Local Weather Watch

When I ended my last article in early September, there was little sign of summer ending. In fact the first half of September this year was warmer than the first half of each of the three recognised summer months. During the first two weeks the temperature reached 20C (68F) every day and on nine days it reached 23C (73.4F), the hottest day being the 13th when 30.5C (87F) was reached. Elsewhere in the UK, on the same day 34.4C (94F) was reached in Gravesend, Kent, making it the warmest day of the year and the hottest September day for 50 years. Although the second half of the month was rather cooler, only on two days did the temperature fail to reach 15.5C (60F). With sunshine much in evidence and rainfall at 36mm a little below normal, it was a very pleasant month. Night time temperatures were well above normal, generally within the range 11C to 14C (52F to 57F). No night was remotely near a frost, 7C (44.6F) being the coolest.

With daylight hours reducing, inevitably October up to the 20th has been much cooler than September, though only a little below normal. The nights have had an autumn chill but we are still awaiting the first air frost. There have been quite a few days with easterly winds which is unusual during the autumn.

Departing from my usual format, regarding weather forecasts, have you noticed how some of the descriptions used by some presenters in their forecasts have at times been "dumbed down" to become almost meaningless. Examples of what I mean are phrases such as "not a total washout", 'some useful weather" (for what?), "a bit of sparkle" (frost), "showers, but not everyone will get one" and giving a temperature range of 5 degrees C (9 degrees F). The latter could for example result in severe frost or the temperature hovering at freezing in winter or between a normal summer day and a hot one. Also for people who like the weather to be less hot, to be told that it is going to be a glorious summer day with temperatures in the 30's C is again a very subjective view of what constitutes pleasant enjoyable conditions. Am I being overly critical? I leave you to judge.

On a lighter note, I will conclude with the Forecaster's Lament (Anon)

FENSTANTON PARISH COUNCIL meeting -

Police report.

A current report from the Police was not available prior to the Parish Council meeting.

However, the meeting was made aware that, during September, there had been a decrease in the number of burglaries in the Village, although vehicle crime remained high. It appears that vans in particular are being targeted and power tools being stolen. A Police representative will attend the November meeting of the Parish Council.

Parishioners are reminded to be vigilant and report any suspicious behaviour to the Police telephone 101, Crimestoppers can be contacted on 0800 55 51 11 or in an emergency 999.

Road closures.

Cambridgeshire County Council Highways have advised the Parish Council that Conington Road and Elsworth Road will be closed from the 8th to 15th November between the hours of 08:30 - 15:30 for resurfacing.

A14 update.

Representatives of Highways England appraised the meeting of the latest situation concerning the construction of the new A14. Members were advised that ecological and archaeological work is currently being undertaken and site accommodation is expected to be in place by Christmas whilst earth moving is expected to start early next year. Signage will be erected on the west bound exit from the A14 prohibiting construction traffic using the Village.

Changes to the Whippet Coaches timetable.

Notification has been received that Whippet Coaches will be amending and reducing the service they provide through Fenstanton effective from 14th November. Further information in the reduction of service can be found in this edition of Spectrum along with details of an on-line petition. The Parish Council will be writing to Whippet Coaches expressing its opposition to the reduction in service and also urges Parishioners to write to the Company.

Local Government Boundary Commission.

The Commission has now completed its review of Cambridgeshire County Council. There are to be no changes to Fenstanton's electoral boundaries with respect to County Council elections.

The next meeting of Fenstanton Parish Council will be held on Thursday 10th November 2016 at 7:30 at Fenstanton & Hilton Primary School, School Lane, Fenstanton.

Members of the public and press are welcome.

The minutes of previous meetings are available on the Village website or via the Clerk.

Voluntary 20mph speed restriction

The 20mph speed restriction signs offered by Mick George should be fitted shortly. This is a voluntary initiative offered by the Mick George group and their vehicles should be respecting that speed as they go through the village.

The Parish Council would suggest that perhaps all villagers could follow suit, and limit their speed to 20mph through the village. If we all joined in reducing our speed it may help to reduce the speed of others.

The Parish Council, in conjunction with Cambridgeshire County Council, are seeking to extend this to a mandatory 20mph speed limit.

Housing Needs Survey

There were 101 responses to the recent survey.

The majority of responders (60%) were not in favour of the further expansion of the village, even a small development of affordable homes specifically for people with a local connection to Hilton. Just 5% of responders indicated that a member of their household had a housing need. These results are almost identical to a similar survey conducted over five years ago.

Parish Plan

The working group has been set up to review the outcomes of the existing Parish Plan. As mentioned last month the outcomes and recommendations of that Parish Plan are on the Parish Council's website and we invite comment from Parishioners on those.

Δ14

Thank you to everyone who attended the exhibition held by Highways England on 29 September 2016. You will have probably noticed the start of works along the roads leading north. Over the first 9 months or so of 2017 the bridges on the 3 routes going north will be completed and then construction of the new southern by pass will commence.

Highways England have applied for blanket road closure notices on these roads to cover the proposed term of the construction project. This means they have to then give 14 days' notice for any proposed road closure. There will undoubtedly be times when these roads are closed during the construction period.

Highways England will be changing their communication strategy for effected communities such as Hilton. In future a customised bus will visit from time to time carrying information on the scheme and providing updates. We have suggested that perhaps this visits Hilton in the early part of 2017 and will provide further information in due course.

Tree work

Many would have noticed the season for tree work around the village has started and will continue through the winter. The resulting timber will be left for Hilton parishioners to help themselves. As in previous years can we ask parishioners to take just one barrow per household to ensure everyone has a fair share.

Pavilion

This valuable Parish asset is in need of renovation and plans for a proposed scheme are on the Parish Council's website. An estimate of the cost of this work is in the region of £72,000. The Parish Council is now investigating what grants or other types of funding may be available so this work can be undertaken.

Next meeting

The next Parish Council meeting will take place on 7th November 2016 at 19:30 at Hilton Village Hall. Notice of agendas, minutes of meetings and contact details will be placed on the HPC website; www.hilton-pc.cq.uk and on the village notice boards.

Changes to Local Bus Services

CHANGES TO WHIPPET BUS SERVICES FROM NOVEMBER 14 2016

Whippet bus no 1A will no longer operate through Fenstanton on Sundays as these services are being withdrawn.

The 1A will no longer operate between Huntingdon and St Ives.

The **07.30** and 15.12 journeys between St Ives and Cambridge are being withdrawn and the 08.20, 09.10 and 15.10 buses will no longer operate between Cambridge and St Ives Monday to Friday.

There will be changes to departure times for most other journeys Monday to Friday and Saturdays.

NOVEMBER BULLETIN FROM CAMBRIDGESHIRE FIRE AND RESCUE SERVICE

The fire service highly recommends going to an organised firework display instead of holding one at home. However, if you do use fireworks or light a bonfire at home, we would ask residents to take on board our safety advice to ensure it is just their fireworks that go off with a bang:


Keep fireworks in a closed box and always follow the instructions.

- Light them at arms length using a taper and stand well back.
- Never go back to a lit firework.
- Never put fireworks in your pocket or throw them.
- Don't light bonfires in unsuitable weather, particularly in windy conditions.
- Don't leave bonfires unattended.
- Build bonfires well clear of buildings, fences and hedges.
- Never use flammable liquids to start the fire, and never burn dangerous rubbish such as aerosols, paint, foam furniture, rubber tyres, and batteries.
- Before you light the bonfire, check that children and animals are not hiding inside and are a safe distance away.



Christmas Fayre in Hilton



The Myth of Family Coats of Arms:



If you can imagine wearing a full suit of armour, complete with a helmet with tiny eye slits for vision, the combatants had a difficult time differentiating friend from foe. It was bad form to stick a broadsword into your friend's midsection, although that did happen occasionally in the heat of battle.

As a visual aid, the knights and a few other combatants started wearing brightly painted designs on their shields and elsewhere, designs that were known to their fellow combatants. The intent was to help their fellow soldiers distinguish friends from foe. The brightly coloured insignia was used on shields, on clothing, and on horse dressings.

Occasionally, a knight might have an attendant or two, such as a groomsman who tended the horse or even multiple horses. The attendant also might be a "squire;" a young apprentice who hoped to become a knight on his 21st birthday. The attendant might wear clothing with the same colours as his master, signifying that he was a part of "the team." However, such attendants normally did not wear armour.


If the knight had a close relative in battle as a soldier, such as his son, a brother, a nephew, or other relative, that relative never wore the same insignia as the first knight. In battle, sons never wore the same insignia as their fathers. Each had his own insignia and colours.

Off the battlefield, coats of arms were also used during tournaments to distinguish competitors. Knights, royalty, and a few wealthy individuals displayed their colourful crests and coats of arms as a symbol of themselves. In effect, the coat of arms said, "This is me." Coats of arms were never used to declare, "This is my family."

In the case of multiple sons, or when the father was still alive, all the sons could use similar coats of arms as their father but always added their own variations to the design. Each son created his own variations. These variations are called "cadency" and the son's insignia is referred to as "cadet coat of arms." When the father died, the oldest son removed his personal cadency, reverting the coat of arms back to his father's original design. The other sons kept their cadet coat of arms; they never used the father's original design. Daughters can also inherit the coat of arms if no sons are living.

In times past and even today, not every coat of arms can be used by everyone with that surname. First of all, not everyone with the same surname is related. I suspect there was more than one knight named Smith, and they certainly didn't want to wear the same coats of arms in battle, especially if they were on opposing sides! The rules always required that a coat of arms was for use by a single living individual, not a family. A coat of arms is similar to an individual's signature and was used as seals on official documents.




