start of a 20 day period of day time temperatures well above the seasonal normal by 4 to 9C (7.2 to 12.6F). Nights were often cool with ground frosts and the diurnal range on 3 days exceeded 17C (30F). In times gone by when a much larger proportion of the population was employed on the land, warm spells such as this years one was known as a "Fools Spring", meaning that winter could still reappear and sure enough a blast of strong northerly winds direct from the Arctic arrived as March was ending resulting in a short lived covering of snow on the 31st and 1st of April, with several frosty nights.

In fact April had more air frosts (4) than in February and March combined. By the 10th however, the wind had changed to a generally southerly direction with a marked increase in temperature which peaked over the long Easter bank holiday weekend. On Good Friday, a temperature of 22C (71F) was recorded at St James Park, London and on the 16th, 23.2C (74F) was also recorded in London. Although mention of global warming is never far from our thoughts long before this was being talked of the record temperature for April was 29.4C (85F) which occurred on 16 April 1949 at Camden Square, London. Simultaneously, new record high temperatures were being recorded in the Arctic and Antarctica. April was another dry month with less than 10mm (0.36") recorded. 7 of the last 10 Aprils have been drier than average. It perhaps begs the question what is now average? Records show that over time wet and dry periods tend to balance out and historically February, March and April are often the months with the least rainfall.

#### Concluding as usual with some item of interest:

1. Record breaking rainfall and flooding in eastern Australia. During late February and early March 2022, a slow-moving area of thunderstorms brought the wettest 7-day period on record to Brisbane, Queensland with a total of 795 mm, beating the previous record by 133.6 mm. In Doom Doom NSW, a total of 1040 (44") of rain fell in just 48 hours, whilst in Sydney following an exceptionally wet summer, by 8 March 2022 the city had endured the wettest start to a calendar year in records dating back to the late 1850s with 821.6 mm (32").

- Extreme snow in Japan Following the third warmest autumn widely in Japan, the winter brought extreme snowfall episodes to large parts of Honshu and Hokkaido in the north of the country. Since the end of November 2021 through to late February 2022 these produced totals over 400cm (160") in the snowiest locations.
- 3. Extreme heat in India Heatwave conditions during March/April 2022 brought temperatures of 40C (104F), the hottest recorded in over 100 years across large areas of central India.
- 4. Record breaking heat in South America. On 14 January 2022, the Argentinian capital, Buenos Aires recorded 41.5C (107F), its second hottest day in a record going back to 1906. The extreme heat spread north from Patagonia, affecting large parts of Uruguay, Paraguay and s Southern Brazil.


