

#### FENSTANTON PARISH COUNCIL - OCTOBER

**Police report:** The most recent information available is for the month of August which indicated the following reported incidents: 3 incidents of anti social behaviour; 5 Vehicle crime; 2 other unspecified crimes.

The meeting was advised that a number of thefts from motor vehicles had taken place in the Fenstanton area. There was no sign of forced entry and the vehicles were not damaged which indicated that the vehicles had been left unlocked. The advice from the Police is to ensure your vehicle is locked when it is left and to check by trying the door handles and not just by relying on the key fob.

A new Police call centre is expected to commence operation in the near future which is expected to reduce the call waiting time.

A new emergency contact number of 101 has been introduced.

The Parish Council urges Parishioners to be vigilant and report any suspicious behaviour to the Police. Telephone 0345 456 456 4 or 101, Crimestoppers can be contacted on 0800 55 51 11 or in an emergency 999.

<u>Consultation on the review of the decision to remove all subsidised bus</u> <u>service funding.</u> The County Council wants your views on changes and reductions being proposed to bus services which are supported by financial contributions from Council funds. The County Council has agreed that a review of last years budget decision to cut the £2.7m that is currently spent on subsidising bus journeys in Cambridgeshire over the next four years should take place. The review is being carried out as part of this years budget planning process. The consultation seeks the views on not only the principal of making cuts but also the impact of specific route changes. Feedback is being gathered on the impact on communities where routes have already been cut.

The Parish Council urges Parishioners to take part in the consultation.

The consultation closes at 16:00 on Friday 9th December. A questionnaire is available on the following link: www.cambridgeshire.gov.uk/busreview.

**Pond cleaning**. The pond was cleaned on Saturday 1st October. With one Parishioner, three Councillors and the clerk undertaking the task with support from a District Council Countryside Ranger, it was, however, disappointing that greater support was not given by other residents of the Parish to assist in keeping one of our Village assets in good order. Thanks are extended to those who attended and also to Mr. Behagg who provided a trailer at no cost to the Parish.

<u>Swan Road footpath</u>. Following a request from the Parish Council to the County Council Highways Department with support from our District and County Councillors the footpath in Swan Road was resurfaced 4th October.

**<u>Next Meeting.</u>** The next meeting of Fenstanton Parish Council will be held on *Thursday 10th November 2011 at 7:30pm* at Fenstanton and Hilton Primary School, School Lane, Fenstanton.

I'm considering going abroad for our family holiday next year but the last time I went abroad with a child the journey was very difficult and we ended up spending 14 hours in the international departures lounge of a tiny foreign airport (no fun with a 4 year old!) For Jesus' disciples the simple journey across Lake Galilee: 'Let us go across to the other side' (Mark 4:40) turned out to be a major trial of faith. The fishermen, who were travelling across the lake with Jesus, hit a massive storm and the fishermen were afraid for their lives. After Jesus rebuked the storm with the words 'Peace, be still' Jesus asked the question, 'Why are you so afraid? Have you still no faith?' What had they to fear? The God who had said 'let there be light' had said they were to cross the lake. They didn't understand the reality of who was speaking and the implications of everything He said, in fact they even questioned what sort of being he was. Jesus, fully God and fully Man, proved to be faithful to everything he said.

#### He is who He says He is!

The faithfulness of God means God proves to be true. He is who He says He is and what He does bears this out. God keeps all His promises. Once the large pinnate leaves that turn a warm butter yellow in autumn are shed, the deeply-fissured dark bark and vast, spreading crown are revealed. In winter sunshine, the statuesque yet sinuous tracery of the bare-branched canopy casts an plaited shadow pattern on nearby Brookside Lawn.


Pam Hucklesby was unanimously voted in again as President. We sent our Congratulations and a card to Pam and Graham who will soon be celebrating their Golden Wedding.

Monday December 5th we will be having our Christmas party, so start planning your table arrangement.



#### FEN DRAYTON LAKES

Does anyone look forward to November? There might be a special day, such as a birthday or anniversary, but otherwise the month doesn't have much going for it.



October is the month for those great autumn colours on the trees, before the gales and heavy rain knock them to the ground. October ends with changing the clocks and November's days are suddenly very short and often gloomy. Winter is here.

So what do we do when darkness falls? Perhaps we go indoors, switch on lights, close curtains, turn on (or up) the heating, and have a meal. Some might have a hot bath before going to a warm bed.

Life is much less cosy for most of our wildlife. For the animals that are active by day, there is less time to find enough to eat, and often there is not so much food available anyway. If the ground is frozen, those that eat worms and the like will have an even harder time finding food.

The food they find then has to sustain them through the long nights – some will sleep in cosy burrows or nests underground, but those above ground burn up calories just keeping warm.

This is where we can help. Providing additional, nutritious food can make a big difference to small creatures. If you can help a wren, robin or blackbird get through the winter, they'll repay you by eating some of your garden pests next year.

Feeding garden birds is an easy step to take, but choose carefully. The cheapest bird foods generally have ingredients that birds don't eat, so they turn out to be wasteful. Avoid mixes with colourful bits of dog biscuits, and lots of wheat, lentils or split peas, unless you've got a dog and a flock of pigeons to feed!

Sunflower hearts appear expensive, but most birds love them (more than peanuts), and everything will be eaten. Wrens, robins and blackbirds prefer fatty foods, such as suet blocks – packed with calories to get them through the cold nights.

Hedgehogs, frogs and toads should be hibernating by now. Small hedgehogs, perhaps born in late summer, may not have put on enough fat to survive hibernation, and they can be helped through the winter with a supply of specially formulated food. If you find a small "hog", advice is available on the Internet.

Many hedgehogs choose to hibernate in piles of wood that appear in October, in preparation for Bonfire Night. One step you can take for hedgehogs is to move the pile on the day you want to start your fire – it might seem like a lot of extra work, but it could save the life of your local slug controller.

We'll continue to have our information point in the main car park, but only on Sundays for the remainder of 2011. Don't forget to watch the starling roost at Holywell Lake, best seen from the car park in the last hour of daylight. The displays are easier to see when the sky is fairly clear of clouds.
