Street Lighting and the Private Finance Initiative Agreement

A dim view

I have read the Parish Council reports in the March and April editions of the 'Spectrum' regarding the possible reduction of approx 30 street lights within the parish. This because of the P.F.I. agreement and the introduction of the supposedly more efficient white source of lighting.

The Parish Council being advised that the impact of making approx 30 street lights redundant will not be great, I think is a nonsense.

You cannot lose an existing conventional sodium lamp standard and expect the nearest new type of lamp standard to have a spread of illumination that in any way will

compensate for its loss.

All this really means is a reduction of lamp standards resulting in poorer lit streets.

Recent reports in the 'Cambridge Evening News' reflects the complaints and concerns along with petitions from residents in the suburbs of Cambridge as well as Eaton Socon Eynesbury. Residents are demanding that the lamp standards which have been removed are reinstated to restore a safe and secure environment. Despite previous reassurances complaints have focused on light levels after lights have been removed

I do hope the Parish Council will find it possible to take responsibility for any lights which will not be lit under the terms of the new contract.

FENSTANTON PARISH COUNCIL - APRIL

Police report.: During the month of March the following crimes and incidents were reported: 2 incidents of anti social behaviour, 1 incident of damage to a vehicle, 1 parking infringement, 1 report of suspicious persons, 4 reports of bogus/cold callers, 1 incident of road rage

The Parish Council urges Parishioners to be vigilant and report any suspicious behaviour to the Police. Telephone 101, Crimestoppers can be contacted on 0800 55 51 11 or in an emergency 999.

Village street lighting: The Parish Council is continuing to review the effects the Street PFI will have on the Parish and is requesting further information. From information gained Fenstanton column replacements are planned to commence from February to June 2014, this is indicative and is subject to change. On current charges the cost to the Parish Council would be approximately £1500 per annum to adopt the 10% of lights that are proposed to be switched off. This cost will inevitably be higher due to ever increasing energy costs and would have to be met through the Precept.

Dog fouling: Dog fouling in the Village remains a serious problem, despite letters from Parishioners, articles in Spectrum and repeated requests from the Parish Council to encourage all dog owners to act in a responsible manner.

The Open Space in Hampton Close is one area where the Parish Council has received a number of complaints from parents. It was with this in mind that the Parish Council has agreed to apply for a Dog Exclusion Order to be placed on the area. Once this is granted it will be legally enforceable and it is the Parish Council's intention to ensure the Order is complied with. The meeting considered placing signage but it was felt that this would be ignored and, therefore, stronger measures were required to address the problem.

Next Meeting: The next meeting of Fenstanton Parish Council will be held on **Thursday 10th May 2012 at 7:30pm** at Fenstanton & Hilton Primary School, School Lane, Fenstanton. *Members of the press and public are welcome*

BUS SUBSIDIES - WHAT YOU MAY LIKE TO KNOW

Around 80 per cent of public transport in Cambridgeshire is run commercially with the remaining 20 per cent being subsidised by the County Council, at a cost of around £2.7 million per year. Work is already underway with operators to see if changes to routes and timetables could make some marginal subsidised journeys commercially viable and therefore reduce this financial commitment.

The Council has also reviewed the way subsidies are currently paid and has started a phased three year change programme. Over the next three years the Council will be

transforming how these subsidised services are delivered, resulting in an annual investment of £1.5 million.

Before any subsidy is removed it is planned to carry out consultation to find out people's public transport needs. Everyone will be invited to contribute and work together to find the best and most cost effective way of meeting that need.

The results will vary across the County and one size will not fit all. Solutions may include local operators, smaller vehicles, links to commercial hubs, such as the Busway or

HILTON PARISH COUNCIL— APRIL

Hilton Parish Council has 5 parishioners who have submitted election papers which means the election is uncontested and those 5 will automatically be elected on to the Council. This however, leaves vacancies for 4 Parish Councillors to be co-opted to make up to our total of 9 Parish Councillors. The Parish Council meet regularly to make decisions on the work and direction of the council. As elected bodies parish councils are responsible to the people they represent. The role does require a commitment of time both to attend meetings and read and research information mostly presented in the form of emails. Anyone wishing to be co-opted should contact the Parish Clerk.

At going to press, there is no further news on our bid for funding towards a zebra crossing on the Potton Road, bids are due to be scored by Cambridgeshire County Council on April 26th and we should know shortly after this date if our bid was successful.

The Parish Council has given permission to Fenstanton Youth Football Club to continue using the village green for home matches for the 2012/13 season. We also plan to move the permanent goal posts to allow the worn goal mouths to recover.

The Parish Council thank Liz Bush for organising the 2012 Jubilee Celebrations, details of which can be found on the village website and notice boards. An interesting programme is planned for the weekend. The Parish Council have agreed funding towards a temporary beacon to be located on the village green.

Our next meeting is **WEDNESDAY 9TH May at 7.30 pm** in the Village Hall. Our June meeting will take place on Monday 11th June. Anyone is welcome to attend and parishioners are allowed to speak during the open session only. The Agendas for Parish Council meetings are posted on the 3 notice boards and on the village website 5 days before each meeting.

Park and Ride as well as direct routes to certain destinations and flexible dial a ride type services. If there is enough demand it could lead to more travel opportunities, not less. If the best solution to deliver an essential service is to retain the current form of subsidy, then that will still be an option.

The new initiatives will be rolled out under the banner of Cambridgeshire Future Transport starting from April 2012. Subsidised services have been grouped into 13 geographical areas which have transport


links

within them and these areas will be reviewed in three tranches over the next three years. This is so that the services can be looked at as a whole and alternatives explored.

More information will be released and public engagement will be carried out as each phase of reducing the subsidy starts.

HILTON TRAFFIC ISSUES - SPEEDWATCH



C o m m u n i t y Speedwatch has been operating in Hilton for nearly 3 years now, and we thought it timely to give you all an update on how the

scheme has been progressing.

For those of you new to the village a little background .The Speedwatch scheme is run by the Cambridge Constabulary, alongside the Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Road Safety Partnership and uses local volunteers to monitor trends in speeding in neighbourhoods and report vehicles which are exceeding the prescribed limit.

Police take the recorded vehicle details and using their Safety Camera Partnerships database, checks of valid Insurance, tax and MOT are made, and offenders are then sent an advisory letter by the police. Serious speeders (15MPH+ over ACPO guidelines) and persistent offenders will receive a visit from a police officer in person, who will take whatever action they feel appropriate, armed with the above information.

So what benefits to the village have all our efforts had over the last 3 years?

The data we have collected, persuaded the police to carry out an official 24X7 survey of vehicle speeds through the village (located by the warning side near Church End junction), and that confirmed the problem and persuaded them to mount regular Camera Van visits at that location and patrol officers with laser equipment in the centre of the village, and significant numbers of drivers are being reported each month for prosecution.

Also, over the months of our operation, from the data collected, we have seen a dramatic reduction in repeat offenders being reported and reduction in the percentage of cars exceeding the limit, which shows that the message is getting through and people are being more considerate travelling through our village and reducing their speed.

Plant power: parasites and carnivores



Carnivorous plants show a different nutrient-gathering technique. These plants grow in nitrogen-poor environments and obtain this essential nutrient from insect protein. This month, *Sarracenia* are coming into flower, each long stem topped by beautiful green, pale yellow, sometimes red-flushed nodding flowers the shape of old-fashioned bathcaps! Woven in among the winter orchid display, they are an arresting sight in the Glasshouse Range and their beauty belies the deadly pitchers that are elongating alongside. These specialised leaves are rolled into cone-shapes that collect a reservoir of water into which insects fall, drown and are slowly digested.

The power of plants to kill and to cure, make and mend, bewitch and beware, and always to surprise and intrigue will be the subject of the first Fascination of Plants Day hosted at the **Botanic Garden on Saturday 19 May 2012, 10.30am – 4pm.** There'll be displays, demos, workshops, trails, meet the experts and hands-on activities for families. Normal Garden admission applies, the event itself is free.

FENSTANTON WI

At a well attended meeting on the evening of 5th April, we were entertained by Linda Shephard who stepped in to replace a speaker who was unable to attend.

Linda told us about her experiences of living on a Reservation in the USA. She had met a Native American, called Grey Wolf, on the Internet and a friendship grew up between them. Eventually he invited her to visit him on the Reservation in the Four Corners area of Arizona, where they fell in love and were married. The Four Corners is the area where Arizona. New Mexico. Utah and Colorado meet. Linda arrived in November and found it snowy and cold. The fuel for heat and cooking is wood which has to be gathered every day and there is no electricity on the Reservation. The houses look to us like wooden huts and are pretty basic. There is also no running water and they have to go every 2 days to collect water in 5 gallon bottles; this is all there is for cooking, washing and cleaning the house. The loo is a shack outside and is put up over a pit in the ground, which is filled in from time to time and then the shack is moved elsewhere. Linda was afraid to go out after dark because of covotes and rattlesnakes! I can't say I blame her.

The Navajo call themselves Dine which translates roughly as The People. They don't believe in races, rather regarding everyone as belonging to the one human race. The word, Navajo, is a corruption of a Spanish expression meaning horse thieves!

The Navajo and other Native American people were driven from their tribal lands where they grew crops such as peaches, and made to live on the Reservation. They have very few rights and cannot own land. And, even though there are rich deposits of coal and other minerals below reservation, they do not own these and the only benefit to them from these resources is that some men can get jobs in the mines on rather poor wages. The only hope for young Navajos is to leave the reservations and work in the cities which results in loss of their culture: a great shame. It seems the Native Americans nowadays have fewer rights than African Americans.

On the other hand, the Navajo have a rich culture and make beautiful jewellery. They are a very welcoming and warm community. Unfortunately Linda has had to return to the UK to look after her elderly mother so doesn't see her husband often, though they do manage visits.

What an interesting and inspiring talk; it makes us humble to realise what poor circumstances some people have to tolerate, even in the West; and to feel grateful for what we have.



FEN DRAYTON LAKES

Many people who enjoy wildlife and the countryside say May is their favourite month. It is easy to agree with them.

warm, sunny days (sometimes), wildlife that we've not seen since last summer (hopefully), bright green foliage and flowers (almost certainly), all reasons to get out there, go slowly, relax and enjoy them.

Warm weather will bring out the butterflies, dragonflies, bees and many other insects, most of which we'll enjoy, and all playing their role in the cycle of life in the natural world. Breeding, feeding, being eaten, and pollinating our fruit, vegetables, farm crops and garden plants.

Most insect-eating birds head south for the winter, where insects will still be easily found (a handful remain, perhaps changing their diet), but by May, all should have returned from the arduous journeys across the Sahara desert and back – swifts, swallows, cuckoos, common whitethroats and reed warblers, to name just a few.

Spring rains and warm weather promote rapid plant growth around the lakes just as much as in our gardens or farmland. Tender leaves may be eaten by insects, which are then eaten by birds – a very short food chain.

The lush growth conceals nest too. Lapwings and skylarks may lay their eggs when the grass (or wheat) is very short, but it soon grows tall enough to make the nest difficult to see. Reed warblers build their nests in the reeds, woven around three or four reed stems, while ducks' nests may be tucked away under a bush.

People often tell me they never see nests, and that tells me the birds have chosen well! Nesting success for most birds means hiding the nest away, where predators will not find their eggs or chicks. Mute swans don't need to hide theirs – the adults are big enough to see off predators up to the size of a fox, beating them with their wings.

Because so many of our birds at Fen Drayton Lakes nest on the ground, we really do appreciate people and dogs staying on the paths in spring and summer, minimising the risk of disturbing or damaging nests, and so helping our birds to flourish.

Why not come on one of our walks, and see how the breeding season is going?


