Police report.

Two PCSOs attended the meeting and advised Members of the new Neighborhood Alert Scheme. The meeting expressed its concern at the number of vehicles parking on corners and the associated hazard of reduced visibility for other road users. The PCSOs advised the meeting that they will monitor the situation and will speak to errant drivers in the first instance and if they persist tickets will be issued.

Proposed Crossing on Potton Road

Following a review of the process to date, the Council's financial reserves and confirmation from Cambridgeshire County Council that the cost could, with no charge, be spread over a period of up to 3 years, it was agreed that the crossing should be taken forward. This decision is subject to assurances from Cambridge County Council regarding the total cost which would be confirmed once the appropriate surveys had been conducted.

Tree Survey

A comprehensive survey of the trees around the village has recently been undertaken identifying the work required to keep our trees healthy. Approval for the most urgent work has been given with the remainder to be considered in the New Year.

Parish Council Finances

A review of the Council's finances has been undertaken and this has revealed that, following the cost of the election and the need to employ a professional clerk, there will be a deficit in the Council's budget this year. This will have to be funded from the Council's reserves.

<u>A14</u>

The recent presentation by the Highways Agency was well attended with the initial consultation period finishing on 13 October 2013. A working group has been formed in the village and will be looking at what actions can be taken to limit the effect of this new road on Hilton ahead of the next round of consultations due in Spring 2014.

Other matters

The new standing orders and policy documents for the Parish Council were approved.

Quotes are being obtained to repair the rotting wooden borders in the play area.

THE MONTHLY RECIPE By Domenico Pingerna

Spaghetti Aglio, Olio e Peperoncino (Garlic, Olive Oil and Chilli

<u>Spaghetti</u>

Ingredients

Serves: 2

- 200g spaghetti
- 2 garlic cloves, crushed
- 50ml Virgin olive oil
- 1.5 tea spoons of dried chillies

2 red chillies, deseeded and chopped

1 tsp finely chopped flat leaf parsley

salt and freshly ground black pepper to taste

Preparation method

Prep: 5 mins | Cook: 20 mins1.Cook the spaghetti according to packet instructions. Drain and reserve two tablespoons of the cooking water from the spaghetti.2.In a frying pan over low heat, sauté the garlic and dried chillies in the olive oil until golden but not browned. Add the fresh chillies and the reserved cooking liquid. Add the spaghetti and season with the chopped parsley, salt and pepper. Toss so that the spaghetti is coated in the olive oil mixture and everything is well combined. Serve immediately with my favourite Italian cheese grated Grande Padano. Serve with a tomato and cheese garlic bread. Mega quick and yummy

FIREWORKS and bonfires can be plenty of fun for all the family to enjoy. CFRS recommends going to an organised firework display instead of holding one at home, however, if you do use fireworks or light a bonfire at home, we would ask residents to take on board our safety advice to ensure it is just their fireworks that go off with a bang:

Keep fireworks in a closed box and always follow the instructions.

Light them at arms length using a taper and stand well back.

Never go back to a lit firework.

Never put fireworks in your pocket or throw them.

Don't light bonfires in unsuitable weather, particularly in windy conditions. Don't leave bonfires unattended.

Build bonfires well clear of buildings, fences and hedge.

Never use flammable liquids to start the fire, and never burn dangerous rubbish such as aerosols, paint, foam furniture, rubber tyres, batteries.

Before you light the bonfire, check that children and animals are not hiding inside and are a safe distance away.

Wildlife Camera Traps

This intriguing subject will be the focus of the next meeting of the Wildlife Trust, Huntingdonshire Local Group, to be held on Wednesday 13th November 2013 at 7.30pm at Brampton Memorial Hall, Thrapston Road, Brampton.

Arnold Cooke has studied local deer populations since the 1970s, recording colonization, ecology, impact and management. His talk tonight will illustrate wildlife activity that is often revealing and is sometimes surprising and amusing.

Wildlife Camera Traps are designed to be left in the field and take photos and videos when animals move in front of them. Intensive use of such cameras over the last 3 years has allowed Arnold an insight into deer behavior that, in some cases, has never been seen before. At the same time, other wildlife species are also caught in these 'traps'.

Also we will present an illustrated talk on the Wildlife Landscapes of the Hebrides on Wednesday 11th December at 7.30pm at Brampton Memorial Hall, Thrapston Road, Brampton.

Our speaker, Barrie Mason, is an enthusiastic and knowledgeable naturalist who has previously been group leader of the Bedford Branch of the RSPB. Barrie is also an experienced speaker and has enthralled many people with both his talks and inspirational wildlife photography.

On this occasion, Barrie will concentrate on the Outer Hebrides, particularly the flora and fauna of North Uist, Benbecula and South Uist, including the beautiful coastal machair and orchids on these remote islands.

Snap, crackle and pop: it's time to sow what you reap!

Even late in the year, a little sunny warmth on a late autumn day can induce a syncopated rhythm to the garden as the last of the year's seedcases crack, split, shake and explode to release their last seeds into the soil.

Take advantage of this and gather up this mostly annual bounty and scatter so as to introduce an element of surprise to the garden next spring. Good candidates for overwintering are the curved, caterpillar like seeds of calendula, the oval, mid brown seeds dangling at the end of each frond on the quill-like purple tansy flowerheads, the shuttle-shaped seeds of cosmos, the matt black seeds of love-inthe-mist held in seamed and horned pepperpots, the flattened seeds of members of the mallow family, which includes the hollyhocks, tightly packed into carousels, like Bendicks mints, the shiny black nutlets held in packs of four which need prising out of the papery hoods of borage, or the tiny round seeds filling the lipped goblets of white and red campion to the brim. Collect up a mixed handful and perhaps mix with a bit of sharp sand to aid an even distribution.

The great Edwardian plantswoman, Miss Ellen Willmott of Warley Place, so the story goes, made this approach into a whole PR campaign for her beloved giant eryngo, and would keep pinches of the seed in her pocket for broadcasting in gardens she deemed lacking in the silver structure and bristly blue flowers that this statuesque plant provides. She was so prolific with the seed, that the plant is commonly known as Miss Willmott's Ghost, and it indeed must still haunt gardens where she walked.

All these seeds will happily sit in the soil through the winter, ready to make early growth and flower next year. Some perennial species actually need to be exposed to a period of intense cold in order to break dormancy and improve germination, a phenomenon known as stratification. This was why we could be seen sowing seed into January snow at the beginning of the year for our new perennial, drought-tolerant meadow – the resulting magical mayhem is still looking fabulous, with spectacular first year flowering on the big-fruit evening primrose, Berkheya and Indian paintbrush.
