One name who passed through Farm Hall was the well known MP, Airey Neave who was later murdered at the Houses of Parliament and it is believed others were trained as part of the true operation that became the film 'The Heroes of Telemark'. Many, many more must not be forgotten for their heroism

Much later, almost at the end of the war, a number of German nuclear scientists were held captive at Farm Hall, not knowing that wherever they were, outside or indoors, their every conversation was being over heard. We were fortunate to hear so much from Roger about this very secret place.

You will be pleased to know that Farm Hall is now a private residence located on West Street.

During the summer weeks some of us have enjoyed a day in Bury St Edmonds and a morning visit to Jordan's Mill near Sandy. Much more recently we hosted a visit by members of Eltisley and Caxton WI who were keen to see round our beautiful village so of course we rewarded them with cream teas in the village hall and its garden.

Finally, our most recent enjoyment has been our annual Summer Buffet with our usual 'cornucopia' of delicious, tasty food brought by ourselves, plus plenty to drink from Adam's Ale to our favourite wines.

Autumn looms, we have an interesting programme sourced by our two social secretaries so our morale will hopefully continue well into 2023.

Defibrillator unit update – some of you may have noticed that there is progress with the installation of the AED, using the funds raised by many in the village and beyond. We don't have a date yet for an official 'something', as we are waiting to get a plaque made and installed and proper signage. In the meantime, the AED is operational for emergency

use - dial 999 and you should receive instructions. There are currently two AED's in Fenstanton – outside Ash's shop and at the Church Centre, wall opposite the school. Please be aware that some apps locate the AED at Hall Green Lane and not the Church Centre, School Lane.

Fenstanton Traditions and Sayings:

I hope that you are enjoying this lovely warm summer as much as I am. I am spending this latest heatwave sitting in my garden, in the shade, with a good book. This does mean of course, that I have not had time to research and write my usual history essay. So, for this month I will fill in with some extracts from my latest book of ghost stories, traditions and sayings. Hopefully and depending on the weather, I will be able to return to village history next month.

Rushes for the Floor:

The earliest church floors were earth covered in rushes, long before the era of paved or wooden flooring. It was deemed an act of politeness, but also cleanliness and warmth, to have rushes on the new wooden, tiled or paved floor. The custom prevailed in the Fenstanton parish church up to the year 1890.

Mr William Saint, a wheelwright, of the High Street, who was about 80 years old in 1922, remembered when he would cut the rushes for the church on Feast Sunday. He was paid for the extra work and used to go and collect the rushes (the fine meadow rushes not the thick river rushes) from almost any place, often from the fields in front of Hall Green House.

Rush Bearing Sunday:

A newspaper report in 1940 states that, "The custom prevailed in the church of Fenstanton up to the year 1890. The tradition of this was that long ago a certain lady who was much annoyed by the clatter of the 'rustics' hobnail boots upon the floor tiles, determined that upon one day in the year at any rate, the church should be quiet and so left in her will a sum of money to be spent on strewing the church floor with rushes on Feast Sunday. But the money ran out in the course of time and the church wardens abandoned the custom".

Fortunate and Unfortunate Days to get Married:

Monday For good health Tuesday For wealth

Wednesday The best day of all

Thursday For women
Friday For men
Saturday No luck at all

Sunday You will repeat this day before the year is out!

The Old Vicarage:

The very old vicarage (built in 1437) was demolished when the new vicarage was built in the 18th century. This new building is on the corner of Church Street and Talls Lane (now known as Fen Manor). After the old vicarage was demolished the site was used by small holders and was called the Small Holders Yard. Sometime in its past it contained a large Mulberry tree which is believed provided the fruit for desert when Queen Elizabeth I lunched in the village. This tree was cut down and Mr Langford erected a farm building. The site was cleared in the 20th century and the current vicarage was built there.

The Wooden Pig at Pig Farm:

There was a wooden pig that sat on the roof of Pig House Farm, now The Gables. It is said that when the village clock struck one, the pig came down for his dinner. It is believed that before Pig House farm was built an earlier Saxon moated farmhouse was on the site. It is also believed possible that the wooden pig was from that Saxon farm house. Latest news from Fenstanton Parish Council

Successful Local Highways Initiatives (LHI)

London Road, St Ives—Speed Reduction

Your Parish Council has been notified by Cambridge County Council that the LHI bid jointly submitted by Fenstanton and Hemingford Grey Parish Council's for speed limit changes on London Road has been Successful.

There are a number of steps before implementation which is hoped to be between March and May 2023. Your Parish Council has been advised of the key project risks and these are:- objections to the speed limit order from the police and/or public, insufficient budget due to current high Inflation and speed data not supporting the speed limit reductions.

Your Parish Council will keep you update on the progress,

20 mph—Speed Reduction for Fenstanton Village

Your Parish Council has been notified by Cambridge County Council that the privately funded LHI bid submitted for 20mph speed reduction for the Village has been successful. There are still a number of steps to be taken, this includes a formal consultation which is estimated to be completed by 31.10.2022. Implementation is expected to be early 2023. The Fen is not included in the plan as it is a private road and Hampton Close is not included in the plan as the road has not yet been adopted.

Key project risks – objections from residents and other stakeholders, insufficient budget due to current high inflation and construction risks such as clashes with existing statutory services


Footpaths



Did you know that your parish council maintains more than ten kilometres of countryside footpaths?

From the popular footpath 13, which meanders its way, with the River Great Ouse for over 2.5 kilometres, to the short stroll, that is the 230 metre right of way, through Jones marina.

Many of our paths have spectacular views and none more so than, the recently reinstated, footpath 15 with its views over Moore Lake (see picture). The path runs parallel to the guided busway, from Fen Lane to Elney lake in Fen Drayton.

Hilton Produce Show 2022..... Goes Wild





Report from the Meeting of the Council dated Monday 4th July
A14 Legacy Project for works to improve the bank of the Ware



The concrete retaining wall installed to reinforce the bank of the Ware caused an issue with surface water flooding as it prevented water from draining from the road surface into the Ware. National Highways have since installed two drainage pipes at the lowest points of the road which they have advised will prevent this issue from recurring.



Unfortunately, there has not been sufficient rainfall to confirm this since the drainage pipes were installed, so Hilton Parish Council has resolved not to close this project until this confirmation is received and will review this prior to the completion of the A14 project which is due in December.

East-West Rail

Cllr Peter Balicki attended an online meeting regarding this project and reported that the work is in its pre-planning inspectorate stage, which can last 2-4 years, and that they are about halfway through. They have not decided upon the final route into Cambridge and whether it will be north or south of Cambourne. If it is north of Cambourne then there may be a large development north of the A428, but this is yet to be decided. East-West Rail are hosting community events to consult with local communities and further information can be found on their website - https://communityhub.eastwestrail.co.uk/community-events

Place Strategy Workshops

Hilton Parish Council has been invited to consult on the Huntingdonshire District Council Place Strategy and HPC has authorised the Clerk to attend the three workshops for this project.

Directional Shield for Streetlight

A parishioner has requested that a directional shield be fitted to streetlight PC2AF, which is in the alleyway between Tithe Close and Potton Road, to prevent the light from spilling into his house and garden. The Parish Council agreed to install such a shield at the expense of the homeowner.

Carbon Literacy Training

Hilton Parish Council has been offered free Carbon Literacy Training and resolved that Cllr Peter Balicki will attend this training on Monday 25th July.

Jubilee Beacon Event

This event made a profit of £225.18, and the Councillors thanked everyone who was involved in making this event such a success.

Flood Resilience Day

The visit from the Floodmobile on Saturday 23rd July was a success and well-attended with over 60 parishioners in attendance.



Speedwatch

Hilton Speedwatch is looking for volunteers to join their group. The Community Speedwatch scheme trains volunteers from members of the community to get actively involved in monitoring the speed of vehicles travelling through their neighbourhood. It is used in areas where speeding has been identified as a priority at quarterly neighbourhood panel meetings.

Speedwatch are now also able to monitor HGVs that are breaching the weight limit and can be more effective with a larger team.



Community Speedwatch is operated by Cambridgeshire Constabulary in partnership with your local council and other agencies. The scheme itself is run by the Police and the community volunteers supported by the County coordinator.
