#### **Fenstanton History By John Deeks**

#### Fenstanton and the Cholera Outbreak of 1831-32

In the summer of 1831 an outbreak of Cholera raged through Fenstanton and for a short time, this awful tragedy swept away whole families as you can see from the list of burials on the next page. The records suggest that it infected most of the village families, many of whom were suddenly cut down and in a few hours passed away So many in them were in the prime of their lives. From 1831 to 1833, Cholera arrived, ran its course and then disappeared again.



Cholera is a frightening disease that runs rapidly through a whole community leaving a trail of bodies in its wake. The disease is believed to have originated in India but soon it spread to England. These Victorian pandemics killed tens of thousands of people nationwide and here in Fenstanton we were gripped by Cholera four times in the 19<sup>th</sup> century.

Cholera was caused by drinking water that had been contaminated by human waste. Here in Fenstanton most house toilets drained directly into the soil. It only needed one infected person to use a village toilet for it to contaminate the local water supply. Where did the Cholera bacteria come from? St Ives was particularly badly hit by this disease due to their poor quality water supply and medieval sewage disposal. It would have only taken one Fenstanton villager to go to St Ives, drink the water and return home to contaminate the whole village. It could also have been a traveller on the Cambridge Road (old Roman Road) making use of village facilities! We will never know for sure.

Ignorance of the causes of the disease led many local communities to establish separate cholera graveyards for victims in an attempt to isolate the disease. During the outbreaks many victims were hastily buried without an individual memorial stone. Having said that, a few years ago when drains were being laid in the churchyard a pit of bones was found and popular theory was that it was a Bubonic plague pit. More likely, it would have been either a pauper's mass grave or a Cholera pit. No records exist to tell us the correct answer.

#### **PARISH COUNCILLORS**

At the Full Council meeting on 11 October members of the Council approved the cooption of Nigel Ferrier and welcomed him onto the Parish Council. However Cllr Crawshaw has tendered his resignation and there is therefore one vacancy. Please contact the Clerk or one of the Councillors (see the website) if you are interested in joining.

**Nigel** moved to Fenstanton just over 12 years ago. His company develops and delivers branding and marketing campaigns for a series of blue chip companies and some of you may know him from Fringe in the Fen which he established and delivers with a local committee. Nigel has extensive experience of many kinds of committee work and decided he would like to contribute to the work of the Parish Council after seeing that it has taken a change in direction with evidence of real and appropriate change. Nigel's recognises the challenges the Parish will face with the enlargement of the village after the new housing developments are complete.

#### UPDATE ON BUS TRANSPORT SERVICES FOR FENSTANTON

Following notification on Tuesday 9 October by Cambridgeshire County Council of the cancellation by Whippet Coaches of the busway route C as of 9<sup>th</sup> November 2018 and in particular to address the resulting negative impact of this decision on Fenstanton Parishioners, meaning:

First bus to St Ives - 09.27am Monday to Friday

No Buses to or from St Ives Saturday or Sunday

Last bus from St Ives - arrives in Fenstanton 17.26pm Monday to Friday

On Wednesday 10 October Fenstanton Parish Council:

Met with counterparts in St Ives Town Council, with the topic discussed at a Full Town Council Meeting:

Met with the Transport Manager at Cambridgeshire County Council; Met with and been in contact with counterparts from surrounding Parish Councils. As a result, and against a backdrop of a full transport review across the new Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Combined Authority currently underway by Mayor Palmer's office, a number of both interim and longer-term options are currently being investigated including:

Discussions with other bus service providers currently serving the Village providing additional services/extension to services between Fenstanton and St Ives; The possibility of a shuttle service between Fenstanton, St Ives Town Centre, St Ives P&R, Morrisons, underwritten by Morrison's transport fund;

The possibility of a community bus service linking Fenstanton to St Ives and surrounding villages;

The possibility of a Fenstanton Community car share scheme.

#### FENSTANTON PARISH COUNCIL

In light of this rapidly developing situation, we would urge all Fenstanton households to complete and return the bus survey as soon as possible, enabling the Parish Council to provide detailed evidence to Cambridgeshire County Council and the Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Combined Authority of the ongoing need for a regular and reliable bus service for the village.

#### **COMMUNITY BUS SURVEY**

This has now been delivered to every household (along with the Parish Council information booklet) in both North and South Fenstanton. Completed questionnaires are steadily being received at the office. If it is easier for you to leave in Ash's shop for later collection please do so. It is crucial that as many of you as possible return this form – although you may not use the buses regularly, young people trying to get to school or college, people trying to get to work in St Ives, Huntingdon and Cambridge, residents without cars, shoppers, people trying to get to events, dentists, surgeries etc in St Ives do rely on them. It is important for the health of the village that a bus service exists and to make that happen, we need your questionnaire back.

#### MICK GEORGE COMMUNITY FUND

The Parish Council has submitted its third application to this fund. The latest is for the complete refurbishment of the village pond, and the area surrounding it, so to that it can be restored to its former glory.

#### VILLAGE KERBS REMEDIAL WORKS

The required three quotes have been received for the work to Chequer Street and Honey Hill greens to prevent further erosion and damage by vehicles. A few further details are required but one of the quotes will be accepted at the next Full Council meeting.

### CIL (COMMUNITY INFRASTRCTURE LEVY) INVESTMENT AND FUTURE IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS FOR THE PARISH

At the Finance and Constitution meeting on 9 October, the proceedings were dominated by a full discussion on the protocol and mechanics for dealing with all suggestions for CIL investment (both from Councillors and residents) and appreciation was shown to Cllr Mitchell for all his work on the preparation of the protocol documents. Councillors will meet in the near future to work through all suggestions and establish a priority list. Consideration will also be given to all possible avenues for the Parish Council to apply for additional external funding. At the same meeting it was decided to ring-fence a sum of money to 'seed fund' the cycle-way, from The Fen down to the Busway, after Cllr Henderson met with a representative of CCC to discuss this project and received positive encouragement.

#### MEMORIAL GARDEN AT THE CEMETERY

In honour of this year's centenary of the First World War the Parish Council have arranged for the complete refurbishment of the small memorial garden, carrying out repairs where necessary to the surround and replacing the shrubs with flowering bedding plants. The area around the War Memorial will also be tidied up (we have been advised not to clean the Memorial again at this stage as it is constructed from soft stone; it is not long since it was cleaned).

#### CHURCH LEYS CAR PARK - Broken Fence

This is HDC responsibility and confirmation has recently been received that this will be repaired.

#### FENSTANTON PARISH COUNCIL

#### **HIGH STREET AND OTHER AREAS - Gullies**

A meeting has taken place with our Highways (CCC) representative and HDC Councillor David Mead to discuss the gullies. As a result of the reporting, submission of photographs and discussion at Parish Council meetings, this work was carried out rapidly. CCC has stressed that gullies in areas that do not flood will not be considered for clearing however these will be monitored. Please note that both CCC and HDC budget cuts mean that less work is being carried out and more work falling to the Parish Council which must stay within its own set budget constraints. The Parish Council will be working on a full contact list for residents' information so that they can, if they wish, report faults (such as pot holes) as multiple reporting may well help to secure a speedy resolution. CCC has also stressed that it will not carry out work for aesthetic reasons alone.

#### GRANT APPLICATIONS TO THE PARISH COUNCIL

These have been deferred to the Finance and Constitution Committee meeting on 8th November.

#### HISTORIC VILLAGE WHIPPING POST

The remains of the village whipping post have been treated and encased in oak for preservation. Plans will be worked up to display this in the original site – the village Clock Tower area – but in the meantime it will be kept in the Clerk's office and you are welcome to pop in to have a look at it should you be interested.

Knitted Poppies to Decorate St Ives For Remembrance Tide
It all started as a suggestion when a member of St Ives Royal British Legion
came over to talk to us whilst we were having a coffee in St Ives at the end
of last year's Poppy Appeal. The suggestion was that as 2018 will be a very
special year due, amongst other centenary celebrations, it will be the 100<sup>th</sup>
anniversary of the Armistice, the St Ives Town Hall should be decorated with
knitted poppies. Hence the start of the project that has now come to fruition.
This is purely due to the enthusiasm of ladies, I don't think we had any
gentleman knitters, from St Ives, Papworth Everard, Hilton, and Fenstanton,
numbering around 50 knitters in all. Together we knitted or crocheted more
than 4,000 poppies.

Monica, who spearheaded the project with help from friends suggested an Afternoon Tea for all the knitters, as a way of saying, "Thank you". The tea was organised for Friday 5<sup>th</sup> October in the Darlow Lounge in the Ivy Leaf Club, St Ives. In the morning the two pieces of netting with 1,000 poppies attached to each piece were opened out on the floor of the Darlow Lounge, there were many polystyrene wreaths covered in ribbon and then poppies, there were plant supports, you've guessed it, covered in poppies as well. As a special note the 2 plant holders in the picture are decorated with 179 poppies, which is the exact number of servicemen who gave their lives during WW1, from St Ives and district, and have been remembered on the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of their death, over the last 4 years. In total 46 ladies came along to see their mounted handy work and enjoy

the tea and a chat. We hope that all our knitters had a least heard about the tea and are sorry if you were unable to join us due to other commitments. Naturally the mounting of the poppy netting from the front of the Town Hall is weather dependant, but the plan is for this to be



carried out on 23<sup>rd</sup> October. By the time you read this St Ives will be suitably "Poppied".

#### Parish Council Meeting, 1<sup>st</sup> October 2018 A14

Highways England have announced that they intend to apply for motorway status for the new road. Mike Evans and John Birchall from Highways England are attending the next Parish Council meeting on Monday 5 November to discuss.

#### Cycle Path

An application has been made to the A14 Community Fund for a grant to fund further work on exploring the options of a cycle path between Hilton and Fenstanton. This will be further discussed at the next Parish Council meeting when the outcome of the grant application should be known.

#### Parish Council Paths

Work on the footpaths over the Green is agreed but final details of the work required are being discussed before the work will commence.

#### Firework Display

This will take place on Saturday 3 November 2018. Gates will open around 17:45 with the bonfire to be lit at 18:00 and fireworks at 19:00. Admission prices: £3 per adult and £1 for school aged children.

The bonfire site will be open for contributions from Hilton residents only from 9:00 until 13:00. Garden waste only, please no plastic, metal. The fireworks benefit again this year from a donation from the Hutton family.

#### **Reeves Ditch**

Highways England have been adding water to Reeves Ditch during the period when there was no rain in an effort to protect the wellbeing of the fish. The Parish Council would like to thank the parishioners who lobbied Highways England to undertake this task. Further discussion will take place in the coming months on what could be done to help water levels in the Ditch during periods such as these.

#### Local Buses

Hopefully you will have completed the survey, information on which was delivered to all households following the PC meeting in October. The PC will continue to liaise with other local parishes, through a group headed by St Ives Town Council to look if there are ways of addressing the reduction in local services.

#### **HGV** monitoring

The police have agreed that they will deploy an officer to monitor HGV's breaking the HGV ban and to look at the issue of speeding through the village.

#### **Precept**

The Parish Council will discuss further a proposal to increase the precept by 1.9% to £28,620 at the November meeting.

#### **HILTON ART CLUB**

September's workshop 'Drawing Exercises, Mark Making & Techniques' with Teresa Gabriel, was an excellent introduction to those of us who had never really used pencils before and a great refresher for those who had. Who knew you could do so much with a pencil?! Teresa started off with an introduction to different types of pencils and other markmaking tools (pens, charcoal, etc) and recommended making a tonal chart of your own to see all the different tones possible with even just a limited range of pencils. She then moved on to discussing and demonstrating the wide variety of marks and techniques you can use to determine shade and tone in order to create 3D shapes and depth in your drawings ... cross-hatching, circles, dots, blending, 'squiggles', lines ... following contours and shapes ... pressing harder or more lightly ... using different hardness of pencil etc. After some exercises to try out the techniques, Teresa gave us each a black & white copy of a photo of a man and we had to choose a piece of his face to draw. Cutting this piece out and sticking the rest of the picture on our paper/in our sketchbook, we then had to draw the missing piece using the variety of marks and techniques we had been practising. A very enjoyable morning. Thanks to Jenny and Kaye for the delicious cakes.

#### What is Feast Week?

The origins of Feast Week date back to the Middle Ages, when villagers would celebrate the feast of Mary Magdalene by bringing the community together and reflecting on helping each other.

The modern version of this is a week of events for the whole village, centred around a marquee on the village green. Feast Week usually begins on the last Sunday in July and kicks off with a parade of floats around the village, a produce show, a display of cars and motorcycles, songs of praise and continues all week with several evenings of cricket on the green, discos, fun activities for the children, entertainment for the whole family, village sports day, an art show and a big afternoon tea! Hilton Produce Show: The Dying of the Light



JMW Turner painted magnificent where boats sunsets buildings are ghostly presences against a backdrop of golden conveying a mood decaying grandeur. In autumn gardens, low sunlight irradiate plants to create a similar festival of light. Cotinus coggygria has wonderfully coppery-purple leaves which glow when back-lit by afternoon sun. The hosta. September Sun, is currently a ghostly spectacle fit for an artist.

Its leaves are a pale gold and so papery thin they are almost translucent.

On the subject of splendour in decay, how flowers bow out at the end of a season should be one of the performance-related questions when we invest in a new plant. The rose, Little White Pet, is aptly named for its cute button-shaped white flower and its attractive pink-rimmed buds. But, the dead heads are an unattractive sludgy brown. Unless speedily removed they are an eye-sore.

The vegetable garden is still a pleasant sight. Marigolds planted to deter aphids bloom on, the rhubarb is enjoying the damp remains of hurricane Leslie, a second planting of dwarf French beans has produced a crop, turnips need thinning out and green manure adds a bright fresh contrast to the runner beans Leslie knocked over. However, there, optimism ceases....soon it will all be over and as Jane Austen remarked "there is nothing so dismal as a cabbage patch in winter." So dear readers, avert your gaze!

Instead turn back to the season of "mellow fruitfulness" and make use of the apples from the store, so you can be warm inside. This apple offering is so simple, yet delicious. Peel, core and slice one to two pounds of cooking apples. Put in an oven proof dish. Sprinkle with brown sugar, tuck in a strip of lemon peel and scatter on the top layer a few shavings of butter. Finally and crucially, cover with baking paper.

Cook in a hot oven (180-200C) for about 20 minutes. Check progress. Then remove the paper for a further 5-10 minutes, allowing the top to caramalise. The dish is excellent hot with cream as a dessert or cold for breakfast, topped with yoghurt.

PS a smell of burning may indicate the baking paper has set alight, creating a different sort of autumn glow! Claire.
