Yet again we must thank the two organisers of our monthly talks for finding another interesting speaker for our October meeting.

Oscar Jeakings, the manager of the Godmanchester Community Nursery, explained its former origins as waste land, allotments, and now the cultivating of 5 acres mainly by around 30 volunteers. So far there is a Heritage orchard and Nuttery focussing on original Cambridgeshire fruits, a Potager garden of vegetables, and flower beds with no spraying, only the use of Nematodes. Under Oscar's knowledgeable leadership and among other varied projects, the team is supporting work on the Black Poplar, our rarest native timber tree which is threatened not least because there is only one male version and 2 females, the flowers of which last only 2 critical days. Also at the Nursery there are 'Muddy Mondays' where people are able to learn skills at different levels, a cafe named the Muddy Trout and more recently a multi use classroom has arrived.

Also, there is a long term project to create an apiary of bee hives, there's only one so far because those wonderful, hard working bees need a long time to fill their hive! Incidentally, we learned that bees hate bananas and become angry because its smell resembles that of a threat to the Queen Bee so they go into their protection procedure. The nursery is well worth a visit in person, it's close to the Black Bull pub in Godmanchester, or go to their informative website. This October is Hilton's turn to display a corner in the Huntingdon WI Federation Office where we chose a theme celebrating the reign of Her Majesty the Queen which we can say has been very much admired, even with a tear or two.

In November we will have another happy meeting with a return of the Upwood Ukulele group then our Christmas party in December - how varied a life we lead!



The Demise of Oaklands House:

Originally called The Oaklands, Oaklands House, got its name from the extensive oak forests that once covered that part of Fenstanton. The name, a few trees and a porter's lodge (now renamed Fenstanton Lodge!) are all that now remain of Oaklands, a large country house which stood on the corner of Conington Road and the High Street.



A large red brick building built in 1701; it was identical to Grove House. It was best known as the home of Thomas Coote and was sadly demolished in the early 1970s. The house had a very Victorian feel to it. There was a grand staircase leading to a gallery which ran right round the hall and dark paint was everywhere.

The grounds, which were extensive, (they were sliced through by the first bypass) included a shrubbery walk a mile long. The Keir estate recently built on what was known as the park originally formed part of these extensive gardens. The Tudor Hotel stands in what was once the kitchen gardens and the garden between the Tudor and the Swiss Cottage pond were the tennis courts.

The porter's lodge was the home of the gardener and there was a coachman's house in Conington Road. The property had several owners before Mr Coote, who extended and modernised it substantially and installed a billiard room.

In the late 1960s, the old Oaklands House was owned by Transmotels, who in turn were part of Edarn Ltd. Here they ran a café, transport café, fuel pumps and motel. A Mr & Mrs Hargreaves lived in the porters lodge, and were at one time employed at the Oaklands when it was a private house.

Before being purchased by Transmotels, the house was a private home with beautiful gardens; fountains played and people walked amongst the fairy lights twinkling and reflected in the various pools. The house had extensive cellars which were later filled with china, removed from the rooms when they were converted into bedsitters and flats.

The stables and coach house in Conington Road were converted to take several beds for lorry drivers, both upstairs and downstairs. Mrs Hargreaves cleaned and changed beds and Mr Hargreaves kept the gardens tidy. It was a sad sight when it was reduced to a café cum petrol station and a bed and breakfast drop in.

When the house was demolished it proved very resilient and in desperation the demolition team set fire to it to complete the process. The cellars were filled with rubble and covered in, probably still there to this day. One wonders if the new house occupants have dug up any of the old china. Before the destruction an auction was held to sell off items that had survived and local people still have some of these. The tower clock was sold to a farmer in Cottenham

The gardens were home to a tribe of squirrels; poor creatures ran about when many of the old trees were cut down. It was such a very sad end for an elegant house

There were a number of owners after Mr Coote; the Rev Frewer, Mr Saunders, Miss Ackroyd and finally Mr Fletcher. In the 20th century there was a nursery class held there for children of better off parents by Miss Vera Saunders john.deeks@ntlworld.com



Hilton Community Garden wins National Garden Society award

The Community Garden was delighted to receive the award from Jenny Miles, the County Organiser of the yellow book scheme. The award paid for the setting up of the polytunnel and the solar irrigation system. The Community Garden was started in February 2021, and the plot has been transformed over the last 20 months with raised beds, a fruit cage, trugs, a wild flower garden, small ponds and bird feeders. Every Saturday there are working parties with participants taking vegetables and flowers home at the end of the session. The photo shows some of the gardeners, with the chair, Heather Chambers, being presented with the plaque by Jenny Miles. Heather said "It has been amazing to be part of this garden and to see people from the community coming together to enjoy being outside, working together and enjoying the produce from the garden".

Hilton Parish Council has resolved to apply for a grant to purchase a foldaway table tennis table to be kept in the pavilion, but which can also be used outside. This should be paid for by a grant in full.

Latest news from Fenstanton Parish Council

Play Area—Repairs

Your Parish Council has placed an order to have a new replacement trampoline mat and scramble net fitted at the metal park. We are currently waiting to hear from the supplier for a date for the work to be carried out.

Your Parish Council has also made arrangements to have repairs made to some of the surface areas across all the play areas.

The play areas will need to be closed whilst the work is being carried out. We apologise for any inconvenience caused.

Local Highway Initiatives (LHI)

Chequer Street

Your Parish Council has been informed by CCC that unfortunately there are BT services beneath one of the planned parking bays, these would be very costly to move. Therefore, a new way forward has been agreed. Parking bays 2 and 3 will go ahead as planned, with reinforced soil at the western end.

Cambridge Road

Your Parish Council recently submitted a privately funded LHI for a HGV weight limit for Cambridge Road to stop the overnight parking. CCC have advised the Parish Council that this is not an appropriate restriction and would not be supported by the Police. Whilst your Parish Council consider other options it has taken the opportunity

to invite Derek Crosby –Police
Traffic Management Officer to our
next meeting in the hope that he
can provide some guidance going
forward.

London Road

CCC has provided three options to make safety changes to London Road. Your Parish Council has approved an option, but this will need to be discussed and approved by Hemingford Parish Council before this can be confirmed with CCC.

20MPH

Your Parish Council has approved the design for the 20mph zone for the Village.

CCC will now move forward and take the next steps towards implementation.






