

FENSTANTON PARISH COUNCIL - FEBRUARY

<u>Police report</u>.: The most recent information available is for the month of December, during which the following crimes and incidents were reported: 6 incidents of anti social behaviour; 1 incident of public disorder; 1 incident of drugs.

The Parish Council urges Parishioners to be vigilant and report any suspicious behaviour to the Police. Telephone 0345 456 456 4 or 101, Crimestoppers can be contacted on 0800 55 51 11 or in an emergency 999.

Chief Inspector Chris Mead has been appointed as the new Local Area Policing Commander for Huntingdonshire. A representative of the Parish Council attended a meeting where the new Policing strategy and restructuring was presented to the communities within the district.

Litter bins: The District Council has agreed, following requests and discussions with the Parish Council, to install a new litter bin at the car park by the Hampton Close open space and also at Cranesbrook by the entrance at Headlands. This will, hopefully, be an incentive for those dog owners who do not clear up after their pets to do so. A new top and liner will placed on an existing base at the lay by in the High Street and a new bin will be installed at the subway. It is expected that the bins will be in place before the end of this financial year.

<u>Clock tower refurbishment</u>: The Parish Council resolved to undertake a full refurbishment of the Clock Tower following the recommendation of the General Purposes Committee. A contractor has been appointed and it is expected that work will commence late spring / early summer. Funding for the refurbishment will come from a bequest left by the late Miss Bertha Pitfield to the Parish Council for the continued maintenance of the Clock Tower.

Village street lighting: The County Council has entered into PFI agreement to upgrade the old street lighting columns; the street lighting budget has been reduced as with other areas of expenditure. As a result 10% of the old street lighting will not be replaced, although Parish & Town Councils will have the opportunity to adopt these street lights and be responsible for both maintenance and energy costs. The Parish Council will consider the merits of this at a later time once further information is obtained. However, we are advised that the impact on the street will not be great as the new white light source is more efficient. It is unknown when any replacement is likely be undertaken in the Village and the replacement programme is based on the condition of the existing stock.

<u>Next Meeting</u>: The next meeting of Fenstanton Parish Council will be held on **Thursday 8th March at 7:30pm** at Fenstanton & Hilton Primary School, School Lane, Fenstanton.

HILTON PARISH COUNCIL— FEBRUARY

<u>Village Shop Closure</u> – the Parish Council have agreed to sponsor a working group to study the available options and to assess the views of residents. An initial meeting will be chaired by the Parish Council but in the interests of the village this group will be served by an independent group working with the PC and other public bodies. Anyone interested in joining this group should contact the Parish Clerk.

<u>Cambs County Council Bid for Crossing on Potton Road</u> – The Parish Council is waiting to hear whether we have been successful in our bid for funding for a crossing on Potton Road. Thank you to everyone who responded to our survey. Results showed an overwhelming approval for a crossing, with the majority vote being for a zebra crossing and only 16 households against any form of crossing.

<u>Winter Footpath Gritting</u> – thanks goes to our volunteers who have been out in the freezing temperatures gritting our footpaths. The County Council send out a timescale in which gritting must take place and our volunteers jump into action following an approved route.

<u>A14</u> – the Parish Council are seeking volunteers who may interested in assisting the with any new Government proposals for a revised A14. Please contact the Clerk if you can help.

Our next meeting **is Monday 5th March at 7.30pm** in the Village Hall. Anyone is welcome to attend and parishioners are allowed to speak during the open session only. The Agendas for Parish Council meetings are posted on the 3 notice boards and on the village website 5 days before each meeting.

Hilton Village Hall: Improvements Update

A lot of work is currently going on in the Village Hall and residents might appreciate this short update on what is happening. We are all fortunate that the hall currently enjoys a very healthy level of bookings and this keeps this essential amenity financially sound.

It falls to the committee therefore to ensure that the hall offers good value to its users and meets the latest health and safety regulations so that it will continue to be viable into the future. To achieve these goals the committee has an on-going programme of improvements which we will undertake as funding allows.

- The first phase of this programme entailed the replacement of all the curtains in the hall.
- The second phase has been to refurbish the kitchen and this was completed in early February. The kitchen, whilst generally serviceable, was beginning to deteriorate and in one major area failed to meet Health & Safety. The refurbishment has been successfully undertaken by a local firm, Richard Laborne Ltd, and included new flooring, new sinks, new worktops and a repositioned cooker. In addition, some new cupboards have been fitted alongside the existing ones which were as good as new and have been retained to save costs.
- The next phase will be to refurbish the very jaded ladies toilets. Work started in early February and is expected to be finished by the end of the month.

The Village Hall committee is very grateful to the late Olive Stokes for her very generous bequest and also to the Town Trust for its grant of £2000, which together have helped us undertake this work. A further update on progress with the ladies toilets will be given in future issue of Spectrum. Julian Thomas

LOCAL WEATHER WATCH

My first article ended at the start of November. Little did I imagine that the remarkable weather year of 2011 still had further surprises to come.

With winds frequently blowing from a southerly direction throughout November, continuing the pattern which had prevailed through September and October as high pressure over the near Continent dominated our weather, both November and the Autumn were the second warmest on record since 1659. Not a single air frost was recorded throughout the three Autumn months. Apart from a very wet day on the 4th of November, only 6mm (0.25 of an inch) of rain fell during the rest of the month, continuing the pattern of rainfall deficiency.

As the end of November approached, Atlantic depressions finally brought more unsettled conditions, which heralded a change to winds from a westerly guarter throughout December with temperatures dropping to more seasonable levels. It was the second most "westerly" December in 139 vears after 1974. Very mild conditions returned on the 21st and continued over the Christmas period. No frost occurred during the 12 days of Christmas. It remains to be seen whether the old folklore saw "green Christmas, white Easter" materialises.

Looking back at 2011, despite the summer being the coolest since 1993, overall it was the second warmest year on record, behind only 2006, based on records going back to 1659. Apart from a very brief spell of wet snow on the 16th of December, the year was snowless. There were only 18 air

frosts in the y e a r, a remarkably low figure. This compares with 70 air frosts in 2010. The I o w e s t temperature during the year



was –3.7C (25.3F), on the 19th of March, the highest was 31C (87.8F) on the 27th of June. Not far behind, 26.7C (80F) was recorded in April and in Cambridge 29.2C (84.6F) was recorded on the 30th of September, breaking the previous UK record for that day of 27.8C set in Maidenhead, Berkshire in 1908.

A notable feature of the year was its dryness, the annual rainfall total being 17.6 inches (440mm) which is about 70% of the average. This compares with 23.7 inches in 2010.

The traditional yardstick for the onset of winter is when the maximum temperature does not exceed 5C (41F) on three consecutive days. This occurred during the last thee days of January 2012, which highlights the mildness of the winter until then. This marked the start of a two week cold spell which included two significant snowfalls as mild air from the Atlantic collided with very cold continental air. The lowest temperature during this spell so far has been -12.5C (9.5F) on the 12th of February. There are signs that less cold conditions will return shortly but with high pressure established over northern Russia the potential for further cold weather remains.

At our meeting on February 2nd, we were entertained by Mrs Cheryl Brightly whose subject, appropriately for the approach to Valentine's Day, was "Artistry in Cocoa".

Mrs Brightly had begun by making chocolate treats for her children and gradually became more and more interested in the history and uses of chocolate. During her talk she sent around pictures of Cocoa plants and their pods and samples of the beans. She explained how cocoa has been used down the centuries and that chocolate was first produced by Joseph Fry in the late 1750s.

She then went on to demonstrate how to temper chocolate to achieve a glossy texture that snaps satisfactorily. Even properly tempered chocolate can lose its sheen if not stored correctly. She then used the chocolate she had tempered to fill heart shaped moulds. Later in the demonstration these were filled with a praline filling and topped off with more chocolate. Meanwhile samples of different types of chocolate were sent round for us to compare.

Mrs Brightly has now opened a chocolate shop in Newmarket and her children are obviously set to follow in her footsteps.

We all enjoyed sampling the praline hearts over a cup of tea or coffee and were able to purchase a variety of her products.

FENSTANTON CRICKET CLUB

An Extraordinary General Meeting took place on Thursday 26th January to decide – in the face of mounting problems – if the Cricket Club was to be able to fulfil its role as such in 2012. It was reluctantly decided that the Club would close down with immediate effect after the following factors were considered.

Playing strength: 21 players represented the club in the 11 fixtures out of 16completed in 2011 (the others cancelled due to our player unavailability). 10of these players played in over half of these games and can be said to represent the core. From this core 4 players are reducing or removing their commitment for reasons including injury, illness or departure. Efforts to recruit replacement players seem to have resulted in a maximum of two additional bodies. It was therefore decided unanimously that the playing strength was insufficient and that Fenstanton CC would withdraw from Cambs Junior League Division 4A for 2012.

Pitch hire 2012: several clubs had requested the general hire-out of our pitch and facilities whatever our decision on the playing side. A discussion took place which considered several factors including the availability of ground-staff (this would be reduced), the willingness of those involved to produce wickets and maintain facilities for clubs other than Fenstanton (this was limited) and the cost, time and effort required to repair the roller and service the other equipment (this was considered to be disproportionate). In conclusion it was decided that the pitch and facilities would not be made available for hire in the foreseeable future.

Further actions for 2012: the field will be maintained as a cricket field with the pitch (but not the square) cut as appropriate. The current committee will remain in post until the AGM in the autumn to oversee the shutdown. The implications of minimum insurance required, rates, water and electricity charges in relation to the Club's current financial reserves will be considered.

There will be a gathering at the Pavilion at Easter or soon thereafter to perform an inventory on the remaining equipment and decide on its disposal.

Many thanks to those people who have worked hard against increasingly difficult odds to keep the Club going all these years. It is to be hoped that this will only be a pause (albeit a lengthy one) in the Fenstanton CC journey, not a final end.

FEN DRAYTON LAKES

For the third consecutive winter, we've had frozen lakes. The cold spell in early February resulted in some lakes freezing over completely, and others had just a small area of open water available to ducks.

At the end of quarrying, the pit that was to become Moore Lake was

landscaped, to create areas of deep and shallow water. These varying water depths provide different conditions for aquatic plants and insects, which in turn influence the way birds use the lake. The deep-water areas are the last to freeze over, and although only about 5% of the lake hadn't frozen by 12 February, around 1500 wigeon ducks, plus more of other species, were finding refuge in that small area.

Many small birds had a hard time too. Most are tough enough to cope with cold temperatures, so long as they can find enough food. However, ice and snow can prevent birds finding their food – blackbirds can't break through frozen soil to find worms, for example. Seed-eaters may find that the blanket of snow hides their food, so these birds may turn to garden feeding stations – a pair of reed buntings discovered the millet seeds that I provide in my garden for house sparrows, and became regular visitors.

March often seems to be the quietest month at Fen Drayton Lakes. The large flocks of winter-visiting ducks leave us, usually before the summer visitors begin to arrive. Don't be put off, however, as you may be able to watch the elaborate courtship displays of great crested grebes and mute swans.

March is a good time to learn some bird songs. Residents such as robins, dunnocks and wrens will be singing, and you can start to recognise these before the summer migrants arrive and bombard your ears with their different songs

If you'd like to join us on a guided walk, you'll be very welcome. We'll try to help you learn some of the bird songs as we walk. Both walks start from **the guided bus stop and at Holywell Lake car park** – with a leader at each place. Adults £4, RSPB members £2, children £1.


