#### Parish Council Report

#### FENSTANTON,

Held 8th February 2007

#### Police Report.

During the period 10th January 2007 to 2nd February 2007 the following incidents had been reported to the Police:-1 dwelling burglary. 1 non dwelling burglary.1 non payment of petrol. Cambridgeshire Guided Busway.

Mr Menzies, Head of Delivery – Cambridgeshire Guided Busway, attended the meeting and gave a comprehensive report on progress to date. Clearance work to remove vegetation had started between Longstanton and Milton Road, Cambridge and site offices established at Longstanton. Work between Longstanton and St Ives was not expected to commence until the end of the year. Members of the Council expressed concern over a number of issues; the effect the Guided Busway would have on the traditional bus service, the possibility of providing feeder services from communities without direct access to the Busway, flooding and security. Mr Menzies advised the meeting that the bus companies currently operating through Fenstanton had given assurances that they would continue to serve Fenstanton but with a reduced service and that consideration is being given to providing feeder services to the Park and Ride sites. A flood risk assessment is being undertaken and the results will be presented to the Environment Agency. The Guided Busway team are conscious of the security issues and, although at this time undecided, a system will be incorporated to prevent motor vehicles from driving along the Busway with CCTV coverage at the junctions.

Mr Menzies agreed to keep the Parish Council fully informed of all developments and would be pleased to attend another meeting later in the year.

#### A14

The Public Meeting on 25th January, which was organised by the Parish Council, received a very high turnout and the feedback has been beneficial in allowing the Parish Council to formulate a comprehensive response to the Highways Agency and other interested parties. The meeting overwhelmingly favoured the adoption of the Brown Route which the Parish Council have recommended to the Highways Agency. However, whilst being pro active the Parish Council is restricted in the action it can take by a legal framework within which it must operate. The feeling of the meeting was that an Action

Committee should be formed. The Parish Council have been instrumental in getting members of the community together and following a meeting held on Wednesday 7th February an Action Group was formed.

The Public Consultation period does not end until 9th March and the Parish Council would urge all Parishioners to continue writing to the following expressing your opposition to Blue Route Variation 2:

#### Parish Boundary Changes.

The response from Parishioners affected by the District Council's proposed boundary changes has been most encouraging with 100% support, from those who have replied, to remain within the Parish of Fenstanton.

Taking these views into consideration the decision was taken by the Parish Council to recommend to the District Council that, following consultation with the Parishioners affected, the Parish boundaries remain unchanged.

The consultation period has now been extended until Friday 30th March 2007.

#### **Parish Council Report**

HILTON

**A14 Consultation** The Council had finalised its response to the Highways Agency Consultation and the letter was expected be despatched in mid February. The Council had also urged residents to make their views on the route known to the Agency before the closure date of 9 March 2007. The A14 Action Group had recently hosted a meeting of other local communities to discuss the environmental impact of the road and how best to make their concerns known. The meeting was attended by 14 other communities and it was agreed to send a joint letter of concern to the Highways Agency and other agencies and authorities detailing the common environmental impacts and urging the need to provide realistic solutions.

**Planning Matters** The Council recommended that an application for an extension at 3 Tithe Close be approved.

**Parking on the Green**. The erection of raised verges and posts along Wraggs Row had had some success in reducing the damage caused by vehicles parking on the Green. The Council agreed to continue to monitor the situation over the coming months.

**Crime** The Council noted that the incidence of minor vandalism appeared to have risen over recent months with the most recent incident being the damage caused by joy riding on the Green. Whilst a number of incidents had not been reported to the Police, damage to fencing in Kidmans Close and further damage to the telephone box had been reported. The Council agreed to ask the Community Beat officer to be more vigilant to the situation

Closure of Pre School. The Council noted with regret that the pre-school had decided to close after 33 years in operation. The Council thanked the Pre School for its contribution to the Hilton community over these years.

**Ditches.** Recent heavy rain had raised concerns that the local drainage ditches may need some attention. Work to clear vegetation from the ditch at the back of the cricket pavilion had recently been completed as part of annual maintenance. The Council agreed to inspect the remaining ditches and to address any problems found.

**Street Lighting.** The Council had recently had a large number of calls to report broken street lights. The Council urged residents to report outages directly to Cambridgeshire County Council using the telephone number and lamp post number on the post.

We were delighted to welcome some new members at our first meeting of the year on Thursday 1st February. # Fenstanton A14 Action Group

Background: The latest plans from the Highways Agency for upgrading the A14 from Fen Drayton to Ellington now include an alternative route (known as Blue Variation 2) to widen the existing A14 through Fenstanton to six lanes, versus the original preferred option which bypasses the village to the south.

The Highways Agency has offered this alternative route within two of the six scheme options in its Consultation Document calling these options Blue Variation 2 and Blue Variation 1 + 2.

The Action Group was formed following a well-attended Public Meeting called by Fenstanton Parish Council to consider these proposals. The Meeting strongly rejected any option which included Blue Route Variation 2 on local environmental grounds. The Action Group was formed to co-ordinate and pursue the rejection of this option during the Highways Agency's Consultation Process.

### Purpose of the Fenstanton A14 Action Group:

- To ensure all Fenstanton residents are aware of the implications of the proposed A14 widening through Fenstanton
- To assemble the arguments against the option of Blue Route Variation 2 which will be formally submitted as part of the Highways Agency's Consultation Process
- To urge and assist all Fenstanton residents to reply to the Consultation, rejecting any option which includes Blue Route Variation 2, by the 9th March deadline.
