

FENSTANTON PARISH COUNCIL—9th SEPTEMBER 2010

<u>Police report</u>.-the following incidents had been reported to the Police:-1 incident of criminal damage, 1 attempted theft, 3 incidents of theft, 3 incidents of obtaining fuel without paying. Although the number of reported incidents is low the Parish Council urges Parishioners to report any suspicious behaviour to the Police. Telephone 03454564564, Crimestoppers can be contacted on 0800555111 or in an emergency 999.

<u>Speedwatch.</u> The meeting was concerned to learn that a member of the Speedwatch team had been holding records of vehicles which had been speeding. This came to the notice of the Parish Council after it was reported that the person concerned had falsely accused a Parishioner of speeding and taking actions beyond his remit as a Speedwatch volunteer. The Parish Council will contact the Police and seek assurances that records are not kept by individual members of Speedwatch and that they are, under no circumstances, permitted to contact those caught speeding. The Parish Council was not aware that the policy of volunteers not operating in their own Parish had changed. The Parish Council has also demanded that they are kept advised of any future policy changes. The Speedwatch volunteer concerned has since resigned.

<u>Winter gritting arrangements</u>-The County Council has provided details of its winter gritting arrangements. Hilton Road, as in previous years, is not included in the arrangements but due to the volume of traffic the meeting felt it should be included. The recommendation will be forwarded to County Council Highways.

<u>Parking</u>.-Complaints have been received from Parishioners concerning vehicles parking and obstructing the bus stop opposite the Tudor. This can cause problems particularly for the elderly when waiting for the bus or boarding. The Parish Council would, therefore, request that drivers are considerate when they park. Whilst the Parish Council is aware of the problem residents' encounter with on street parking, residents are requested to refrain from parking on green areas , verges and footpaths.

<u>Hedges and bushes</u>.-As Autumn marches swiftly towards us Parishioners are requested to ensure that any bushes or hedges that border their property are trimmed back and do not overgrow the footpath.

Next Meeting.-The next meeting of Fenstanton Parish Council will be held on **Thursday 14th October 2010 at 7:30pm** at Fenstanton and Hilton Primary School, School Lane, Fenstanton. Members of the press and public are welcome.

FENSTANTON WI

We belted out Jerusalem to open our meeting on Thursday 2nd September to honour our friend and Secretary Beryl Harvey who died on August 17th. It was very poignant for all of us as Beryl had attended our last meeting. The W.I. had served refreshments after her funeral that afternoon and our thanks to all of the ladies who supported this.

Our President Claire Barrett was on holiday so Pam Hucklesby took the meeting and Val Spain stepped in as Secretary, Mrs. Fiona Lucraft, full of enthusiasm and a very strong voice gave a talk on Food and Dining from 1900 to 1950. She showed us how the study of food and diet reflected the huge changes that took place in our social history. In the early 1900's we had a very strict class system. Fiona had menus from the Titanic for 1 st class, 2nd class and 3rd class passengers. The 1st class menu had about 10 courses with many dishes named in French although even then American influences were creeping in with such names as Waldorf salad. The 2nd class menu was written in plain English with fewer courses while the 3rd class menu had basic meals such as tripe and onions. The authorities were alerted to the poor health of the lower classes when they started to recruit men for service in the First World War. They discovered that the average height was 5 feet which was 6 inches less than when they recruited for the Boer War 19 years before, 60% were rejected for heart, hearing or sight problems and the majority had very bad teeth. One possible reason was our national beverage tea! This had replaced the drinking of beer which is very nutritious. A manual worker needed more calories so added a lot of sugar to their tea.

Rationing of food was not introduced until 1918 because it was thought it would be bad for morale during wartime. However it was thought to be better that everyone could have a fair share of food and at the onset of the Second World War it was re-introduced. People became more self-sufficient; digging up gardens and having allotments to grow food. After the War a lot of women decided to keep on working rather than stay at home. In the 1950's the first signs appeared of what was to come. In 1950 the first supermarket, Sainsbury's in Croydon was opened. In 1955 the first Wimpy was opened and Fish Fingers appeared in the shops. Now the pendulum seems to be turning with people preferring home-grown fresh vegetables and demand for allotments is increasing.


