

Police report. The most recent information available is for the months of June and July which indicated the following reported incidents: 6 incidents of anti social behaviour,

3 burglaries, 1 violent crime, 2 other unspecified crimes.

The meeting was advised that an increase in burglaries in the District had become apparent. The Parish Council urges Parishioners to be vigilant and report any suspicious behaviour to the Police. Telephone 0345 456 456 4, Crimestoppers can be contacted on 0800 55 51 11 or in an emergency 999.

<u>Cemetery lighting</u> During the summer a light was installed in the Cemetery. With the evenings now beginning to shorten it is expected the benefit will become evident over the next months.

<u>Preparation for the winter.</u> Information had been received from the County Council wishing to build on the support that has been received from local authorities and individuals during the last two winters.

Liability regarding third party claims against individuals who clear snow has always raised concern. However, the County Council "confirms that anyone who clears from outside their own or somebody else's property would only be liable for an accident if their efforts actually made the pavement less safe than it was with the snow and ice undisturbed and as a result someone is injured". In view of this statement the meeting hoped that Parishioners and businesses would be more receptive to keeping the footpaths in front of their premises clear of snow and ice should another severe winter be encountered.

<u>Volunteers wanted!</u> Following a request to the Huntingdonshire Countryside Rangers to review the condition of the Village pond we are advised that a small amount of work needs to be undertaken to take back some of the reed. We are, therefore, asking for volunteers to help with the task, which is planned for Saturday 1st October. For safety reasons unaccompanied children under the age of 12 can not take part. If you are interested please come to the pond at 10:00. We expect work to be completed by 13:00.

<u>Hedges, bushes and trees</u>. As autumn approaches we request that residents ensure that any hedges, bushes, trees and other vegetation from the property is cut back and does not overhang or overgrow footpaths or the road.

CONSULTATION ON THE REVIEW OF THE DECISION TO REMOVE ALL SUBSIDISED BUS SERVICE FUNDING

About 80% of the Cambridgeshire bus services are provided by commercial operators without subsidy, but some services are unable to operate on a commercial basis. Subsidies may soon not be available. The Council needs to save around £540 million over the next 5 years and some of these savings will have to come from the transport budget.

Reviews are being carried out as part of this years budget planning, and we are seeking views on the principle of making cuts. Also looking back at the routes that have already been cut and gathering feedback on how this has affected communities in these areas.

Your views are an important part of this process.

FENSTANTON WI

When Mr John Shepperson was allowed to choose the spot to bury The Millenium Time Capsule for Swavesey he chose a spot on the Green in Market Street near the house known as the Coal House. As the dig went deeper he found what he was hoping for; coal dust. It was the proof he needed that Swavesey once had docks and waterways that linked up to the River Ouse. From his research he knew that Swavesey had been a thriving market town from medieval times.

Fred Housego included Swavesey in a TV Programme 'History on Your Doorstep' in 1982. We watched the video which started with a visit to the Parish Church. The oldest part of the church was built in the recognisable style of the Anglo-Saxons. It was later extended in the 13th century with a large stained glass window. A second church also with a large window was joined on in the 15th century. The original church was part of the priory which was mentioned in the Domesdav Book. Aerial photographs showed clearly what John had suspected from the lumps and bumps in surrounding fields that it was a site of a medieval village. We also saw a mound on which once stood a wooden palisade castle.

Marauding barons burnt cornfields and seized valuables so for safety people

abandoned the village and moved nearer to Market Street. Turnbridge in the High Street is another name for drawbridge and again aerial photographs clearly show that there was a moat that went all round the town. The moat is still there to this day except for one small section where a factory has been built. You can still follow its path even though it has become overgrown and silted up.

The draining of the Fens lowered the water levels in the drains and in 1847 when the railway came it took away trade from the river and the once prosperous market town went into decline.

FEN DRAYTON LAKES

Summer seems to be a rapidly fading memory now, but it was busy for the team who help me, particularly with the Deadly Dozen bug hunts and Lake Dipping. We had some lovely afternoons with intrepid young wildlife enthusiast



(or at least most of them were intrepid), highlighted by seeing water scorpions in the lake and a huge elephant hawkmoth caterpillar amongst willow-herbs, which it eats.

Just before the schools broke up, two classes from Fenstanton and Hilton Primary School spent a day with our field teachers, learning about wildlife under the lake surface and in the grassy areas nearby, and occasionally being distracted by a passing guided bus. We were also visited by a class from Houghton.

The teachers, pupils and classroom assistants have had lots of good things to say about their days with us, and we'd love to have more local schools coming to use our facilities. If any teachers are reading this, we can accommodate classes all year round, although we'd expect warmer days during summer term.

We've added new facilities in various locations around the Lakes over the summer months. There's a birdwatching hide overlooking Moore Lake – access is from the footpath that goes around Elney Lake.

We also have three viewing shelters, which will be completed when we get thatch on the roofs. These look over Oxholme Lake (near the guided bus stop), Ferry Lagoon and Ferry Mere.

We'll be installing cycle racks by the Oxholme Lake shelter, for the benefit of cyclists who arrive on their bikes using the track alongside the busway. National Cycle Route 51 will be rerouted to use this track, once it has been raised and given a tarmac surface.

Although the notices placed by the contractors working on the track say "this area is closed", they only refer to the busway access (cycle) track, and not any of the other paths around the lakes. We're still open for visitors, and will have our information point in Holywell Lake car park every Saturday and Sunday in October. Why not join us for more star watching, fungus foraying, or a nature walk?
