Hayley Wood was the first wood to be purchased by the Cambridgeshire Wildlife Trust. It is an ancient woodland which has been traditionally managed and is an important site for oxlip. Other flora that we would expect to see at this time of year include dogs mercury, lesser celandine and early purple orchid. Hayley Wood is also a key site in the development of landscape ecology and has been extensively studied by Cambridge University.

We have a further person awaiting nomination at our next meeting pending the resignation of Cllr Ward. We thank Cllr Ward for all his hard work and dedication and wish him all the best with his new ventures.

Compost Giveaways – Huntingdon District Council are providing free bags of compost, one bag to each household as a thank you for all the recycling done by householders. The bags of compost will be distributed from the Village Hall around the middle of May, we will publish the date and time on notice boards and on the village website.

Cambs and Peterborough Village of the Year Competition – we have been invited to submit an entry into this annual competition. It requires a dedicated and hard working person/group of people to take the lead. If you think you could take the lead in this please get in touch with the Clerk, the closing date is the 15th June, and we must, therefore, make a decision by our June meeting.

B1040 Footpath - When the new houses in Scotts Crescent were built the Parish Council received a P106 grant which must be used for leisure purposes within the village. Different options were explored by the Parish Council which then, voted for a new foot path along the B1040 from

The Paddocks to Five Arches Bridge so that parishioners could enjoy a circular walk around Hilton. This has been pursued over the past 18 months and we had expected the work to be completed by now. Unfortunately there has been a delay with the Contractor, but we are hopeful that the works will soon be completed.

FENSTANTON PARISH COUNCIL REPORT

Police report.

During the period 11th February 2009 to 10th March 2009 the following incidents had been reported to the Police: 1 burglary.

- 1 theft from a motor vehicle.
- 2 incidents of criminal damage.

The Parish Council urges all Parishioners to be vigilant and report any suspicious behaviour to the Police. Telephone 0845 456 456 4, Crimestoppers can be contacted on 0800 55 51 11 or in an emergency 999.

Dog fouling.

The past months has seen a considerable increase in the number of owners allowing their dogs to foul pavements and footpaths in and around the Village. The Parish Council has considered the provision of specific dog waste bins in the past. However, it is the District Council's policy not to empty these receptacles and the responsibility falls to the Parish Council, Because of the nature of the contents the Parish Council must employ the services of a registered contractor to undertake the task of disposal with the associated costs falling to the Parish Council. This one aspect would incur a substantial increase on the Parish precept. This is not a reason for owners not to clean up after their dogs as it is perfectly acceptable to put dog waste in the ordinary rubbish bins situated around the village or indeed take it home.

The act of allowing a dog to foul a footpath or pavement carries a maximum fine of £1000.

It is the Parish Council's intention to explore methods, possibly by involving enforcement by the District Council's dog warden, to stop this anti social action. Although the simple solution is for, irresponsible, dog owners to become aware of their actions.

Village Bus Services.

The Parish Council continues to campaign for adequate public transport to serve the Village. To this end the Chairman, Clerk and our County Councillor convened a meeting with the County Council's Head of Passenger Transport Services to flag up the problems currently being faced by travelers and the expected and foreseen implications the Guided Busway will have once it becomes operational.

Parking on Greens and Verges.

The Parish Council is concerned at the increased levels of parking on Village greens, verges and green areas. Whilst the problem is understood and appreciated with, in many instances, residents owning more than one car available on road parking becomes a premium. However, the problem is further compounded by the use of company vehicles and vans being brought home at the end of the working day and over weekend periods and therefore reducing, further, the amount of available parking. The resultant parking on verges, greens etc is causing considerable damage. The Parish Council feels this matter must be addressed and is seeking assistance through the District Council to find options to improve parking provision and prevent parking on the greens and verges.

On Thursday 2nd April Mervyn Foster gave us an interesting and informative talk with slides about Complementary Therapy. Mervyn was in the Army for 24 years serving in the Special Forces with tours of duty in the jungle, the desert and escorting convoys. After this he served 11 years with the police in Cambridge in the I.T. Department so Mervyn was no stranger to stress. Nearly 14 years ago he trained in Shiatsu which is similar to acupuncture but uses the pressure of thumbs and fingers instead of needles. Because 750,000 people suffer from work-related stress or depression and are off work for at least a month Mervyn holds Stress Management courses in offices not only in this country but across Europe and in America. His aim is to help people before stress seriously harms their health through high blood pressure, strokes, ulcers and heart attacks. He has also trained in Quantum Touch Healing which is a hands-on healing that incorporates different breathing techniques. He has worked at the Penny Brohn Cancer Care Centre in Bristol where a large proportion of people suffering from cancer said that his technique helped them to feel better and helped them tolerate treatments better. R.S.P.B. FEN DRAYTON LAKES

Is there such a thing as a typical spring? This one has had the usual mix of warm and cool days, but no significant rain in March or early April. We are keeping everything crossed that we don't have flooding in May, as has happened in the past two years. Many wetland birds nest on the ground, some in the reeds or tall grass near the lakes, others on the bare ground on islands. All of them are vulnerable to flooding.

If you visit the lakes, please keep to the paths – wildlife expects you to be there. If people or dogs go off the paths, then they may disturb nesting birds. Amazingly, some birds were setting up nests in April close to the guided busway, while construction was taking place. They seem to adapt to the noise and vehicle movements, because they occur in the same place day after day, and not in the hedges, bushes or reeds where the birds will build their nests.

If you enjoy meeting people, would you like to join our team of volunteers to welcome visitors to the Lakes at weekends? We have an exhibition trailer in the Holywell Lake car park on Saturdaysand Sundays from April, serving as an information point for visitors. 

brushes'. Don't forget to feed your roses.

*Hope your sunflowers are growing well for the 'Best Single Sunflower on the Day' competition in the show and it's now time to start planning your seed tray garden entry.

- *As it has been so dry don't neglect the watering especially newly planted shrubs.
- *Feed, weed and mow lawns to encourage good growth.
- *Harden off summer bedding plants.
- *Move tender shrubs in pots outside for summer.
- *Sow biennials for next spring's bedding plants.
- *Plant out dahlias at the end of the month.
- *Protect crops from carrot fly.
- *If you feel you need to use a bug killer spray make sure that it is one that will not harm other insects such as bees or ladybirds.
- *....and finally....watch out for late frosts.
