Please see below the message sent out to all the Royal British Legion community, from Jason Coward Royal British Legion National Chairman.

Dear All.

It is with deepest sorrow that the Royal British Legion marks the death of our Sovereign and Patron, Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. The Queen has served as Patron of the Royal British Legion since 6 February 1952. We are immensely thankful for her faithful service, and we join the entire Armed Forces community in mourning her loss. Her unreavering commitment to the Armed Forces will be deeply missed and our sincere condolences are with the Royal Family at this time.

The Queen has always maintained a close relationship with the British Armed Forces. She was herself a veteran, having served in the Second World War as a driver and mechanic with the Auxiliary Territorial Service. Upon her ascension to the throne, she became Commander-in-Chief and Head of the British Armed Forces and those of the Commonwealth Realm. She was known for her devotion to the Armed Forces and her keen interest in their affairs, serving as an inspiration to them all.

The Queen attended her first performance of the Royal British Legion Festival of Remembrance as 19-yearold Princess Elizabeth in 1945. As Queen, she attended every performance but for three, when she was either in childbirth with Prince Charles, on Commonwealth tow, or experiencing ill health.

I had the honour of meeting Her Majesty on several occasions, during my time as a student at Royal Holloway College, during the centenary of Barnardo's when as Patron she visited our new head office, and more recently during my time with the Royal British Legion as a Trustee. Her commitment and support for the RBL and the armed forces family it supports was palpable and always provided a positive boost for all those of us lucky enough to meet her.

We now offer our whole hearted support of our new King, His Majesty King Charles III.





The part Fenstanton played in the Spanish Armada.

Researched and written by Miss Gertrude Peet in 1922 at Cambridge University Library and edited by John Deeks 2022

We have just realised what it means to see those of our village leave us to go to fight to save our country (here she refers to WW1). At this period there were only sailing vessels and the use of gunpowder had first been used for military purposes just a few hundred years before. Fighting men had flintlocks to fire the guns with, tinder boxes were in use to obtain a light; matches were yet to be invented. The weapons used were pikes, sword, qualivee (a type of gun) musket, halberd and possibly Arquebus.

There were no railroads, no telephones and no telegrams. Yet I will tell you how, in a few hours, news was carried from end to end of England. How Fenstanton forwarded the news in her turn onwards and eastward. First there was the worrying news, then the call to arms and then the news of victory.

In the 31st year of Queen Elizabeth's reign, Phillip II of Spain, the surviving husband of Queen Mary (Mary was Elizabeth's sister and had been queen of England before Elizabeth) prepared to invade England, hoping to conquer it and become king and again, establish the Roman Catholic faith in the country. For four years Phillip had been secretly and quietly preparing a fleet of ships for this invasion, (just as our German neighbours were doing for years for this last Great War, WW1). This Spanish fleet consisted of 130 ships, 30,655 officers and men, 2,080 galley slaves, 90 hangmen and executioners.

Our English Royal Navy that had to meet these ships consisted of 34 ships, but privateers were willingly supplied by towns and individuals. London sent 30 ships, double the number required. The nobility and gentry supplied 43 more (ships). So England got together 191 vessels in order to prevent the Spanish landing. They were much smaller vessels than those of the Spanish navy. The channel fleet was under the command of Lord Howard of Effingham.

Anxiously watching the direction of the great Toseland beacon, which probably would be the first beacon to forward the signal from the west or south, to these parts. The signal meant 'the Spanish are coming', soldiers and men, go and meet them. Preparations were carefully made, from every shire, from every town, from every village, from every hamlet in the land, the most stalwart, the picked men went out and marched as ordered, to meet the enemy, known to be better equipped than them and composed of the best experienced troops in the world.

The first twittering of a storm came on April 6th 1588 and from Fenstanton ten men went, a similar number from Hilton, their names with the arms they carried have been recorded. I want you to picture the Fenstanton men going along the road to join the main army, joining with the seven men from Hilton, and on the way other villages adding their few men, all hasting to the main camp at St Neots eight miles away. Mother's hearts were the same then as now, the wives and children would be there to see them start.

After all the soldiers from different villages had assembled at St Neots and their names and arms had been listed they marched to London via Cambridge. Many (mothers, wives, children) would travel the great Roman road that runs from Fenstanton to Cambridge. The

ten miles would soon be travelled in the hope to see their loved ones more before the battle, who could tell what might happen later?

On the 17th June, matters increased. Fenstanton together with other villages had the order, "all captains are to be ready to start at an hours warning". On the 22nd June, again a special order to Fenstanton and all villages "the beacons to be watched by men of good discretion and substance". This order meant it would not do to give the care of the beacon into the charge of any Roman Catholics, who could not be trusted to be loyal to this country.

On the 19th July the Spanish fleet entered the English Channel and on the 20th it appeared in sight of the English, who let it roll up the channel so that our navy was behind it. Keeping at a distance the little English ships pored their shots into the great Spanish ships, the Spanish replied with their heavy guns, but from the height of their decks their shots passed clean over the English ships. On their way up the channel the Spanish lost several ships.

On the 27th July they anchored off Calais, during the night of the 27th the English sent eight fire ships in amongst the anchored Spanish fleet. This so alarmed the Spanish admiral that he ordered the anchor cables to be cut, a panic seized the Spanish, some ships caught fire and others drifted against each other. Lord Effingham, was not the man to lose his opportunity, he fell on the disabled fleet and destroyed 12 ships. The great armada was now in full flight, it could not get through the English fleet and run home down the channel, the way it had come, so the Spanish decided not to attempt to conquer the English fleet by giving battle, but to sail home the best way it could by going round Scotland.

High winds and a storm arose, seventeen Spanish ships were wrecked on the west coast of Ireland and many were never heard of again. So that fifty-two battered hulks were all that returned to three Spanish ports, of that magnificent armada which was boastfully called "the invincible armada" that took four years to build, but was defeated in a week.

The magnificent dress that Queen Elizabeth wore when she road on horseback to review her troops at Tilbury which included the men from Fenstanton and Hilton can still be seen preserved in the Tower of London.

So we hope that the men of Fenstanton and Hilton returned home feeling like most Englishmen did, 'thankful for the victory'. On the 24th a public thanksgiving service was ordered by Queen Elizabeth and no doubt all in Fenstanton (and Hilton) attended the service in the parish church. Queen Elizabeth publically attended the Thanksgiving service that day at St Pauls.





Local Weather Watch

What a year 2022 is turning out to be. Whenever extreme weather events occur these days, perhaps one's first reaction is to think they are a consequence of climate change. For those of us with longer memories, summer this year has evoked thoughts of 1976, etched in the mind for its prolonged drought and heat. To think back then there were theories that we could be facing a mini ice-age! However to put this years weather and that of 1976 in context, one needs to go back 100 years to 1921 when England was gripped by an extraordinary drought, making it the driest year on record since 1788. Then, like now, the weather pattern was one of high pressure systems from the Azores remaining stuck for long periods deflecting any rain bearing systems to the north of the UK. Then, as now, the south-east of England suffered most from the extreme conditions, where several locations recorded an annual total of barely 10 inches (250mm) less than half of the normal total. Margate recorded just 9.29 inches (236mm) the lowest ever annual rainfall recorded in the UK. So far this year up to 10 August, I have recorded just over 8 inches of rain.

Returning to 1921, June was very warm, with no rain and July was very hot, very sunny and very dry. As The Times lamented "Day after day of these African conditions is proving a severe strain on the English constitution". Oddly August was rather unsettled that year, only the second time in the twentieth century that happened after a fine June and July. In 1976 the drought and heat continued to the end of August. When rain finally fell, people just stood in the rain to enjoy the experience! One of the wettest autumns recorded followed. This year we have already had a number of heat waves with new national high temperature records set for each country in the UK on July 19. 40.3C (104F) now stands as the new UK record at Coningsby in Lincolnshire.

So when did the drought end in 1921? August? Most definitely not. September was another warm, dry month and in October there was an exceptional heatwave with 25C (77F) exceeded eight times in the first ten days, with two days reaching 28.9C (84F). A truly remarkable year. No mention of climate change then.

Report from the Meeting of the Council dated Monday 5th September LHI Bid



The Council has resolved that it will submit a Local Highways Improvement (LHI) Fund bid for the 2023/24 round for improved signage regarding the 7.5t weight limit on the A1198 approaching from Papworth Everard and for a raised Zebra crossing on Potton Road. NATS

As you may be aware, NATS (National Air Traffic Services) and London Luton Airport have enacted the Swanwick Airspace Improvement Programme, which separates the Stansted and Luton arrival flows and extends the flight path for the approach into Luton into airspace above the Cambridge area. This has led to an increase in air traffic over Hilton, with the resulting increase in noise.

The implementation of the Programme is now at its final stage, with the Civil Aviation Authority conducting a 12-month Post-Implementation Review examining how the airspace change has performed, and whether the anticipated impacts and benefits have been delivered.

Anyone with a noise complaint can use Luton airport's TraVis (https://www.london-luton.co.uk/corporate/community/noise/making-a-noise-complaint) system to make a report online, whether about noise in general or a specific noise incident. To report other environmental disturbances, phone 01582 395382 or email noise.enquiries@ltn.aero.

Fish

Hilton Parish Council has been advised by the Environment Agency that the pond known as Reeve Ditch on the High Street is not suitable for a fish population and that the pond is not restocked with the fish removed during the recent drought. The Clerk will contact the persons who are currently holding the fish to establish whether they can retain them.

Health Inequalities

The Council has resolved to accept the Hunts Forum Health Inequalities funding and has appointed a working group for this project. This involves an initial grant of £2,500 to conduct community engagement to establish where there is a need in the village and propose a funding bid for up to £8,000 to address this need.

Batteries

Hilton Parish Council approved a request from Hilton Action on Traffic (HAT) to purchase replacement batteries for the vehicle monitoring devices and vehicle activated signs at a cost of £213.52 +VAT. HAT has agreed to send copies of the weekly data received to the Clerk.

Conferences

The Clerk and Chairman attended the recent Huntingdonshire District Council Conference for Parish Councils. The PC has authorised the Clerk to attend the Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Association of Local Councils (CAPALC) 'Share the Vision, Shape the Future' Conference at a cost of £75. The Clerk and Emergency Officer will also attend the Cambridgeshire Flood Groups Conference Day, which is a free event.

RBL Donation

Hilton Parish Council has resolved to donate £60 to the Royal British Legion Poppy Appeal.

Village Hall Management Committee

Hilton Parish Council would like to thank the members of the Village Hall Management Committee who are stepping down after many years' service.

SLCC

The Council has resolved to renew its membership of the Society of Local Council Clerks at a cost of £171.

National Association of Local Councils' Civility and Respect Pledge

Hilton Parish Council has resolved to sign this pledge and that it agrees that the council will treat councillors, clerks, employees, members of the public, and representatives of partner organisations and volunteers with civility and respect in their roles.

Bonfire Night

The Council has decided that the Fireworks and Bonfire Night will take place on Saturday 5th November and has approve the spend on Fireworks up to the budgeted amount of £1,800.

GARDEN NOTES: Seedy Beauty

There are two left: one nodding above the other plants, the other leaning earthwards. They have lasted since May and are the seed-heads of two Alliums: giganteum and christophii.

Alliums, as your nose will tell you, are members of the onion family. Planted as bulbs in the autumn they flower every year with bold purple domes each made up of +/-50 tiny star-shaped flowers. Don't we love trouble-free plants...? Ones which have different phases and aren't just one trick ponies are especially welcome. So Alliums reward with the colour purple when little else in the garden is flowering, followed by the bonus of the equally dramatic seed heads.

Christophii is amazing because the flower head is huge, and sometimes looks like a spinning plate on its short stem. As the seed head and stem dry out, it can lean like the Pisa tower but brought inside for the winter it looks wonderful in a vase, with Sputnik like

spikes and airy gaps between. Sprayed with silver for a Christmas decoration it looks even more like a space craft.

Poppies also produce delightful seeds. The dying leaves can look dispiriting, but Monty, of Gardeners' World, runs a gloved hand up the stem to take away the leaves, leaving just the seed head to nod and bob amongst other tall, flowering plants. They look brilliant sprayed gold and go well with the space craft. Allowing some seeds to stay around in the flower bed into autumn ensures a poppy display the following year.

Another plant which lives and dies gracefully is Honesty (lunaria). The best one to have is the variegated type. The heart-shaped leaves are prettily edged with white and contrast well with the red-purple flowers. After the early display of colour, the seed heads form in elliptical, lollipop shapes of a papery thinness. You can see the seed capsules contained in these lollipops which turn a slightly tea-stained dingy brown as the seasons advance. To use them indoors in a flower arrangement you have to peel off the front and back covers of each of the papery ovals. Helpfully the plant provides a fine tip to hang onto as you gently draw off the covers. The actual seeds (six from my demo model) fall out to be cast on the ground to provide unexpected pleasure next year because I'll have forgotten where they landed.

A little delicacy is required to remove the outer layers, but I love finding the translucent silky lining: it will light up a winter room. Lunaria from moonlight, but Honesty because of its transparency....it's all in the name!
