# Closing date for entries is Friday 16<sup>th</sup> April.



### FENSTANTON PARISH COUNCIL—JANUARY/FEBRUARY 2010

#### January 14th

The meeting held a minutes silence and paid its respects to the late Cllr. Hooper.

**Police report.** During the period 11th November 2009 to 12th January 2010 the following incidents had been reported to the Police:-

2 theft, 1 threatening behaviour, 4 incidents of criminal damage.

The Parish Council urges Parishioners to be vigilant and report any suspicious behaviour to the Police. Telephone 0345 456 456 4, Crimestoppers can be contacted on 0800 55 51 11 or in an emergency 999.

**High Street traffic.** Members of the Parish Council and the Parish's County Councillor held a site meeting with representatives from the County Council Highways Department to review the speed calming measures and improve safety at the High Street / Headlands and High Street / Chequer Street mini roundabouts. Following a full survey it was concluded that the existing signage met the legal requirements and the location of bus stops and drop kerbs prevented any changes being made to the road layout. As a result of the findings, the only advice that can be offered is that all road users must exercise care and vigilance at these roundabouts.

Water run off from the new A14. The Parish Council is concerned that surface water from the A14 will eventually, after initially being collected in lagoons, drain into Hall Green Brook, increasing the risk of flooding in the Village. The Parish Council's representative on the Huntingdonshire Flood Forum has raised these concerns with the Environment Agency and the Parish's Council's behalf.

**NHS – Cambridgeshire. Hearing services.**— which spends £750m every year buying healthcare on behalf of 613,256 residents of the County — wants to ensure that all Direct Access Audiology (hearing aid) services are safe, effective and respond to all residents needs. They also wants to make sure that the standard and quality of Direct Access Audiology services are the same for everyone. They also constantly reviews it's contracts and is now focusing on improving and simplifying the way they organize their Audiology providers.

A consultation is being undertaken between 4th January and 29th March. Copies of the consultation document are available from the Clerk.

### 11th February

**Police report**. During the period 13th January 2010 to 10th February 2010 the following incidents had been reported to the Police: 2 burglaries, 1 attempted burglary, 1 arson, 1 incident of obtaining petrol without paying.

Incidents of children placing road signs in the road and wheelie bins in front of and behind parked cars in Pitfield Close were also reported to the Police.

A Police representative will attend the April Parish Council meeting.

**Dog fouling.** It is the contention of the Parish Council that the dog population in the Village has increased considerably and the number of owners allowing their dogs to foul footpaths has increased proportionately. Whilst this is a Village wide problem the areas that, currently, appear to be worst affected are the green area by the Headlands shops and the Pit track. It is an offence to allow a dog to foul a footpath without cleaning up. The District Council's Dog warden and the Police are aware of the situation and should any owner be seen they will be reported and action taken.

**A14 – Public inquiry**. A Public Inquiry is to be held into the proposed route of the new A14. The Parish Council has written to the Highways Agency expressing its support for the route but stressing and defining the areas where additional sound reducing measures must be included. The Parish Council will consider its course of action in respect to the Public Inquiry at the next meeting.

**Kerbside glass collections.** The District Council has advised the Parish Council that kerbside glass collections are expected to commence from the end of March. Further information will be made available as it is received.

**Next Meeting**. The next meeting of Fenstanton Parish Council will be held on Thursday 11th March 2010 at 7:30pm at Fenstanton and Hilton Primary School, School Lane, Fenstanton. Members of the press and public are welcome.

### **Hilton Action on Traffic Group (HAT**

Sadly, Cambridgeshire County Council's Cabinet has decided not to allocate any of its 2010/11 funds to a "medium sized" traffic management / safety scheme in Potton Road. They have decided instead to prioritise schemes elsewhere in the County. Therefore, villagers can expect that speeding through Hilton to continue. Please continue to take great care when walking, cycling or driving through the village, especially at those very dangerous junctions with Church End and Graveley Way.

Graveley Way is on the Huntingdon Traffic Management Area short list of applications for 2010/11 jointly funded "minor" improvement schemes. A Graveley Way scheme would implement speed restrictions and pedestrian improvements. Initial site inspections have been carried out to assess the feasibility of a scheme.

We anticipate that Highways will

consult the Parish when they have prepared a specific design proposal. It is not yet possible to guarantee the project will go ahead. Where applicable the scheme will be subject to Safety Audit and will be dependent on the County Council funding its share of the cost. The Parish Council has approved the required contribution from parish funds.

St Ives Speedwatch, augmented by volunteers from Hilton, has continued to monitor speeding vehicles on Potton Road, some racing through the village at speeds well over 50 mph. A number of drivers have been reported to the Police, and as a result we may expect further Police enforcement checks.

### HILTON PARISH COUNCIL—FEBRUARY 2010

The Parish Council are pleased to introduce Andrew Lewis as our new Tree Warden. Andrew works at Wimpole Estate as a Gardener. Prior to that he was a part time Head Gardener at a private estate in Cambridgeshire. He is qualified to HND level in Amenity Horticulture and has studied for a City and Guilds Phase 2 in Arboriculture as well as attending numerous other courses. We welcome his input into our parish and look forward to working with him. Andrew can be contacted via the Parish Clerk.

Following resignations from two Councillors, the Parish Council are now free to recruit to the vacancies. If you are interested, please submit in writing to the Clerk, giving a brief summary of yourself. We hope to recruit at our March meeting.

Over recent months Hilton has suffered a spate of burglaries. The Police advice to stay safe is to make extra time to secure your property and make sure no valuable items can be seen or easily found. If you are going away, ask a neighbour to keep an eye on your property and consider using lighting on a timer. Also remember if people come to your door asking for work or trying to sell you products, ask for identification and do not let them in. If you feel their identification is not legitimate, close the door and call the police on 0345 456 4564. Elderly residents seem to be the victims of distraction burglaries, so if your neighbour is elderly please look out for them and give them this advice.

We have just been informed by Highways Department that the Secretary of State for Transport and the Secretary of State for Communities and Local Government have decided to hold a Public Inquiry to consider objections to the draft orders for the proposed new A14 route. The Parish Council will continue to work in conjunction with the A14 Action Group and keep the parish informed of the process involved as soon as we know.

Our next meeting is Monday 1st March at 7.30 pm in the Village Hall. Anyone is welcome to attend and parishioners are allowed to speak during the open session only. The Agendas for these meetings are posted on the 3 notice boards and on the village website 5 days before each meeting.

Psalm 19 opens with the phrase, The heavens are telling the glory of God, set for morning prayer today as I write, and gloriously set to music by Joseph Haydn in his oratorio The Creation. In this psalm, whilst creation has neither speech nor language, its voices are heard everywhere. God is the God who is in and yet transcends all that we see and all that we have.

Yet this is not the whole reality of our existence. St Paul writes in his letters to the newly formed churches that our battle is not with what can be seen, but with what cannot be seen, powers and principalities as he calls them. These are the forces of evil, real and present, that are in our world; evil spirits, the fallen angels, were ejected from heaven following war in heaven, as it says in the Bible's last book, Revelation.

What does this mean for us? For some of my time, I lecture in engineering design at Anglia Ruskin University in Cambridge. I do get a thrill from understanding how things are made, and how they could be made better. Yet I am also aware in a certain sense that these things are temporary, transient, and ephemeral. Whilst God provides blessing, evil can trip us up, and can have an unseen power and influence on our lives. Whilst the heavens and nature may point to the truth, our only lasting respite is in the Creator of all that there is, seen in and through His Son, Jesus Christ.



### **FENSTANTON WI**

We had a brilliant start to our year at our meeting on Thursday February 4<sup>th</sup>. We were absorbed by Angela Potter's talk with slides as she took us step by step on her journey with her friend Ann Robinson from 'Let's do our own garden at Chelsea' to its culmination The theme for the garden, Ratty's Refuge' was born when the Parish Council in Hilton set about helping the endangered water vole by encouraging people to have ponds in their gardens with hedges for easy access.

The garden was mainly planted with shades of green in different textures together with blue and yellow which are good colours for a damp area. The decking and galvanised grid were permeable to prevent flooding and the pond with a grassy bank for the water vole's burrow completed the picture.

Getting accepted by Chelsea was a great achievement as there were nine applications for each small plot. Then the hard work continued and the ups and downs began. The headache of getting sponsors was helped when the government gave orders that the water vole should become a protected species.

There were many phone calls to both home and abroad in search of some of their plants as well as driving all over the country to find exactly what they needed for their garden. One item was an iron chain fence and quick growing ivy to cover it which Angela pointed out would be virtually vandal proof. It soon became clear they needed more help so two others joined the team. Just as everything seemed to be falling into place and the great day was almost upon them more problems arose. Three pollarded willows that they had had much difficulty in finding started to die off so had to be replaced with hazels. The firm making the decking went into liquidation so they had to find another that could make one in a hurry. With only days to go Angela fell and broke her ankle so to her immense frustration was in hospital when the garden was being constructed. Students from Capel Manor where Angela and Ann trained came to help and it was all completed in time for the judges who awarded them a bronze medal.

Angela was able to be in the garden albeit in a wheelchair when the Royal Family visited. The Duke of Edinburgh remarked "I hope you've got a flashing red light for the end of your foot!" Celebrities such as Martin Clunes, Anneka Rice and Susan Hampshire visited the garden. Many such as Alan Titchmarsh signed her plaster cast. Because it was the only wildlife garden in the show Chris Beardshaw was televised giving a talk about the water vole and Joe Swift was there to talk about moisture-loving plants.

All the gardens have to be dismantled but one of her sponsers 'Rivers and Rowing' who hold the copyright to Kenneth Graham's 'Wind in the Willows' asked Angela to create a wildlife garden by its newly opened museum. This had carved wooden figures of Ratty, Toad, Mole and Badger. Alan Titchmarsh said he was very impressed with the planting and to complete her pride she joined Alan on a Radio Garden phone-in.

Daphne Loveday gave the vote of thanks.



### Herbie's Hints/Tips

After the very cold weather we've had, though we've been luckier than many, don't rush out and remove anything that looks dead . Rule of thumb is that if evergreen foliage dries, and stays on the plant, it is likely to be dead. If the foliage falls off it may well regrow. In deciduous varieties if foliage does not regrow from old wood don't despair as there is a chance that the shrub may still be alive......so sit back, and wait and see.

### **FEN DRAYTON LAKES**

A year ago, students in Year Seven at Swavesey Village College began working on an art project for us. We have wooden panels at some of the viewpoints around Elney Lake, and we wanted to make them a bit more interesting.

The students were asked to create art work that would stand up to our weather throughout the year – frosts, flooding, and direct sun. Their solution was a set of ceramic tiles, each one depicting some of the local wildlife.

We are very pleased with the work, and have installed the first few on the screen at the south-east corner of Elney Lake, close to Fen Drayton village. More tiles will be installed at various points over the next few months. Do look out for them when you go for a walk. March is changeover month for wildlife. The flocks of wildfowl that have been with us over the winter will be leaving, to return to their distant breeding areas of northern Europe and Russia. Plants will be coming back to life – look out for catkins on willows and hazels, which provide nectar for the new season's first bumble bees. By the end of March, the first of the summer birds will be back here. Chiffchaffs will return from the Mediterranean regions, while sand martins will have been south of the Sahara Desert.

Our new events programme begins in April, and leaflets will be available from us at the Lakes, and at Ron's Farm Shop from the middle of March. (Thanks Ron!)

We have two guided walks in March. The first begins at 10.30am on the 11<sup>th</sup>, when we'll be concentrating on ducks. The second, on 21<sup>st</sup>, begins at 1.30pm and will be searching for signs of spring – early flowers, leaves opening, birds singing. Charges are £4 per person (£2 RSPB members, £1 children). There is no need to book for either of these walks, which start at the car park next to Holywell Lake.
