Parish Council Report

Fenstanton

Police report.

During the period 10th June to 8th July 2008 the following incidents had been reported to the Police :-1 burglary;.1 theft from a motor vehicle; 1 theft from a garage.

A number of burglaries have been reported in the District where entry has been gained through open windows and unlocked doors. In one case the property was entered whilst the owner was in the garden. Parishioners are, therefore, reminded to lock doors, close windows and remain vigilant

Appointment of a Parish Tree Warden.

The Parish council is looking for a volunteer to assume the role of Tree Warden. The principle objective is to promote interest in the environment by tree planting and liaising between county and national groups on projects. If you are interested please contact the Clerk.

Closure of the Swavesey – Over – Willingham Road.

With the construction of the Guided Busway comes disruption to our local roads. The Swavesey – Over – Willingham road will be reduced in single lane traffic from 4th August until 8th September. During this period traffic lights will be in operation. The road will, however be closed for the period 8th September until approximately 27th October. The alternative route will be via the Rampton Road.

Hedges

Residents are reminded that the height of hedging at the front of properties must not exceed 1m whilst the height at the sides of properties must not exceed 2m. The climatic conditions this summer has meant hedges, trees and bushes have grown at a tremendous rate. This is now a suitable time, as the bird nesting season is over, to ensure that any hedges, bushes or trees that are over growing footpaths are cut back.

Reduced Stagecoach Bus Service.

As many Parishioners will be aware, Stagecoach introduced a new timetable effective from 24th August offering a much reduced service to Cambridge, St Ives and Huntingdon. No consultation between the Parishes affected was undertaken and the announcement made in a very low key manner in the middle of July. The timing of the announcement has meant that the Parish Council has not had the opportunity to discuss the issue and formulate a suitable response. The matter will, however, be discussed at the next meeting. The Chairman and individual Councillors have expressed extreme concern at the decision and a strongly worded letter has been sent to Mr Campbell, Managing Director, Stagecoach Cambridge. An invitation has also been extended to Mr Campbell to attend the next Parish Council Meeting and explain the rationale behind the decision. It is felt, however, that any attendance or explanation is extremely unlikely. It is possible to make your opinion known by writing to Mr Campbell at 100 Cowley Road, Cambridge CB4 0DN. 

Fenstanton WI

You don't have to watch nature programmes on TV to witness wonderful sights such as a cloud of starlings making fantastic patterns in the sky as they arrive at dusk to roost in the reeds overnight. They are on our doorstep at Fen Drayton Lakes nature reserve. At our July meeting Mr. Neil Renwick gave an interesting talk with slides about Fen Drayton Lakes. If you want to hear a Cuckoo that is the place to go as they use the nests of Reed Warblers to lay their eggs. In Spring you can watch Great Crested Grebes perform their elaborate courtship dances. As well as high numbers of ducks such as Wigeons, Pintails and Pochards there was a pair of Avocets that nested on Elney Lake. Unfortunately the nest was washed away in the floods. Hopefully the pair will return next year. The reeds attract numerous butterflies, dragonflies and damselflies. There is something of interest to see all through the year and we all decided we would visit more often. At our August meeting Mrs. Anna Upton gave us an intriguing glimpse of Latvia during and after the Russian occupation. Latvia is a flat wooded country with lakes and rivers. It is an arable farming country with pigs and chickens but no sheep and few cattle. Latvia was always under the control of Germany, Russia or Denmark throughout its history. It was only independent between the two World Wars until again in 1991 it became independent after being under Russian occupation. In World War II the Germans invaded and conscripted many of the young men into their army. Anna's father was one of those and later was taken as a prisoner of war. Her mother's family had fled just before war broke out and settled in Brighton. After the War her father couldn't return home to the rest of his

family because Latvia was now held by Russia. Anna was brought up to speak the Latvian language and taught about all the old customs. Latvians in this country met up to celebrate their festivals such as on Mid-Summer Night. Meanwhile the Red Cross found news of relatives and they were able to exchange letters which were very heavily censored. When Anna did visit Latvia in 1993 it was as if it had been in a time capsule for 50 years. Farms were subsistence living using horses to pull ploughs. Houses were dilapidated and there were only dirt roads which made travel difficult. There were hardly any shops in the capital city Rega and rickety old trams. Latvia is now a member of the E.U. and is beginning to prosper with tourism very important to its economy. The churches were left alone under Russian occupation and tourists can buy amber jewellery, engraved marquetry tankards and plates and leather goods. Anne Groome gave the vote of thanks and said that she had been to Latvia and highly recommended it as a holiday destination.

Claire thanked everyone who helped and supported our stall on Sports Day. We are looking forward to our Summer Dinner at the George & Dragon at Elsworth.

As some of you may recall local gentleman Jack Dady died towards the end of 2006. Jack had himself been a keen Scout, as entries in his book clearly show. He was a regular attendee at numerous scouting events, including the annual Big Breakfast, and using Scout Christmas Post for his local Christmas card deliveries.

We were able to send several representatives, young and old, to the service of thanksgiving for Jack's life, held in Fenstanton in January 2007. It was there and then we decided that we needed to find some fitting way to pay tribute to the great supporter of scouting Jack had been during his 93 years.

The Group has decided to present an Award for each Section at the AGM each year. The Award is for the young person who has, in the leaders opinion, most reflected the scouting "spirit" which we expect from those who are out to make the most from their time with our Scout Group. This stems in no small part from the Promise and Law that each young person is expected to make and live up to, and their attitude and approach to the opportunities we offer.

Hilton Action on Traffic Group (HAT)

HAT was set up, at the request of the Parish Council, in response to ongoing concerns about through traffic in Hilton.

A day time survey of traffic passing through the village on B1040 was carried out on 12 July 2008. Detailed results can be viewed on Village notice boards and on hiltonvillage.com website.

During a twelve hour period between 06:00 and 18:00 a total of 5,298 motorised vehicles were observed. This is 3% higher than counted in last survey in July 2006. The breakdown was 76% cars, 14% Light Goods Vehicles, 8% Heavy Goods Vehicles, 1% Buses and 1% other motor vehicles. 530 cars per hour were passing through during the commuter rush hours 7am-8am and 4am-6pm. This is a massive 21% increase in only two years. Many thanks go to Margaret Shardlow and her team of volunteer observers for their painstaking work on this survey.

Future traffic counts will include rush hour counts on Graveley Way.

On 4th June a number of Hilton residents explained Hilton's problems with speeding at the St Ives Area Neighbourhood Police Consultation Panel. It is encouraging that there have since been a number of Police road side speed checks to identify speeding motorists and lorry drivers. However, the deterrent effect of such checks is inevitably extremely short lived and we will continue to press for the speed limits to be enforced 24/7.

The existing traffic calming is not working and speeding is a major issue. Hilton Parish Council has submitted a bid for 2009/2010 funding from Cambridgeshire County Highways Jointly Funded Minor Improvement Scheme for physical speed reduction road engineering measures. However, the funds available within this scheme are very limited and HAT will continue to pursue all avenues that can lead to a comprehensive and effective solution.

Highways Agency has advised that a final decision on the configuration of a junction on A1198 with the new A14 (south of Wood Green) will not be made until late September 2008. Highways Agency favour a part junction with only west facing slip roads to/from A14. Our view is that on balance there are no obvious advantages to Hilton in this junction and there could be a number of disadvantages in terms of the volume of traffic transiting Hilton. We are working with the A14 Action Group and Parish Council to press for an early meeting with Highways Agency to gain further information and to express our concerns.

Fen Drayton Lakes

Watch the bramble patches and hawthorn hedges at this time of year – various warblers, robins, blackbirds and song thrushes will be eating the ripe berries. The warblers will be building up energy stores in preparation for their journeys to the Mediterranean region, or even further south, beyond the Sahara Desert. Butterflies will be sipping nectar from late flowers, or the juice from burst fruit – look out for the bright orange-and-brown comma butterfly – its wings look ragged, even when new, but this helps them blend into surrounding foliage when the wings are closed.

When birds get to the end of the nesting season, adults are worn out, in several ways. Adult birds have spent much energy foraging and feeding their offspring throughout daylight hours – and for robins and blackbirds, that may have been three broods since the spring. Their feathers have worn out too, often abraded as they enter and leave their nests through holes or against twigs. Birds replace most of their feathers annually, after nesting, so that they have strong, new feathers to help them through the coming cold winter weather, or on their long migration flights.

Growing new feathers requires a lot of energy, so birds save energy by not singing. They need to be extra cautious while they do not have a full set of flight feathers, as they cannot fly so well, and are therefore more vulnerable to predators of all kinds.

Little egrets are now being seen regularly at Fen Drayton Lakes, with 22 recorded recently. These members of the heron family have pure white feathers, are about the size of a carrion crow, and may be seen feeding or resting at lake edges, or in flight. Construction work for the guided busway will have an impact on many visitors over the next few months, as the drain culverts are strengthened before the tracks are laid. We will always be open to visitors, and ask you to follow any path diversions that are set up, to take visitors safely around the works.

Most of our canine visitors are well behaved, and their owners clean up after them, for which we say thank-you, but a few owners don't "bag it". It is getting increasingly difficult to find a clean area for children to play and explore, or for anyone to sit on the grass. So, if you are a dog walker, please remember to put some bags in your pocket, and help other dog walkers to keep Fen Drayton Lakes a clean and pleasant place.
