#### Parish of Fen Drayton with Fenstanton News and Services for March 2022

#### The Rector writes:

Hello, how are you doing?

We were privileged to welcome Josie as a guest speaker to a service in



church recently, who told us about her recent trip to Malawi and her future plans. She is such an inspiring speaker and Malawi is close to her heart. What has encouraged you or inspired YOU recently? If you had to choose a face, which one would it be (see image left, our thanks to pixabay free images)?

As your local Parish Church, do contact us if you would like to know more about getting married, having your banns read, or arranging a christening (baptism).

Here is some information for you – anyone who lives in the parish can ask to be married in the Parish Church, have an infant christened, or ask for a Christian minister to take a funeral service. As the vicar (Rector) I often get

asked interesting questions about all of those, although probably not at the same time!

Weddings – you will have to provide some specified documents in order to get married in the parish church eg passport, but you would have to provide evidence of who you are for any venue where you marry.

The statutory fees for a marriage in a Church of England church will be according to the fees list. For 2022 this is:publication of banns £32; certificate of banns £16 (if required); marriage service in church £480.

Please note that if you marry in other venues you may have to pay other fees in addition to those mentioned. In the Church of England your marriage service includes the cost of providing a minister, although there may be other additional fees such as an organist, bells etc. This will be explained to you when you meet with the vicar to book a date. In certain circumstances a marriage licence is required but you can find out more by talking to me, Rev Rosie. I know that certain wedding venues are very canny at hiding the extra costs for a wedding and will tell people that it costs so much more to marry in church – but you can see that it doesn't; statutory fees should be the same wherever you marry.

Next month I will go into further detail about baptisms, and the following month, about funerals and the churchyard. Hopefully these snippets of information will help to dispel the myths.

Most frequently asked question about a wedding – have I ever stopped a wedding because someone made an objection. Answer......no, although I have paused the service because the groom nearly fainted, delayed the start because the bride couldn't get out of her wedding carriage (think about your dress please ladies!), or because the bride and bridesmaids transport took a wrong turning and couldn't find the church (not here but in another parish).

Just a reminder that our Sunday Club for children has restarted, which takes place on the 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Sundays of the month, term-time only. We all begin together in the church, service begins at 10am and then the children go to the Church Centre, to have their own time together re-joining us later. This is a further extract from this new book

#### The Ghosts of Hall Green Lane:

As told by Mrs J Allen to Gertrude Peet in April 1922 and edited by John Deeks in 2022

"Oh yes, I have seen them, so I can vouch for the truth of what I say. I will tell you about it so that you will know yourself".

"When I was first married I lived in the end thatched cottage (place now unknown), where Mrs Hopkins now lives. In there are good rooms, they joined close to another house that stood between the house we lived in and where Mrs Bedford now lives and there was another house behind the one, now pulled down, used as a lodging house.

I was ironing, after they had all gone to bed, walked into the back yard to the pump for water to make their drinks for the next day. I took some men in to lodge at that time, we used in those days to have lots of men come to the village in summer, some of them Irishmen, they came to work in the onion fields.

I had four lodging with me that summer, in the house there is a big bedroom at the top. Well, I went out into the back yard to fetch the water and right in front of the pump just where I wanted to go, was something standing there. Something, I did not know what you would call it, ghost or phantom. Some would say it was like a man, so I just said "I want to come to the pump for some water, if you please. Well it never offered to move. I was a bit shaken and hardly knew what to do; I knew all the others had gone to bed. Naturally my head turned towards the door into the house. I was but a second giving the glance at the house, but in that instant it disappeared.

Well I will tell you of the next time I saw it. The next evening I said to my old man, "No, you are not going to bed tonight 'till I go" and I was going to make the drinks after supper. The door stood open, my husband was in the front room for something, I looked out of the door and there stood the same ghost or whatever you like to call it. I called my husband and said, "There's that there again" and in that instant it disappeared.

Well, the next time, it was my boy who saw it. He came home from school and said "mother, "I want to go" "Well go" I said and he went running into the yard, the 'place' was in the barn. I then heard him call out "mother there's someone sitting on the seat", I went to look but there was nobody to be seen anywhere.

## An update from Fen Drayton Lakes

Here at Fen Drayton Lakes, we wholeheartedly believe that one of life's simple pleasures is to go for a walk in the countryside. Nothing else can quite beat the experience of being surrounded by tranquil scenes of water, trees, and fields taking in the sights and sounds around you. With the arrival of spring, birds are singing all around, ducks and other waterbirds are out on the lakes and migrant species are arriving back from their wintering grounds to set up a territory and, hopefully, breed.

With footpaths looping around the majority of our eleven lakes, there is always something to look at. However, we are aware that it can sometimes be difficult to get good views of some of these water bodies. As a nature reserve, our primary purpose is to provide spaces for wildlife which means that many areas are left to develop and provide nesting habitat, shelter, and protection to the inhabitants.

During the spring and summer nesting season, we minimise time spent off-track and don't go into or near the habitats unless we really need to. Birds and other wildlife are easily disturbed and can be put off from using areas where people regularly go, even to the extent of abandoning nests and eggs. This means that viewpoints in the reed or hedgerows can re-grow throughout the season, closing the views.

During the autumn and winter months we work our way around the reserve, re-cutting viewpoints through to each lake. In some areas this serves a dual purpose of not only opening views for visitors, but also improving the habitat for wildlife.

The hedgerows around our entry road, various trails and on field boundaries are some of the best habitats on site for a whole variety of breeding bird species. The bulk of the hedges are hawthorn, and they tend to be of a uniform age and size. Whilst making a good hedge, this uniformity can lead to it becoming tall and 'leggy' with lots of dense vegetation up high, but little lower down. This isn't ideal for either the health of the hedge or the nesting birds that use

it. We therefore implement a regime of rotational viewpoint cutting whereby different areas of certain hedges are coppiced each year to encourage denser regrowth at a lower level. As a result of this, the hedgerows contain a patchwork of heights, densities, and growth stages to the benefit of all.

As you walk around the lakes on your next visit, keep a look out in the hedgerows for thrushes, robins, blue tits, bullfinches, blackcaps, and many other species.

- **d.** You have lived in the parish area or within three miles of it during the whole of the 12 months before the day of your nomination and the day of election.

Notice of Election will be published on Monday, 28 March 2022. Notices will be displayed on our website and on noticeboards in the Village.

The deadline for submission of nomination forms to the Council Offices is 4pm on Tuesday, 5 April 2022. Nomination forms will be available from your Clerk.

Polling day is 7am – 10pm on Thursday, 5 May 2022.

Report from the Extraordinary Meeting of the Council dated Thursday 20th January
Outline planning application for 16 houses on Church End, west of Wychwood (20/00164/OUT)

Hilton Parish Council resolved that they will not spend £3,500-£4,500 on advice from a barrister. The cost of a full judicial review is a further £30,000-£35,000 and there was not sufficient support for this action to crowdfund this amount of money.

## Report from the Meeting of the Council dated Monday 7th February Village Sign

The refurbishment of the village sign has been completed and the sign is back in its rightful place. Photographs of the restoration process have been published on the website and Facebook. The Chairman thanked Cllr Kieron Dunk for his hard work restoring the sign.

#### The Ware

The agreed works to improve the bank of the Ware have started and Highways England has advised that these works will take up to three weeks. The Parish Council discussed the works required to cut back the excessive growth on the far bank of the Ware, which may incur some additional expenditure. This will be discussed at a future meeting. The Council asked the Clerk to write to the Riparian owners of the Ware (those properties to which the Ware forms a boundary) to advise them of the work that the Parish Council intends to do to the Ware and remind them that it is their responsibility to maintain this bank in the future

#### 2021/22 LHI bid for a 24hr HGV ban on the B1040

There were 122 responses to the consultation regarding this Traffic Regulation Order (TRO), 121 in favour and 1 objection. The Chairman thanked those parishioners who responded to this consultation. Correspondence has since been received from Community RoadWatch, who objected to this TRO, to state that they would withdraw their objection. The Parish Council asked the Clerk to write to Community RoadWatch to state that the Council does not support their views but thanks them for retracting their objection. The decision meeting is due to be held on Monday 14th February at Cambridgeshire County Council.

#### 2022/23 LHI bid for a 30mph limit across the Green

Hilton Parish Council has received and approved the feasibility study for this proposed speed limit reduction. The Council has also approved the expenditure of £757 for their contribution to this project. The Council appointed Cllr Peter Balicki and Cllr Sarah Suckling to speak on its behalf at the LHI panel meeting on Monday 28th February. Cllr Peter Balicki, Cllr Graham Barradell and Cllr Rob Collard were appointed to write a 500-word document in support of this bid.

#### Parking on Church Lane

Parishioners have presented the Parish Council with information regarding the congested parking situation in Church Lane. The councillors sympathised with the problem faced by these parishioners. The residents' suggested solution is to provide an easement over the green area in Church Lane to allow residents to convert their front gardens to driveways. This land is owned by Huntingdonshire District Council. The Parish Council asked the Clerk to write to District Councillor David Mead and ask him to help our parishioners with this issue.

Hilton Parish Council has resolved to renew their street lighting maintenance contract with K&M Lighting Services Ltd for a further three years.

Are you interested in improving the lives of the people of Hilton? Do you care about our community and our village? Then read on...

#### What is a Parish Council?

A Parish Council is the tier of local government closest to their electorate and best placed to serve local communities. They are local authorities created by statute and can only act where there is an express power or duty. Parish Councillors are elected to this role every four years, after which the Parish Council has the power to co-opt any person or persons, meeting the statutory requirements, to fill the vacancies

#### Am I eligible to be a Parish Councillor?

You must be at least 18 years old on the day of your nomination - AND -

Be a British citizen, an eligible Commonwealth citizen or European Union citizen – AND – Meet at least ONE of the following FOUR qualifications:

- A local government elector (on the electoral roll) for the parish in which you wish to stand from the day of your nomination
- You are an owner or tenant of land or premises in the parish for 12 months before the day of your nomination and the day of election
- Your main or only place of work during these 12 months prior to the day of your nomination and the day of election has been in the parish
- You have lived in the parish or within three miles of it during the whole of the 12 months before the day of your nomination and the day of election.

#### But the Parish Council is just a talking shop, they don't actually do anything...

Have you been to a meeting, or are you basing your judgement on the Vicar of Dibley...? Parish Councils have varied responsibilities, including (but not limited to...):

- representing the local community interests, for example, by commenting on planning applications
- supporting local organisations and activities, for example with grants
- · providing amenities, such as streetlights, bus shelters and public seats
- control of litter, recreational grounds and playing fields and children's play areas
- looking after green spaces, common land and footpaths

Hilton Parish Council meets on the first Monday of every month, except January and August. The various committees meet on an ad hoc basis. They normally meet in either the Village Hall or Methodist Church.

#### But I'm too busy...

Full Council meetings only occur 10 times a year and last a maximum of 3 hours. There are other committees to join if you want and papers to read but the average time commitment is only 2 hours a week

#### But I haven't lived here for long, and I don't know the area well...

As a newcomer, your viewpoint will be more objective, and your opinions will be welcomed. What better way to get to know your community?

#### But I'm concentrating on my career...

Being a Parish Councillor is a great thing to have on your CV – it shows you can make decisions, work in a team, are community minded and proactive.

So now that there are no more excuses, here is why you should think about becoming a Parish Councillor.

As a Councillor, you become someone your community will look to for help, guidance and support, a community leader with the power to influence decisions for the benefit of the people you serve. Seeing your community change for the better, as a result of the decisions that you have helped to make, is something that can give you a sense of achievement and pride. The role of Councillor includes (but is not limited to):

- · Community engagement with parishioners and action groups
- Suggesting new initiatives
- Setting the budget
- Ensuring the views of the community are put to the relevant councils or organisations

All new Councillors receive an induction from the Clerk and there is a budget to send all Councillors on training delivered by our County Association (CAPALC).




