

FENSTANTON PARISH COUNCILOCTOBER 2010

Police report.

During the period 7th September 2010 to 12th October 2010 the following incidents had been reported to the Police: 1 incident of criminal damage, 1 burglary, 2 incident of theft, 1 incident of obtaining fuel without paying.

The meeting was also advised that the theft of number plates from a van did not appear on the police report.

Although the number of reported incidents is low the Parish Council urges Parishioners to be vigilant and report any suspicious behaviour to the Police. Telephone 0345 456 456 4, Crimestoppers can be contacted on 0800 55 51 11 or in an emergency 999.

Speeding.

Speeding on the Headlands Estate is causing considerable concern with complaints being received from Parishioners. The problem on Headlands is being further exasperated with an increasing number of vehicles parking on the bend and on both sides of the road thus significantly reducing the width of the road and vision. The Police are aware of the problems but the Parish Council request all drivers observe the speed limits and drive at speeds relevant to the prevailing conditions.

Gravel on footpaths.

Gravel spilling from drives onto footpaths can be a hazard for the elderly and small children. The Parish Council request that residents with gravel drives ensure that any spillage is swept from the footpath.

Dog fouling.

Dog fouling on footpaths appears to be increasing again. Whilst it is appreciated that the majority of dog owners have a responsible attitude, the Parish Council appeals to the minority whose dogs foul the Village footpaths to ensure that they clean up. If dog owners do not wish to take the bags home they can be placed in any of the Village rubbish bins.

HILTON PARISH COUNCIL— OCTOBER 2010

<u>Annual Bonfire and Firework Event</u> – Saturday 6th November, gates open at 6 pm, fireworks commence at 7 pm. Tickets cost £3.00 per adult and £1.00 per child. Donations for the bonfire can be delivered to the site on Friday 5th Nov. between 9am and 10am and on Saturday 6th November between 9am and 11 am. Bonfire volunteers still sought, please contact the Clerk if you can spare an hour to help supervise the bonfire building.

<u>Graveley Way – Traffic Calming</u> - Parish Councillors are currently considering a traffic calming scheme for Graveley Way. Last year the Parish Council were successful in a bid for jointly funded minor improvement scheme – the scheme must be completed by 31st March 2011 to qualify for the funding. As soon as the Parish Council have approved the proposed scheme, Graveley Way residents will be consulted by Highways and we encourage all residents to respond accordingly. Updates will be available on the website and on notice boards.

<u>The Turf Maze</u> – Renovations have recently been completed by Clivedon Conservation. Here is a short report of the work undertaken.

The sunken Maze, thought to be one of only eight in the country, is approximately 17m in diameter. At the centre is a stone Monument to its creator, William Sparrow, probably erected on his death in 1729. The monument is constructed from an Oolitic limestone and consists of a plinth dais block, a square obelisk, carved cornice element, socle and ball finial. Scheduled as an ancient monument, the Maze is now the responsibility of the Parish Council and was refurbished in 1998 with a grant from



English Heritage. The condition of the monument raised recent concerns and with grant aid from English Heritage was stabilised, cleaned and secured with a security fixing. A stable footing of lime was laid, onto which the Monument was re-erected using lime mortar and stainless steel dowel. A light conservation clean exposed the true colour of the stone as well as uncovering a carved sundial on the orb. The stones were re-bedded in the exact position they were dismantled which may or may not be an accurate time telling position! The small retaining wall, found to be badly eroded was also restored and rebuilt where missing, in a suitable lime mortar with hazel staves armatures. The maze is unique and at possibly 350 years old, is a beautiful spectacle for people from far and wide to enjoy.

<u>Burglaries</u> - Once again the village has experienced a spate of burglaries. Parishioners are asked to be extra vigilant and take extra security measures to ensure your home is left untouched. Neighbourhood Watch up-dates are available on the village website.

Our next meeting is **Monday 1st November at 7.30pm** in the Village Hall. Anyone is welcome to attend and parishioners are allowed to speak during the open session only. The Agendas for these meetings are posted on the 3 notice boards and on the village website 5 days before each meeting. NEWS FROM THE VILLAGE CHURCHES

Matt 16 v 24 Jesus said to his disciples... "Follow me"

Often the things we face in life can be quite overwhelming and we find ourselves seeking pity from someone, but this doesn't help us or even serve us very well. We simply need our Lord Jesus, all that we need is in Him.

In the true story of Corrie ten Boom's life "The Hiding Place" Corrie tells of how the Gestapo took her and her family into captivity for helping the Jews. In her story she explains how one day in prison she receives a letter. In solitary confinement she hears footsteps and cries out "Please! I have bad news - oh please, don't go away!" The footsteps retreat, the keys jingle and the cell door opens. "This letter just came" she explains "It says that my father - it says my father has died". The prison guard, standing in the doorway embarrassed at Corrie's tears, says "whatever happens... you brought it on yourself"

As the door slams Corrie then whispers "Dear Jesus how foolish of me to have called for human help when you are here. To think that Father sees You now face to face! To think that he and Mama are together again, walking those bright streets..."

I often have the idea that I ought to shield myself from some of the things God brings around me. Never, is this correct! God engineers circumstances and whatever they may be like, we have to see that we face them and at the same time dwell with Jesus. These are His tests, tests to the life of the Son of God in us. The honour of Jesus Christ is at stake in our lives. Are we remaining loyal to Jesus, our Lord? Do we continue to go with Jesus in the path that lies through our Gethsemane, the way lies alone and the way lies until there is no trace of a footstep left, only the voice "follow me"

FEN DRAYTON LAKES

A lovely still, sunny morning brought out a lot of people for a guided walk on 7th October, we enjoyed seeing butterflies and dragonflies as well as good numbers of birds that had already arrived to spend the winter here. The water was so still that we could see a reflection under each swimming bird.

The most numerous duck species was wigeon, although most of the drakes hadn't reached their full plumage. By November, we'd expect them to be looking their best, with bright chestnut heads and a creamy-yellow stripe on the forehead. They also make a distinctive, far-carrying whistling call.

The crop of berries – hawthorn and guelder rose – look good again, we can look forward to flocks of redwings and fieldfares in the hedges when they arrive from their Scandinavian breeding areas.

These flocks are generally nervous, and therefore difficult for people to get very close to, so binoculars are useful for getting good views. They aren't essential, however, as you can get good views just by standing very still and giving the birds time to relax, get used to you being there and continue feeding.

The starling roost already had a couple of thousand birds by early October, and we can expect numbers to increase by the start of November. You can watch the spectacular aerial flights from the main car park, overlooking Holywell Lake, where they will normally settle for the night. Generally, the main activity starts a little more than an hour before it gets dark, and can last about half an hour. Wait a while longer, and you can then watch the jackdaws and rooks going to their roost in the nearby willow woodland as darkness falls.

Alder trees attract siskins and redpolls to feed on their tiny seeds, and these small finches regularly feed alongside the commoner, resident goldfinches. Watch out for them around Elney Lake.

Winter habitat management work will depend very much on the weather conditions. Our volunteers work in all weathers, but flooding can be the biggest barrier to getting a particular job done.

The volunteers really enjoy hedge-laying, and are hoping to get more done on the hedge between Moore Lake and the Guided Busway. That area was flooded for part of last winter, but only time will tell how much flooding will happen in the next few months.

Join us for a guided walk (or two) in November, beginning from the Holywell Lake car park. Well concentrate on ducks on **Wednesday 3rd**, starting at 10am. The walk on **Tuesday 23rd** begins at 1.30pm, and we'll return to the car park in time to watch the roosting birds.

Please note that our Willow Weaving Workshop on 23rd is fully booked, but we'll run more next year. We'll be harvesting willow over the winter months for next year's workshops, so long as the areas aren't flooded!

The Reptiles and Amphibians of Cambridgeshire


