

Digital Television Switchover – When, what, how?

On 30th March, the BBC 2 analogue channel will be switched off followed by the remaining analogue channels on 13th April. If you aren't set up to receive digital, you won't be able to watch your television.

How will it affect me?

If you have Sky TV, Freesat from Sky, Freesat or Virgin Media you don't need to do anything (but note, additional TVs in the house may be affected). If you have Freeview, BT Vision or Top Up TV you will need to re-tune your television 5 times in 2011. Guidance on re-tuning can be found on Digital UK's website (below). Alternatively you can pay a trader to re-tune it each time.

If you currently have five channels or fewer, you have three options:

1: Get a digital box. If you get a good analogue picture through your aerial now, you could purchase a Freeview set top box. Other options are satellite services 'Freesat from Sky' or 'Freesat'. Once purchased, these do not have a monthly fee. For even more channels, consider a monthly subscription service from Sky, BT Vision or Top Up TV. Your existing TV should work fine with any of these, provided it has an aerial or Scart socket. Only Freeview requires an aerial, and in most cases, if your current analogue picture is OK, your aerial should work fine with Freeview. If you do need a new aerial, contact the Registered Digital Installers Licensing Body on 01353 644040 or visit www.rdi-lb.tv for a list of registered installers.

2: Buy a new Freeview recorder with twin tuners. This will receive digital television, acting as a digital box, and is also a recorder, allowing you to watch one channel while recording another. After the switchover, if you don't have a digital recorder, you will only be able to record the channel you are watching.

3: Buy a new television that has a built in digital tuner.



FENSTANTON PARISH COUNCIL FEBRUARY 2011

Police report. The information has now been removed from the Cambridgeshire Police website following the introduction of the new site launched by the Home Office.

The Parish Council urges Parishioners to be vigilant and report any suspicious behaviour to the Police. Telephone 0345 456 456 4, Crimestoppers can be contacted on 0800 55 51 11 or in an emergency 999.

Hampton Close Open Space / Football Pitch The Parish Council resolved to adopt the Open Space / Football Pitch. Whilst the District Council confirms the area is now at an adoptable standard, the Parish Council still have concerns regarding the quality of the sub soil. In view of these concerns a condition of the adoption is that the Parish Council reserves the right to return the area to the District Council.

Low Road Speed Limit The meeting felt there is justification in extending the 30mph speed limit past the bends, although there is a question of legality in extending the speed limit, and reducing the limit to 50mph on the Low Road to the Huntingdon Road 'T' junction. It was resolved to request the County Council undertake a feasibility study to determine the possibility of implementing the Parish Council's recommendations.

The Big Society & the Localism Bill The purpose of the discussion was to ensure Members of the Council are aware of the implications of the Big Society and the legislation contained within the Localism Bill. Although many aspects are still unclear it is expected that further information will be received to clarify and answer the many outstanding questions.

Dog Fouling The Parish Council have received more complaints about owners allowing their dogs to foul on the footpaths. The Parish Council expects all dog owners to act in a responsible manner. Whilst it is appreciated that the majority of owners are responsible those owners allowing their dogs to foul are reminded that it is an offence subject to a £1000 fine. Dog waste bags are available, free of charge, from the District Council offices in St Ives. Owners are also reminded that it is an offence to allow dogs to run free in the Village and should be kept under control at all times.

<u>Anonymous Correspondence</u> It is not the policy of the Parish Council to take action through anonymous correspondence. However, the Chairman has received an anonymous letter from 'Concerned Residents of Fenstanton'. The letter contains a number of erroneous statements, should the writer care to contact the Chairman or Clerk, by letter or telephone disclosing their identity, they will be advised of the facts.

Damage to Village Greens and Play Areas Damage has been caused to the Headlands Park and Chapel Green by the irresponsible actions of motorists driving over the areas and making ruts. As a Village we are fortunate to have a number of attractive and well cared for greens and parks. It is not acceptable that the Parish should have to pay to repair the damage caused by such inconsiderate action and would therefore suggest that those concerned make good the damage caused.

Whilst the Parish Council is aware of the parking situation, parishioners are requested not to park on verges or some of the small grassed areas in the village.

A note from the new Priest-in-charge of St Mary Magdalene, Hilton

Firstly, I should like to say a very big thank you to all who came to my licensing service at the end of January, and especially to those who helped it all go so well – preparing delicious food, moving furniture, and other chores - and those who came to bring their kind messages of welcome. It was a lovely service, and I feel very much as if I have been invited to become part of the life of this beautiful village.

I have been Priest-in-charge of the parish church in Godmanchester since 2006, and am now also responsible for Hilton, having taken over from the Revd Robin McKenzie. CAMBRIDGE UNIVERSITY BOTANICAL GARDENS

A host of golden daffodils

Carpets of spring-flowering bulbs are an exhilarating sight and this year at the Botanic Garden, we hope to see for the first time the results of a year-long project to encircle the original 1846 Garden with a spectacular show of spring bulbs.

The move of the Botanic Garden from a small city centre site to its current 40 acre site was achieved through the energies of John Stevens Henslow, Professor of both Botany and Geology, teacher and mentor of Charles Darwin. Despite Henslow's best efforts, the University sanctioned the planting up of only the western half of the site, which opened to the public in 1846. A winding peripheral path encloses a great variety of plantings and is flanked by an excellent tree collection, laid out in family groupings. This established tree cover provides the perfect light woodland conditions for our beautiful new spring bulb belt

The first phase of the project was completed in March last year when Friends of Cambridge University Botanic Garden helped plant 5000 in-the-green snowdrops. Large-flowered *Galanthus elwesii* and *Galanthus* 'S Arnott' were planted in drifts, giving way to the simple, single-flowered *Galanthus nivalis* under the Hazel and Birch collections, now festooned with catkins. These combine beautifully with bright yellow winter aconites (*Eranthis hyemalis*) and pastel-coloured early *Crocus*.

To follow on, we have planted a spectacular show of wild daffodils, scattered and dug in last autumn in their tens of thousands. First the fresh spring grass is studded with the delicate and diminutive *Narcissus pseudonarcissus lobularis*, stars of creamy, twisted petals backing yellow trumpets. These delightful wild daffodils are followed by the old-fashioned Pheasant Eyes (*Narcissus poeticus recurvus*), a late-flowering daffodil with a small bright orange cup surrounded by reflexed, white petals. Planted *en masse*, the fresh scent will fill the air.

To mix up the colour palette, we are also establishing a large patch of inky-blue *Camassia* to complement the *Magnolia* collection, purple-chequered Snakeshead Fritillary and a trial patch of the wild yellow tulip, *Tulipa sylvestris* close to the Stream Garden. Together, these should make a show-stopping and long-lasting spring bulb display. This enchanting project was made possible through generous gifts to the Garden's Giving in Memory Fund. Do visit this spring, and let the bulb belt brighten your day!

The Botanic Garden is open 10am – 5pm in March. Admission is £4 (£3.50) or join the Friends & help the Garden grow! To join the one-hour highlights tour led by an expert Garden Guide that leaves Brookside Gate at 11am on the first Saturday of every month, telephone 01223 336265 to book a place (£7, £3 for Friends). We had almost a full house at our first meeting of the year on February 3rd. It was delightful to welcome four new members.

We were very pleased to hear from Steve Dartford, Clerk to Fenstanton Parish Council that the W.I. Oak Tree is to be inspected by a tree surgeon. Subject to finding the tree healthy it will be pruned.

We had a very interesting talk with slides on Birds in Winter by Mr Trevor Gunton. He worked for the R.S.P.B. for 30 years and now works as a volunteer at Paxton Pits Nature Reserve. He stressed the need to feed birds in the winter as 78% of birds in East Anglia rely on food from our gardens. Planting shrubs such as Holly and Pyracantha that produce lots of berries is also beneficial to birds. Despite all the Starlings, Blackbirds, Robins etc. that we see, their numbers have dropped dramatically in the last five years. A lot of Green Finches died because of a throat disease but numbers are now recovering. It is important to clean feeders and to pour

boiling water over bird tables to stop diseases spreading.

We were surprised to hear how many different species now come to suburbia. For instance there are large numbers of Wax Wings in the car park near Staples in Huntingdon and at Tesco car park in St. Neots.

I think we surprised Trevor with our knowledge of birds. He showed us a slide and asked what we thought it was. Margaret correctly said it was the footprints of a Moorhen. It was the first correct answer he had had during his many talks. Daphne Loveday gave the vote of thanks.
