You can do it Japan!

On the 11th of March the world around us started to shake, a violent waltz that rocked us into a sudden dark age and took away so much from so many. The world has seen reels of news footage of the ongoing disaster that hit North East Japan but even with such coverage the reality of what happened is somehow difficult to fathom, even for those who were there.

I'll try to explain. I'm a Brit, from Fenstanton, more or less, and I live with my wife Mayumi and three children in Miyagi, Northern Japan. Our home is halfway between Sendai and Fukushima two place names that most people weren't that aware of before.......until everything changed.

So, there we were, at home on a Friday afternoon, work and school finished early, the weekend to look forward to. Then the earthquake came. We are used to earthquakes, many are just little distant rumbles; others make you bolt towards a door, the bigger ones send you straight under a table. This was different. The huge guake of March 11th was so powerful that we were left rooted to one spot, cowering behind our sofa, covering the kids, like bracing in the emergency position on a crashing passenger plane. Except this was our living room. Everything fell down but our house remained structurally intact. We took shelter from the seemingly endless aftershocks, at first in a local park, then when the rains came, in our car, then with nightfall, with some trepidation, we returned to one corner of our shook up house. This was the first night of many to be spent with none of the usual amenities, we were plunged into primitive living, no water, no electricity, no phones.....nothing.

We spent a week or so like that, queuing for hours to be handed clean water, collecting river water to flush our toilets with, strange things become essential items, of course there's the torches, the radio and the batteries for each, there's the stocks of food and drink from your fallen down fridge, the camping cooler box and ice packs, the water tanks, then there are the plastic crates, once used as toy boxes, transformed into water butts, the bath too becomes an in-house reservoir, you learn that a bucket with a spout is better than one without, that a toilet is a thirsty beast and that coffee strainers filter dust and dirt remarkably well....... these are just a few of the mundane realities that became our day to day.

We slowly began to get information from neighbouring towns, huge numbers were being discussed on the radio, however many metres, this many thousands, then we saw the newspaper. We knew there had been a tsunami, we knew there had been "fires" at a nuclear power plant but then we saw it, mapped out for us in the paper, we felt extremely fortunate, just far enough from the coast (8 miles) to avoid the wave's reach and at first we felt safe, 45 miles away from the Fukushima Daiichi Nuclear Plant, all around us was devastation and destruction, huge loss of life, entire towns washed away, but from the beginning there was an effort to strive, at first to rescue, then to rebuild.

With the ever-increasing threat of radiation leakage and more than a week of continued uncertainty and deliberation, we took advice from the UK Embassy and chose to leave our friends and extended family in Japan. There were warnings not to go outside in the rain, to change your clothes when you returned home. There were still queues for food and water and electricity had only just been restored. We were the last British family to be evacuated.

Now that we are back in Fenstanton, we feel in some way useless. We want to continue to help support the people in Japan... Almost 14,000 people have been confirmed dead, about the same number are still missing and over 150,000 people are now homeless. The Japanese people continue to press on, to fix what is broken and to go on with their lives... donations help and many people around the world have given what they can. I hope this continues.

We however are working on a different kind of aid, a project of goodwill offering our moral



support. We have been working with local school children and others to make posters of hope. (The staff and pupils of Fenstanton and Hilton Primary have been wonderful!). We are then photographing the posters and making a slideshow to present to the children in the affected schools back in Japan. Each poster contains the message "Ganbatte Nippon" meaning, "You can do it Japan!" Essentially the project is like a huge "Get well soon" card for the victims of the earthquake, tsunami and nuclear incident.

The word "ganbatte" is used in everyday life in Japan. It's a word with a plethora of meanings that depending on context it can say; come on, fight, go forward, persevere, do your best, good luck, you can do it, keep trying, keep going or don't give up. It is with this sentiment, that the people of Japan move forward from this disaster, with stoicism and dignity and it is with this in mind that we hope to support them in their journey.

FENSTANTON PARISH COUNCIL - APRIL 14th 2011

Parish Council elections. This being the last meeting of the existing Council before the May elections, when the number of Councillors will be reduced from 15 to13, the Chairman advised the meeting that there will be an uncontested election as only 13 candidates have been declared. The Chairman thanked the following Councillors, who have decided not to seek re-election, for their work and commitment to serving the Parish and the Council: Cllr. Behagg; Cllr. Kent; Cllr. Mott (the longest serving member of the Parish Council); Cllr. Pulley; Cllr. Yates.

Police report. The most recent information available is for the month of February which indicated the following reported incidents,:1 burglary.3 incidents of anti social behaviour, 1 incident of vehicle crime, 1 other unspecified crime

A PCSO attended the meeting and gave information on the action being taken against illegal parking and advised the meeting of the number of parking tickets that had been issued the last one being in February. The Parish Council expressed concern at the possible level of Policing in the Village and Policing in general following the review of Police pay. A written reply from Sgt Jones stated it is not possible to comment on the cost implications for the Village or Policing in general, however, at this time the neighbourhood teams will remain as they are and provide the best service possible.

<u>Cemetery Lighting</u>. The Parish Council has agreed the type of lighting for the Cemetery and approved the quotation from a contactor. Initially one 5m lamp will be installed but, when finances allow it may be possible to install a further light if it is deemed necessary. It is expected work will commence in the near future.

<u>Bus Service 15</u>. The County Council has made the decision to cancel service 15, despite the Parish Council's formal objection.

Parish maintenance grant The County Council has reduced the grant the Parish receives for maintenance by 25%. This is a dramatic reduction which means the shortfall will have to be found from the Parish budget to ensure the Village is kept to the standard that is expected.

Next Meeting. The next meeting of Fenstanton Parish Council will be held on **Thursday 12th May 2011 at 7:30pm** at Fenstanton and Hilton Primary School, School Lane, Fenstanton. Members of the press and public are welcome.

HILTON PARISH COUNCIL— APRIL MEETING

<u>**Parish Plan**</u> – the Parish Council have reviewed the actions of the Parish Plan, original dated 2005, with an updated progress report dated 2008. Details can be found on the village website.

Speeding – the Police recently placed a censor to monitor traffic speeds on the Potton Road at the Church End area. Approximately 51% of southbound drivers qualified for prosecution under "Association of Chief Police Officer" ACPO Guidelines. It was also noted that over 7 days, 1,108 drivers raced out of the village past Church End at speeds over 46 mph. Police are now regularly sending their mobile camera unit to this area. The Parish Council continue to work with Hilton Action on Traffic, Speedwatch, Highways Department and the Police to reduce the risk of road traffic accidents.

<u>Notice boards</u> – Parishioners will notice the new notice boards at the Westbrook and the Village Hall. We plan to display different maps and information at the Village Hall Notice board for extra information to visitors to Hilton.

<u>Royal Wedding</u> – The Parish Council extends its thanks to Liz Bush and the members of the Village Hall Committee who organised the Royal Wedding Celebrations in the Village. Liz will be organising celebrations for the 2012 Jubilee, so if you would like to get involved please contact the Clerk.

<u>Kidmans Close Bridge</u> - the Parish Council have approved funding for a replacement bridge which joins Kidmans Close with Tithe Lane.

Our next meeting is <u>**TUESDAY</u> 3rd May** at 7.30 pm in the Village Hall. Anyone is welcome to attend and parishioners are allowed to speak during the open session only. The Agendas for Parish Council meetings are posted on the 3 notice boards and on the village website 5 days before each meeting.</u>

Hilton Action on Traffic Group (HAT)

Cambridgeshire County Council has consulted with Parish Councils on a revised strategy for managing Heavy Commercial Vehicles (HCV's), recognising that lorry movements can have a significant impact on community environments. A "partnership" approach is being proposed to bring together local communities and the haulage industry. CCC. would see their role as "facilitator". An escalation process for resident complaints about HCV's would involve self assessment by a community of its lorry problems to determine an "Exposure Index" indicating the relative sensitivity of residents to HCV issues. It is stated that lorry movements and HCV controls should be consistent with Cambridgeshire's Advisory Freight Route Map:

There would also be an assessment of financial impact of any suggested rerouting on the businesses of haulage operators in order to balance

environmental aspects with industry needs. Weight limit orders are to be seen as a last resort and the County Council will no longer provide funding for their introduction.

Following a review with HAT of the detailed proposals, the Parish Council has responded to the consultation with a number of comments and questions.

Pedestrians on Potton Road constantly face dangers posed by high volumes of fast and heavy traffic passing close by, especially near the Graveley Way / High Street crossroads. One problem is the absence of footpaths at various places. Just a reminder to parents in particular to make sure children take great care and that they only ever cross the road at the relatively less dangerous places. 

Our meeting on April 7th started on a sombre note when Pam our President told us about the death and date of the funeral of our friend and member Pauline Driver.

They say 'Diamonds are For Ever', well not quite for us! For a few minutes we all handled a Victorian diamond brooch priced at £4,500 and tried on a delicate diamond bracelet from the 1930's priced at £7,500. They were brought along by Mr. Peter Hering who works at Cellini Jewellers in Cambridge. They make most of their jewellery and have apprenticeships to make sure this art keeps going.

Peter gave us a very interesting talk on the History of Diamonds illustrated with slides. He took us on a journey which involved great diamond rushes, vast amounts of money and the mystery of 'The Curse of the Hope Diamond'. This 100 carat blue diamond was found in 1668 and was part of the French Crown Jewels until the Revolution. Later it appeared in England but was only half the size. There is a portrait of King George IV wearing it but after his death it was sold due to debts. It changed hands several times but with the shadow of the 'curse' hanging over it. It is now in the Smithsonian Institute. But what happened to the other half of this blue diamond? We heard lots of other stories including the rich and famous such as Richard Burton and Elizabeth Taylor and the diamonds in our own Crown Jewels.



Walk with the Warblers at Paxton Pits

FEN DRAYTON LAKES



Work to create an area for school group visits is going well, and I'm delighted that Fenstanton and Hilton Primary School will be one of the first schools to use our Wildlife Discovery Zone.

Children are doing projects based on the Fen this year, and I had three enjoyable mornings leading many of the children on nature walks. I'm sure many found something they can use to link with the Fringe in the Fen Festival.

Some of Over St. Mary's Guides spent a morning in April making a bug hotel and bee homes for our new discovery zone. A dipping platform should be complete by May, ready for local school groups and our summer events programme.

A recent evening event for Fenstanton and Hilton Scouts, to focus on bats, got off to an unpromising start as it was quite windy – tough conditions for bats. Eventually, though, we found a sheltered place and the bat detectors all burst into life. These little gadgets enable us to hear sounds when bats are near by, yet don't interfere with the bats' hunting. Almost instantly, 20 energetic scouts fell silent, mesmerised by the technology. After a few seconds, the silence was broken by a very loud whisper: "there's one". Within minutes, they had all seen several bats.

May is possibly the most exciting month in the wildlife year in our part of the world. The landscape seems to change daily, as flowers and leaves open, and everywhere looks a vibrant green, splashed with white blossoms.

With the new growth, and warmth, come insects. There'll be the obvious and popular butterflies and dragonflies, as well as many smaller creatures, some of which are destined to be eaten by larger insects or birds.

Birds are all very busy, too. Early nesters will be feeding chicks; migrant breeders may still be setting up territories, and singing loudly at every opportunity. Other migrants will be passing through, still heading for the breeding places, and it will be possible to see and hear more than 90 different species in a day in the middle of the month at the Lakes.

Volunteers will be in the Holywell Lake car park, as usual, at weekends and bank holidays, to help you find as much as possible.

May's events will start off with a dawn chorus walk – several of the birds I expect to hear then had arrived in early April, but each species arrives in a different wave, so there are more to look forward to.

On 30 May we begin a couple of weeks of history at Willingham Mere, working with archaeologists from Cambridge University who are excavating a new site. Budding archaeologists can join for a few days, and there'll be tours for almost everyone (the site isn't pushchair or wheelchair friendly).
