FENSTANTON PARISH COUNCIL - JULY 14th 2011

<u>Police report.</u> The most recent information available is for the month of April which indicated the following reported incidents: 2 incidents of anti social behaviour, 3 other unspecified crimes. The Parish Council urges Parishioners to be vigilant and report any suspicious behaviour to the Police. Telephone 0345 456 456 4, Crimestoppers can be contacted on 0800 55 51 11 or in an emergency 999.

<u>Dogs and the woodland walk</u> Whilst the woodland walk is the ideal area to allow dogs some freedom to go exploring off the lead, owners must be aware of where their dogs are and be conscious of other dog owners and walkers. Members of the Parish Council have been made aware of a number of incidents where dogs have approached other dogs and walkers in an aggressive manner. In all these incidents the owner has not been in the vicinity and is totally unaware of the distress that their dog is causing to other people. With this in mind the request is made that, if you let your dog off the lead, you know where your dog is and that you ensure the dog is under control when you are aware of other walkers. Dog owners are also reminded that the woodland walk is a footpath and are therefore required to clean up if their dog fouls.

Stagecoach service 20. The service 20 is scheduled to commence on 7th August to coincide with the opening of the Guided Busway. The first departure from the Headlands bus stop is 0633 stopping at the Clock tower and terminating at the Park & Ride site. During the day the service operates every thirty minutes. The last departure to St Ives is 17:38 whilst the last departure from St Ives is 19:50. Whilst it is, perhaps, disappointing that the service does not operate later in the evening to allow access to both St Ives and Cambridge, Parishioners are urged to use the service if possible as there is a concern that if Stagecoach deem it is not a profitable route it will be withdrawn. In short 'use it or lose it'. The full timetable is available on the Stagecoach website.

<u>Hampton Close open space.</u> The transfer of the Hampton Close open space from the developer to the Parish Council was completed on 1st July.

<u>Cemetery lighting.</u> The Parish Council is continuing to press the contractor to install the lighting in the Cemetery. The Parish Council has been advised that the delay is being caused by the supplier of the lamp standard.

Next Meeting. The next meeting of Fenstanton Parish Council will be held on Thursday **8th September** 2011 at 7:30pm at Fenstanton and Hilton Primary School, School Lane, Fenstanton. Members of the press and public are welcome.

Whippet Coaches continues Fenstanton Bus Services

Locally-owned Go-Whippet has received many enquiries recently regarding changes to their services following the August opening of the new busway.

Go-Whippet routes 1A and 5 operate between Cambridge, Fenstanton, St Ives, Bar Hill and also Huntingdon – these services will continue to operate at least half hourly starting just after 0700 into Cambridge with the last bus leaving Cambridge for Fenstanton at 1815 daily – the Sunday timetable will also be continued. Whippet Coaches has always endeavoured to offer good value fares.

The company has always seen the busway as an additional route within its network and has **no plans** to reduce the level of service on its other commercial routes. Indeed, if there is a gap in the market and the demand from the local community is sufficient it will look at ways these can be met by them.

HILTON PARISH COUNCIL—JULY MEETING

Hilton Parish Council are working with Cambs County Council regarding proposed new guidelines for HCV routing. As a result members of the Parish Council and volunteers will be seen measuring widths of the road and footpaths along the B1040, counting the number of pedestrians and cyclists at a given date and time, counting the number of houses and the distance they are from the B1040. All the information will be collected by mid September and submitted to the County Council for analysis.

<u>Dog Waste</u> – it isn't just dog waste, it's the dog waste bags – please clean up after your dog and use the bins located around the village, do not leave the bags on the ground to collect later. The Parish Council are looking into getting more bins around the village for this purpose. if you have any suggestions where they are needed please get in touch with the Clerk.

<u>Parking</u> - a reminder that parking is not permitted during the cricket season along Wraggs Row. The Parish Council ask car drivers to park respectfully around the village and not to cause damage to the greens and verges.

Our next meeting is Monday 5th September at 7.30 pm in the Village Hall. Anyone is welcome to attend and parishioners are allowed to speak during the open session only. The Agendas for Parish Council meetings are posted on the 3 notice boards and on the village website 5 days before each meeting.

From the Village hall Chairman Once again the ladies of the Committee have put on another splendid social event, this time in the form of a 'hog roast'. The Hall was packed to capacity as our guests tucked into the tasty 'hog' along with a selection of salads, delicious desserts all washed down with copious amounts of vino – thus creating quite a "cheery" atmosphere!! During the evening we were entertained by a young singer, Marie, from Stageworks. A good time had by one and all. Proceeds will be going into the upkeep of this valuable Village amenity. Thanks must go, not only to the Committee, but to all the "willing volunteers" who turn out, happy to help in the setting up and running of such events.

HILTON ACTION FOR TRAFFIC GROUP (HAT)

Just what can be done to get rid of all those trucks and lorries that steam through Hilton every day? Over many years, folk living along and near Potton Road, have suffered.

Cllr Bates has arranged for Hilton to be one of four Cambs villages trialing a new Heavy Commercial Vehicle Sensitivity Assessment during September. This will involve volunteers from the community measuring a number of parameters (road widths, availability of footpaths, numbers of pedestrians, numbers of homes within 2m. of the road. These have been deemed by Cambs County Council to be indicators of our "sensitivity" to the damaging effects of HCVs on our lives. If on analysis of the results and in comparison with other villages, the County Council decides the village's concerns are justified, then the Parish Council itself will be expected to negotiate with the haulage companies and persuade them to take an alternative route. HAT fully supports the trialing of this new process.

But if you are optimistic of achieving a 24/7 lorry ban, don't hold your breath! The large haulage firms seem bent on continuing to run through Hilton along the Potton Road. And as was the case with the A14 Development Project, our local authorities have shown they are prepared to sacrifice Hilton's environment for the sake of what they describe as the greater good, more building construction and lorry movements. Well, what can you do?

COMPLAIN! to the Parish Council. Demand action from your County Councillor. Write to your MP and to the relevant newspapers. Make a fuss.

NEWS from THE VILLAGE CHURCHES

Since I have become involved in the life of Hilton as priest in charge of the parish church, I have been struck by the very high level of community spirit that seems to exist in the village. (I hope residents of Fenstanton will excuse these remarks – I can't speak from first-hand experience, but from what I hear the same applies there too.) People seem genuinely to value living in the village and to enjoy each other's company, and work hard to make things happen that bring people together and add to the quality of life for all. I thought Feast Week – and the Sports Day especially – was just great!

I am writing these few words the week after the appalling riots that took place in cities across England. By the time you read this in September, the riots may not be making headlines daily, but they will certainly not become old news as easily as some events. We have all been shaken by what happened and disturbed by what it reveals about the state of our society, and I don't think anyone in this land can say that it doesn't concern him or her.

I know that living in such attractive and flourishing communities as Fenstanton and Hilton does not guarantee that life is a bed of roses – it seldom is, anywhere – but the contrast with the scenes we have witnessed in our cities could hardly be greater. A human-scale environment and a shared sense of belonging to a worthwhile community seem to be some of the ingredients that make for peace and the development of mutual care. These are things we can all recognise as valuable, whatever our faith, but they also are at the heart of Christian living. At its root, the Christian message is not a list of do's and don'ts, but the story of how all are included, welcomed, embraced - even those who reject this embrace - in the source of life and love which is God. Our challenge is to bring this story alive now, where we live, and to provide an alternative to despair and violence.

Trading Standards - a spotlight on energy



We all want to do our bit to save energy around the home - to be 'green' and to save money. However, at

Cambridgeshire County Council's Trading Standards Service we have seen an increase in queries from residents about 'cold callers' selling energy saving schemes, particularly loft insulation and solar energy, so below we offer some advice to help you.

Solar Energy

Before you start it's worth taking a look at the information provided by the Energy Saving Trust on www.energysavingtrust.org.uk or speaking to an advisor on 0800 512012.

For supplier/installer information, the Microgeneration Certification Scheme can provide a list of members online or by calling 0207 0901082. Membership is not compulsory, but you will need to use a member if you plan to use the Feed-in Tariff scheme (a government-backed initiative paying you for the electricity you generate).

Obtain three quotes to ensure the price and projected savings are competitive and realistic. Arrange a technical survey, rather than a sales visit, so the quote is accurate, and ensure all quotes are in writing, detailing what's included. Once you've chosen your installer read the contract carefully and ensure their claims about savings and maintenance costs are included before signing so that you have evidence of what you were told.

Remember! If you sign an agreement at home for solar energy, you should be given 7 days to cancel. If you need advice on this, ring Consumer Direct on 0845 4040506.

Loft and cavity insulation

When it comes to insulation, the Energy Saving Trust can provide information on grants and offers that can help you cover the cost of it. They can also provide a list of installers. It is advisable to use a member of the National Insulation Association, the Cavity Insulation Guarantee Agency or the British Board of Agreement, ideally who has signed up to a professional code of practice and provides a 25 year guarantee.

Reducing your energy bills

Start by checking with your current gas and electricity supplier that you are on their best rate. Then compare the prices of other suppliers in case you can get it cheaper – switching supplier could save you around £237 a year if you haven't changed before. You can compare prices on Consumer Focus's weekly pricing factsheets at www.consumerfocus.org.uk or by contacting Consumer Direct on 0845 4040506 for a paper copy. Also, most suppliers offer cheaper tariffs for 'vulnerable' customers, so it is worth enquiring about these 'social tariffs' if you are over 60, are on means tested benefits or are on low income. In addition, your District Council could offer you advice on how to reduce the amount of energy you use in your home by offering a home visit, or you can get tips by calling the Energy Saving Trust.

Support if you are struggling to pay your energy bills

If you are struggling to keep on top of energy bills, seek help from your local Citizens Advice Bureau, either in person or on the phone on 08444 111 444.

Finally, if you feel that you have been mis-sold any product or service – energy or otherwise - or have any other kind of consumer issue, contact our partner Consumer Direct for advice.

Staying independent, safe and well in Cambridgeshire

Information about adult social care in Cambridgeshire is now available on a new, easy-to-navigate website, developed by the County Council, called 'Your Life, Your Choice'.

The aim is to ensure that everyone in Cambridgeshire who is: looking for information about adult social care; already receiving support; or caring for a friend or family member; has access to information at a time and in a format that suits them. In addition to the website a set of Your Life, Your Choice branded leaflets, providing information about adult social care in the county, will be available from libraries. Access to the Your Life, Your Choice website is also available in libraries together with help on hand for anyone requiring assistance with sourcing information.

For more information, look out for the Your Life, Your Choice logo in libraries and CAB Advice Hubs or access information and advice directly at www.yourlifeyourchoice.org.uk

Got better things to spend your money on than electricity bills?

Borrow an energy meter from any Cambridgeshire library free of charge and find out how you could cut your electricity bills by as much as 15%. The meters are easy and safe to use and show how much electricity is being used in your home at any one time. Using a meter can help you see just how much energy is used, for example, by lights in empty rooms, appliances on stand-by or boiling a full kettle.

Armed with this information, studies show that households can reduce their bills by 5 - 15% by making small changes to use less electricity. Ask to borrow a meter at your local library today and start planning what to do with your savings!

<u>Green Tip:</u> We all have an impact on the environment through our use of resources and burning fossil fuels for everyday activities such as driving cars and heating our homes. 

FENSTANTON WI

We always associate 'The Abolition of Slavery' with William Wilberforce but Mr Brian Payne maintains that Thomas Clarkson was the 'gateway' to getting rid of this evil, sordid trade.

Thomas Clarkson was born in Wisbech in 1760, the son of the Headmaster of the Grammar School, Although he obtained a degree in Mathematics at St. John's College, Cambridge he decided he wanted to be a priest and was eventually ordained as a deacon. He was encouraged to enter a competition to write an essay in Latin entitled 'Is it right to make men slaves against their will?' He won the prize and because the essay had been read and adjudicated in London he was asked to give a talk there. On the way he stopped for a rest at Ware and God called him to give his life to the cause of abolition of slavery. A memorial marks the spot to this day. In London he received a lot of information and evidence from Quakers who couldn't put a motion in Parliament because they weren't members of the Church of England. He wrote a booklet in 1786 on 'The slavery and Commerce of the Human Species' which proved to be a turning point. John Wesley, Josiah Wedgewood and John Cartwright supported Clarkson and a Society for the Abolition of the Slave Trade was formed. William Wilberforce, the MP for Hull raised it in Parliament but it was kicked out. Clarkson then travelled round the country visiting all the major ports such as Bristol Liverpool interviewing Clarkson's brother John was Captain of a ship which carried slaves from West Africa to America. He was able to give Thomas necklaces, tools and woven cloth made by men and women in West Africa. Thomas put these in a chest and with other documents he was able to ask Wilberforce to raise it in Parliament again. It was not passed in the House of Commons but it went to the House of Lords who passed the Act in 1807. It abolished the slave trade in England and English ships could no longer carry slaves. It was another 30 years before it was abolished internationally.

Mr Payne invited us to Wisbech to see the statue of Thomas Clarkson which was erected in 1881 and to the museum that contains Clarkson's chest as well as many other exhibits such as chains and manacles.

Val Rodgers gave the vote of thanks.

Our August meeting was a hands-on experience. Beryl Brooks came with a wonderful display of knitted bead jewellery. She uses copper wire coated with silver of different gauges. The pattern has to be worked out first on a board or on a piece of felt. The beads are then threaded on to a wire and knitted in the usual way incorporating one or two beads with each stitch depending on the size of the beads. Amidst much fun and laughter we all had a go with varying degrees of success.

Afterwards as well as buying a necklace or bracelet some of us were brave enough to buy a kit complete with wire, beads and instructions. Shall we see some wonderful creations at our next meeting? Maybe or maybe not!


